AUGUST DEVOTION: IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

Why do we honor Mary's Immaculate Heart?

This devotion honors Mary's interior life, how she kept close and pondered the events of Jesus' birth--and no doubt all that happened in his growing up years. Her heart is often depicted with a flame or pierced by a sword as well as roses and sometimes thorns, representing her virtues and sorrows.

St. John Eudes was the first to honor the Blessed Mother's Immaculate Heart with a special Mass in 1648, but it was another 200 years before the Church adopted the devotion as an official practice.

By drawing close to Mary, we can learn from her how to trust even when things feel hopeless. We also learn to trust Jesus, her Son and the Son of God. You can honor Mary's Immaculate Heart by joining us for Rosary 30 minutes before Sunday Mass.

SACRED HEART CATHOLIC FAITHFUL SHEPHERDS 2026-2027

As the school counselor, I don't contribute as much to our students' academic excellence but am very excited that I work in a school where I have the privilege of helping them recognize and embrace the unique goodness God has placed within them.

As the school year begins, I've found myself reflecting on an important question: How do we help our children—or anyone, for that matter—embrace their own saintliness? How do we reflect their innate goodness back to them and encourage them to live lives that reflect it?

First, we must believe that every person is created in the image and likeness of God and is called to holiness. Second, we must remember that goodness is always present within us. Our brains are naturally wired to notice problems and threats in order to keep us safe, but poor choices, moments of weakness, or struggles with anxiety, depression, or anger do not define who we are. These are experiences and emotions—not our identity. Our children need trusted adults to remind them of the goodness that is always within them, especially during times of behavioral or emotional struggle.

Finally, we must intentionally reflect that goodness back to our children. A word of encouragement, a sincere compliment, a thumbs-up, or a high five can remind a child that they are seen, valued, and capable of choosing what is good—something no screen or social media algorithm can ever replace. Today's students are growing up in a world filled with constant comparison, unrealistic expectations, and endless digital distractions that compete for their attention and often shape how they see themselves. They need adults who consistently remind them that their worth comes not from likes, achievements, or appearances, but from being beloved children of God.

Having joined the Catholic Church this past year, I experienced this kind of encouragement firsthand. Throughout OCIA, I received dozens of cards, texts, prayers, and words of support that continually invited me to lean into the person God was calling me to become. Others reflected the goodness they saw in me and encouraged me to live it out in a way I had never experienced before. Slowly, I began to see myself differently because I was learning to recognize the person God had created me to be, and to lean into that in my work and personal life.

My prayer for this school year is that every child at Sacred Heart experiences that same kind of encouragement. May they come to know that they are deeply loved by God, created with purpose, and capable of becoming saints.

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

One of the most familiar sounds during the celebration of the Mass is the ringing of the sanctuary bells. In many Catholic churches, the bells are rung during the epiclesis, when the priest extends his hands over the bread and wine and asks the Father to send the Holy Spirit upon the gifts, and again during the elevations of the Sacred Host and the Precious Blood. While the ringing of bells is not required by the Church, it is a long-standing custom that serves an important spiritual purpose.

The use of bells in the liturgy developed during the Middle Ages. In large churches and cathedrals, many members of the congregation could not easily see or hear everything taking place at the altar. The ringing of a bell became an audible signal that something especially sacred was occurring. It invited everyone present to focus their minds and hearts on the mystery unfolding before them.

At the epiclesis, the priest asks God the Father to send the Holy Spirit upon the bread and wine so that they may become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. The ringing of the bells at this moment emphasizes that the Church is entering the very heart of the Eucharistic Prayer. Just as bells have traditionally called people to prayer or announced joyful events, the sanctuary bells call the faithful to attentive prayer as the Holy Spirit is invoked upon the gifts. The bells also remind us that the Eucharist is the work of the Holy Trinity. The Father receives the Church's prayer, the Holy Spirit sanctifies the gifts, and the Son becomes truly present. Their sound invites the congregation to recognize that a divine mystery is taking place; one that surpasses human understanding and can only be received in faith.

Beyond their practical purpose, the bells engage another of our senses in worship. Catholic liturgy speaks not only through words but also through signs, gestures, music, incense, sacred art, and sound. The clear ringing of the bells draws our attention away from distractions and back to Christ's saving action upon the altar.

For many Catholics, hearing the bells has become a cherished reminder to make a simple prayer of adoration. Some silently pray, "My Lord and my God," echoing the words of Thomas the Apostle, while others simply bow their heads in reverence. In this way, the ringing of the bells is much more than a tradition. It is a sacred invitation to pause, adore, and recognize that heaven is touching earth as the Holy Spirit prepares the gifts to become the Body and Blood of Christ.

May the Lord bless you and keep you! May the Lord let His face shine upon you and be gracious to you! May the Lord look upon you kindly and give you peace! – Fr. Adam

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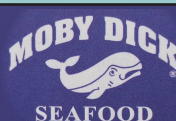


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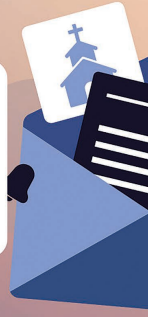
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
