

Father Carl's Corner

In the past few weeks, life situations have reminded me what my, our, spiritual anchor is as we stand before the great mysteries of life and death. In the same week, I celebrated Mass for a lifelong parishioner who turned 90 years young. A few days later, I attended the funeral of a young, devoted parishioner who ushered at one of my parish sites who was only 21 and died unexpectedly.

In the meantime, I joined many volunteers from our migrant ministry praying for a young 25-year-old migrant who was severely injured in a car accident and declared brain dead. He was being kept alive on machines until his mother could be contacted, and she was able to see him on Face Time before the machines were turned off.



These moments of joy, struggle, and sorrow remind us that life is both fragile and sacred. They invite us to ask "where do we find our spiritual anchor when life's storms come."

Our anchor is found in Christ, who promises to be with us in every season of life – whether we are celebrating a long journey of faith or walking through the valley of grief. As Saint Paul writes, "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure" (Hebrews 6:19). This hope is not wishful thinking but the deep trust that God is present, even when we do not understand. It is the belief that love is stronger than death, that mercy is greater than pain and that our lives, however short or long, are held in the hands of a faithful God.

In times of joy our anchor draws us to gratitude; in times of loss, it holds us steady as we face the unknown. I see this anchor lived out in the quiet, steady faith of our parishioners, in the compassionate service of our volunteers, and in the resilience of those who suffer but still believe in God's goodness.

Each of us has those challenging moments where we stand before the joys and sorrows of life and the many mysteries of life and death. Whether it is showing up for Mass, being present to each other in community, keeping a daily time for prayer, spending time reaching out to another to share a joy or to help carry a sorrow, these are all ways we can continue to hold fast to Christ, who is our ANCHOR in every season, and to also be anchors for one another through prayer, presence, and love.

Saint Teresa of Avila, a favorite saint of mine, who deeply understood the mysteries of life's trials and the power of faith, wrote: "Let nothing disturb you, let nothing frighten you, all things are passing away: God never changes. Patience obtains all things. Whoever has God lacks for nothing." These words can help to ground us when life feels overwhelming.

Most of all, remember when we come to Mass and share in the Eucharist, that despite all the changes in life and the world around us, the Eucharist, Mass, never changes. God is always with us! We are given Jesus! Keep this in your heart and prayers this week: When life feels uncertain, let your soul drop anchor in Christ – and you will not drift.

Happy beginning of August! Be safe and well. With you a Christian. For you a priest.

We have three adult choirs and one children's choir in the parish. The Ascension Schola rehearses two Tuesdays each month and sings at the 8 am Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month. Our first rehearsal is Tuesday, September 9, 7:00-8:30pm. New members in all voice parts are welcome!

The Ascension Choir rehearses three—four Wednesday evenings each month. We sing at the 10:30am Mass on all but the first Sunday of each month. Our first rehearsal is Wednesday, September 10, from 7:00-8:45pm. New members in all voice parts are welcome!

The St. Edmund Choir rehearses three Wednesday evenings in Murphy Hall at St. Edmund and sings at the Saturday 5:00pm Mass three times each month. Our first rehearsal is Wednesday, September 10, from 7:00-8:30pm. New members in all voice parts are welcome!

The Choristers (our parish choir for children and youth) are for young people in grades 3-8. Choristers rehearse once each week on Tuesdays or Wednesdays depending on grade level. Young people in grades 6-8 will practice on Tuesdays from 3:05-4:00pm. Young people in grades 3-5 will practice on Wednesdays 3:05-4:00pm. Our first practices of the year are Tuesday, Sept. 9, (grades 6-8) and Wednesday, September 10, (grades 3-5) from 3:05–4:00pm in church. A snack is served at 3:05pm. Contact Mr. Anderson if you have any questions. Permission slips will be available through both the School and Religious Ed programs. Choristers normally (with several exceptions) sing once a month at the 10:30am Mass on the first Sunday of the month.

Cantors assist with leading and animating the sung prayer of our community. Some musical reading ability is helpful along with a pleasant voice! Cantors rehearse individually and in small groups as needed. We are always looking for additional cantors. Contact David Anderson to set—up an audition/listening session. While many cantors sing in one of the parish choirs, this is not a requirement.

The String Ensemble plays for the Saturday 5:00pm Mass, usually on the 4th Saturday of each month. Rehearsal is before the Mass. Membership is open to all high school string players. Dear Parishioners.

As the fiscal year has come to a close, I wanted to give you an update on the future of our St. Edmund school building. There is no doubt that the school building is currently being used to carry out mission for Ascension and St. Edmund Parish and for the Catholic Communities of Oak Park and Neighbors. We see this through the Migrant Ministry and our Youth Ministry which are presently using the building.

When we met with parishioners this fall to share the report from the Multi-Site Review Committee, we discussed that a committee would be formed to look at how the school building could further support the ministry and formation needs of both parishes. While we recognize the potential value this space may hold for our future, after much discernment, we have determined that our financial reality makes it impossible for us to retain the school building. This is a very difficult decision for me as your pastor, knowing the profound legacy of St. Edmund School. For 99 years, it helped shape the faith of thousands of children —made possible by the unwavering generosity and commitment of the St. Edmund faith community.

We are currently in ongoing dialogue with the Archdiocese of Chicago regarding the next steps for the future of the school building. I will share more details as soon as I am able. In the meantime, we have met with the leadership for Migrant Ministry and encouraged them to begin to look at space alternatives. A plan is also being developed for Youth Ministry so that it has the space necessary to support our young people and the ministry's programming.

I know many of you may have questions, so I have set aside time on **Sunday**, **August 24**, at 10:15am in **Murphy Hall** to be available for conversation. Please join me after the 9:15 a.m. Mass for coffee, pastries, and a time to talk together.

I will keep you updated as I have more information to share. Thank you for your faithfulness and for everything that you do.

Nancy introduces herself below: My husband and I moved to Oak Park 2 years ago we joined Ascension Parish after being parishioners at St. Clement in Lincoln Park for over 40 years. After my 3 children finished school, I went back to school and received my MBA in Non-Profit Management. I have enjoyed my retirement of 8 years immensely along with our 7 perfect grandchildren. For the past year I have been volunteering weekly at the Migrant Ministry at St. Edmund.

In 1983 I started my own business doing bookkeeping and business services for over 25 parishes in the Chicago Archdiocese (not all at the same time), specializing in subsidized parishes. Starting in 2000, I worked as the Director of Parish Operations for St. Clement Parish, and 10 years later for Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church. In addition to taking care of business needs, I was instrumental in the capital campaigns that raised over 2 million dollars and served as the project manager for parish construction projects.

Financial Status

Income and Expenses have been published in the bulletin weekly. For FY 25, expenses exceeded the expected deficit. Thank you for increasing your weekly donations as well as supporting the Close the Gap and fundraiser initiatives to help reduce the deficit.

FY 26 Budget

One of our goals was to work with staff to submit a balanced budget for the 2025 – 2026 fiscal year. We are happy to report that we achieved this goal.



Women's Spirituality Group


The Women's Spirituality Group gathers women in all stages of life, to strengthen our connection to our God

Parish Operations Update

Dear Parishioners,

I wanted to share a few updates regarding various maintenance projects across our parish.

It has been challenging to keep our buildings cool with this summer's fluctuating temperatures. Our Parish Center on the Ascension Campus required a major overhaul of its HVAC system. Maintenance work was needed at Ascension School and at the McGivern Center to keep HVAC systems running.

Sewer repairs were necessary at the entrances of St. Edmund which entailed breaking some of the concrete on the walkway. We took the opportunity to replace other cracked concrete areas and improve drainage around the campus. Much of this work was made possible due to a generous donation from a parishioner who reached out specifically to support our most critical needs. We are very grateful for the support.

Thanks to a generous targeted donation, the Ascension School gymnasium and courtyard are undergoing much needed updating to ensure the continued usefulness and safety of these areas. The end-pine, gym floor is being stripped and refinished with a fresh logo painted in the center. A fence will be installed along the east and south sides of the courtyard including a gate at the alley and driveway entrance. Improved lighting will be installed in the courtyard as well. The donation will also cover some new classroom furniture. A second phase of the project to be undertaken next summer will include repairs to the gymnasium walls and installation of retractable bleachers as well as additional classroom furniture.

I am happy to share that the newly-formed Parish Maintenance Committee had their first meeting this month. This group will share more information about the responsibilities they are taking on in the near future.

We appreciate your continued support to make sure our campuses are well care for. Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions.

MIGRANT MINISTRY UPDATE: REST IN PEACE, DEAREST JORGE BORRAYO

A **Beloved Community** has formed among the volunteers and migrants of the Migrant Ministry. In the almost three years since the Ministry began, volunteers of various ages, faith centers, and communities have come together with a common goal of welcoming and serving migrants. And many migrants themselves have joined the group, working alongside us to sort donations, distribute clothes, and help in many other ways. **We have become very close and are truly blessed**.



After receiving services at Centro San Edmundo, Guatemalan natives Jorge Borrayo and Hector Hernandez began volunteering last year, joining us regularly on Tuesday and Thursday mornings. They worked in the men's clothing room, adding dignity to the "free store" by helping migrants select clothes that fit well and looked good on them. They became intimate members of our community.

Jorge and Hector were returning from a weekend job near Rockford on Sunday evening, July 20, when they were in a terrible car accident. **Jorge was seriously injured and did not survive**. He died peacefully in the Cook County Trauma ICU surrounded by Hector and his "Chicago family." Arrangements are being made to ship his body back to Guatemala.

A small memorial altar has been set up in Centro San Edmundo for the volunteers to write messages and share memories of Jorge. A celebration of LIFE will be held later.

We mourn out beloved brother, Jorge Borrayo.

Ministers of Care Visits






