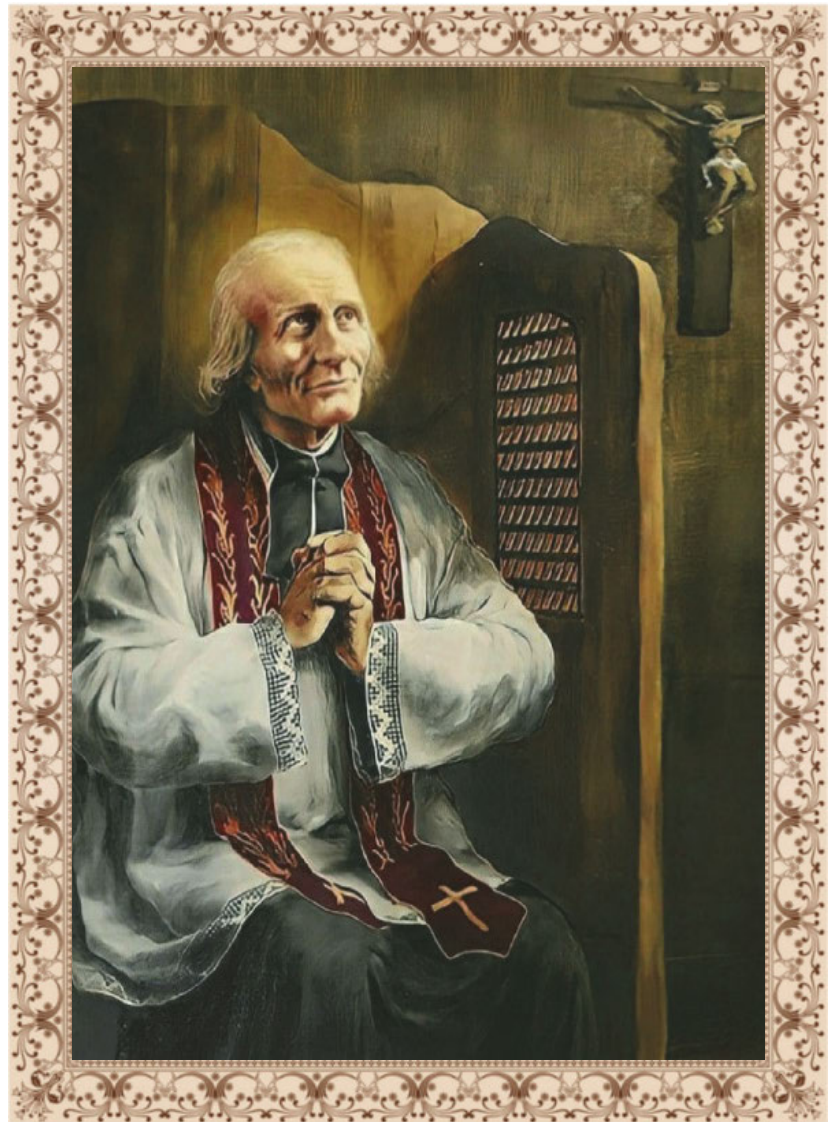

# From Your Pastor

## ***Beloved in the Lord Jesus,***

*Today is the Feast of St. John Vianney. It is a special year in which our patronal feast lands on a Sunday. It is also the day of our procession and celebration afterward in the gym. As we conclude our novena today, let's reflect some more on the life of St. John Vianney.*

*We have talked about how, after arriving at the little town of Ars, France, he had set about guiding the people to find God again in their lives, and with great success. After 6 years, he took a small inheritance his father had left him, and bought a house in the town, to turn it into a school for girls. He sent two good Christian women, Catherine Lassagne and Benoit Lardet to be trained by the Sisters of St. Joseph. To these he added Jeanne-Marie Chanay, a girl who had a rough past, but who could help with the work of making the place into a school. The 3 of them took charge of teaching and guiding 15 little girls. Soon, girls were sent to them from other places, and so they made dormitories in the upstairs; soon, everything had to be expanded. The school focuses especially on poor children or orphans. Ages ranged from 8 to 20, at times there were up to 60 girls there. One writer says, the place was the most charming and peaceful spot in all the district; one could breathe in a child-like atmosphere that drew you to it.*

*In order to keep his school going – clothing, feeding, and teaching these children - John Vianney relied on donations. He asked and begged many people, even going to other cities. Sometimes it was very difficult to make ends meet. There never were enough funds to run the place, but one day, the situation was desperate. The lady who ran the kitchen came to the priest in a worried and frantic state, telling him that there was no more food at all for the children. St. John prayed to one of his favorite saints, St. Francis Regis. He went to the attic and put a his relic there under a few grains of wheat, and then asked all the parishioners to pray. With great peace, he said: 'Go to the attic and get together what grains you can find there.' Now the lady knew that the attic was completely empty of grain, but she obeyed the Saint and went. When she tried to open the door she had to push with all her strength and to her surprise, when the door opened and the grain came pouring out, cascading down the stairs. Years later, a man who was visiting, having heard about it, insisted on seeing that attic. Looking inside he said: 'Now isn't it true that the wheat came all the way up to here?' 'No, said St. John, it was higher.'*

## ***Amados en el Señor Jesús,***

*Hoy es la festividad de San Juan Vianney. Es un año especial en el que nuestra fiesta patronal cae en domingo. También es el día de nuestra procesión y celebración posterior en el gimnasio. Al concluir nuestra novena de hoy, reflexionemos un poco más sobre la vida de San Juan Vianney.*

*Hemos hablado de cómo, después de llegar al pueblito de Ars, Francia, se dedicó a guiar a la gente para que volviera a encontrar a Dios en sus vidas, y con gran éxito. Después de 6 años, tomó una pequeña herencia que le había dejado su padre y compró una casa en el pueblo para convertirla en una escuela para niñas. Envio a dos buenas mujeres cristianas, Catherine Lassagne y Benoit Lardet, para que fueran formadas por las Hermanas de San José. A ellos añadió a Jeanne-Marie Chanay, una joven que había tenido un pasado duro, pero que podía ayudar con el trabajo de convertir el lugar en una escuela. Las tres se encargaron de enseñar y guiar a 15 niñas. Pronto les enviaron niñas de otros lugares, por lo que hicieron dormitorios en el piso de arriba; pronto, todo tuvo que ser ampliado. La escuela se centra especialmente en niños pobres o huérfanos. Las edades oscilaban entre los 8 y los 20 años, a veces había hasta 60 niñas allí. Un escritor dice que el lugar era el lugar más encantador y tranquilo de todo el distrito; Se respiraba una atmósfera infantil que te atraía.*

*Para poder mantener su escuela, vestir, alimentar y educar a estos niños, Juan Vianney dependía de donaciones. Pidió y suplicó a mucha gente, incluso yendo a otras ciudades. A veces era muy difícil llegar a fin de mes. Nunca había fondos suficientes para mantener el lugar, pero un día, la situación era desesperada. La señora que dirigía la cocina fue al sacerdote en un estado preocupado y frenético, diciéndole que ya no había más comida para los niños. San Juan rezó a uno de sus santos favoritos, San Francisco Regis. Fue al ático y puso su reliquia allí bajo unos granos de trigo, y luego pidió a todos los feligreses que rezaran. Con gran paz, dijo: "Vayan al ático y reúnan todos los granos que puedan encontrar allí". Ahora la señora sabía que el ático estaba completamente vacío de grano, pero obedeció al Santo y fue. Cuando intentó abrir la puerta tuvo que empujar con todas sus fuerzas y para su sorpresa, cuando la puerta se abrió, el grano salió a borbotones, cayendo en cascada por las escaleras. Años después, un hombre que estaba de visita, al oír hablar de ello, insistió en ver ese ático. Al mirar dentro, dijo: "¿No es cierto que el trigo llegó hasta aquí?". "No, dijo San Juan, estaba más arriba".*

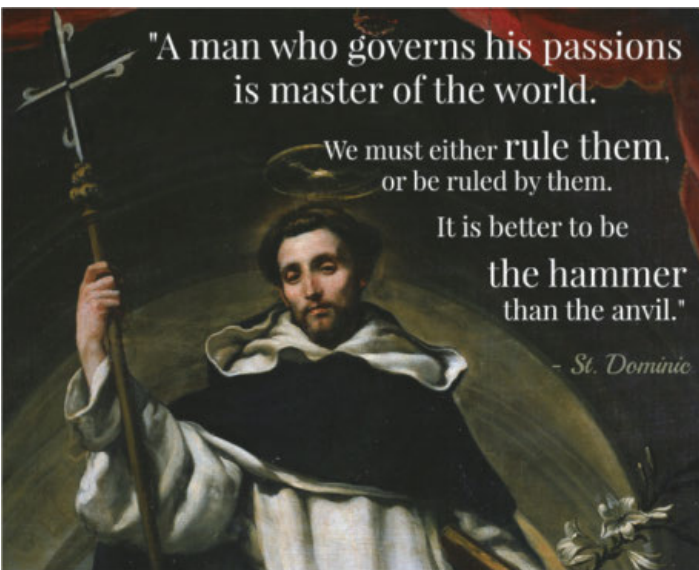

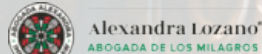
