St. Maurus and St. Joseph Parish Councils Meeting Minutes
Thursday, August 21, 2025, 7 PM St. Maurus Biehle Parish Center

- 1) Father Benz opened the meeting with prayer.
- 2) In Attendance: Father Benz, St. Maurus; Gerry Keene, Kathy Cowan, Casey Schilling, Isaac Baer. St. Joseph; Hunter Winschel, Neal Bachmann, Tammy Hotop. Excused; Stan Balsman 3) June's Minutes were reviewed and approved by Neal and seconded by Kathy. 4) Pastor's Report
 - a. Hunter Winschel was welcomed as the newest member to the St. Joseph Parish Council. He was the only nominee who accepted so we did not need an election. Father listed what he felt a Parish Council member's responsibilities were: 1) Meet once a month; 2) Once a member is assigned to one of the 3 ministries, they are to report back to council with updates; 3) Pray for the parish; 4) Reflect on the needs of Worship, Parish Ministry & Social Outreach. The council agreed with these responsibilities.
 - b. 2025 Fruits of the Harvest Report for the Southern Vicariate:
 - i. Fr. Lydon shares with us the ways that the Vicariate team has worked with the parishes in our two deaneries to 1) Build Relationships; 2) Provide Support; 3) Address Needs 4) Form Disciples; and 5) how we are looking ahead to the coming year. This provides a good format for us to consider how we also are serving our Lord, our parish, and the people of our community. All we do is for the sake of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
 - ii. Mission Statement: Rooted in Christ, we plant and nourish the Seeds of Faith in Word and Deed.
 - c. Our Parish Mission Statement: Newly returned to the cover of our bulletins after a few years of absence:
 - i. "We—the parish communities of St. Joseph Apple Creek and St. Maurus Biehle - are called by baptism to continue Christ's mission through education, example, and service. We are nourished by the Word, Worship, and Sacraments. We dedicate ourselves to minister through the sharing of time, talent, and treasure."
 - ii. Remember it and re-evaluate our fulfillment of it and our need to reshape it.
 - d. Life Teen is thrilled to present their newest camp: Life Teen Camp Cana! Located near Ste. Genevieve, this stunning property – the former Chaumette vineyard and winery – will become a sacred space for teenagers from across the Midwest and beyond to experience a life-changing encounter with Christ. It may also be available for other parish groups and something to consider in the future for our own groups.
 - i. It is also how I envision our own parish grounds to be of use.
 - ii. We do have some Freshmen from St. Vincent DePaul using our grounds in early September for a day of recollection.
- 3) Worship Ministry:
 - a. OCIA is set for the 2025-2026 year. It will be held at St. Maurus Sunday's after 9:30 AM Mass beginning the 1st Sunday in September and will run through April. Father may extend past April. OCIA helps in Preparing for the Easter Vigil Sacraments of Initiation. It is a very hopeful year as we could very well have 7 children (in conjunction with PSR catechesis) receiving the sacraments of initiation along with 3 young adults. This shows that St. Maurus is a vibrant parish community. Pray for these catechumens and candidates that they persevere in the good work God has begun in them.
 - b. St. Joseph 200th Anniversary Committee continues to work with Cindy Buchheit, Interior Designer with UNIQUE AMBIANCE who has agreed to help us put together a comprehensive plan of repair and beautification. The committee met this week to discuss revisions. We're excited to share it with everyone but we want to get new bids to ensure that it fits within the scope of our finances before we let you know the full scope. Neal was asked to mention to not overcomplicate the design. Choose a few suggestions and keep the design simple.
 - c. St. John the Baptist Vigil Bonfire on Monday evening, June 23rd at St. Joseph had a small group but enjoyed the evening. Special thanks to Kathy Mangels and Dave Meyer. Since it was very hot, we kept the scale down: right outside the hall basement doors so that we could roast hot dogs and marshmallows at the small bonfire and have recourse to the air-conditioned hall as needed. Adults talked outside while the chimney swifts circled overhead. Children kicked a soccer ball around for a while. This will be a good model for next year's celebration.
- 4) Parish Ministry:
 - a. St. Joseph Maintenance Meeting discussed:
 - i. Concrete Parking Lot: Extend from hamburger stand to end of the sidewalk, about 74 Yards.
 - ii. Steps up to the Church are chipped & need repair. The ramp is fine.
 - iii. It would be beneficial to add a canopy over the entrance steps, similar to St. Maurus.
 - iv. The Parish Hall Escape Door was rotten and has been replaced.
 - v. The hamburger stand has been painted by Bert Winschel and family.
 - b. St. Maurus Maintenance Needs.
 - i. AC units need to be replaced. The kitchen is estimated to cost \$10,000. The 2 smaller units in the PSR rooms are estimated at \$7000/ea but do not need to both be replaced at the same time.
 - ii. Corpus Cristi altar building needs repaired, in particular the door.
 - iii. Jeff Welker is looking into an exhaust system for the picnic garage concession stand.
 - iv. Bids are out for the picnic garage roof replace/repair. Casey mentioned Buchheit carries metal roofing if interested.

- c. Update from Gerry on CTM.
 - i. Men's cross training has a 9 week program beginning Sept 9th. They meet each Tuesday for 1 hour through Nov. at the St. Mary's of Barron's Gift Shop at 6:30pm. Another 9 week program will begin around Lent.
 - ii. They learn about the faith through presentations from ordained clergy with discussion.
 - iii. Gerry said if the ladies were interested in a similar program, he would help to get it started. The women would need a core team of 4 members and he could share with them the format for the meetings.
- d. Ladies of St. Joseph:
 - i. Donating 2 Quilts for BINGO at the picnic
 - ii. They are finishing cleaning the hall for the picnic.
 - iii. Planning on making Apple Butter again in the Fall.
- e. PSR
 - i. Ashley Richardet, PSR Coordinator will be training Megan Best this coming year to take over as Coordinator for the 2026-27 year.
 - ii. Class will begin Wed, Sept 3rd in church with the rosary, followed by an Open House in the classrooms. Mass will be held the following Wed, Sept 10th at 6:30 pm at St. Maurus.
 - iii. In the future, Megan would like to have a meal once a month with PSR families, with a mandatory 1 parent to attend.
- f. Women's Bible Study
 - i. Women's Bible Study (Women of Joy) will be led by Bonnie Welker and begins on Monday, Sept 8th following the 5:30pm Mass at St. Joseph. There are about 12 women currently interested.
 - ii. Focus will be a study of the Blessed Virgin Mary, including several Marian Apparitions.
 - iii. Silent time for prayer will be a part of the program as we grow in faith together with the Church Militant, Suffering and Triumphant.
 - iv. To join the study group, sign up with Sheryl in the office.
- g. Men's Bible Study
 - i. Tim Tarrillion leads the Men's Bible Study. He is looking at programs through Formed with a focus on Mary. He will have his plans put together by the weekend and text the current members to be sure Thursday is a good night to meet. There are currently 10 interested.
- h. Wednesday Evening Adult Formation Program at St. Maurus is an ongoing program in learning more about the faith. The program begins Sept, 3rd with a meal at 6pm in the hall with a video and discussion. More info in the bulletin
- i. Youth Ministry and Family Involvement Survey.
 - i. Mia Pohlman resigned as Youth Minister.
 - ii. Judy Brown drafted a survey to hand out to all families. Father will send the council a draft for approval and will coordinate this with his Homily.
- j. St. Ann's Sodality. Donna Seabaugh provided the following updates:
 - i. Cookbooks are in the printing stage.
 - ii. Asking for volunteers for the upcoming meals for mission and OCIA.
 - iii. Donating \$500 for the fall festival event.
 - iv. Providing a quilt for both breakfasts but will need to reimburse ladies \$250 each since they do not have enough quilters to make the quilts and had to purchase several for the events.
 - v. Discussed improving the garden area by the rectory. Mary Laurentius organized a watering crew for the flowers during dry weather.
 - vi. Discussed improving the Christmas tour by adding refreshments in the hall side room and providing a small memento from St. Maurus.
 - vii. All are pleased with hiring Jackie Behrle as the church cleaner for both parishes.
 - viii. The outreach group has not visited anyone since the last meeting.
 - ix. There are 2 ladies cleaning corporals and purificators.
- 5) Social Outreach Ministry:
 - a. Respect Life Apostolate parish liaison is Ruth Brown
 - b. Vocations Promotion liaison is Barb Miller
 - c. Hospitality Audit Survey from the Southern Vicariate Evangelization Committee. To be reviewed in Sept.
- 6) Any other reports?
 - a. St. Maurus ball field to be turned into additional parking. Isaac has drawn up plans to include 67 parking spots.
 - b. Knights of Columbus has donated \$750 to each parish for utilities.
 - c. St. Maurus - Ozark gas will replace the relief valve in order to prevent future gas leaks.
 - d. AED update: St. Joseph was selected as a recipient of an AED device and invited to receive it on Tues, Oct 7th at the Hirsch Community Room at the Cape Public Library. Stan plans to attend the award luncheon. Casey has not heard back regarding the St. Maurus AED request.
 - e. Father will add the request back into the bulletin in the search for Saturday evening musician.
