Dear Parishioners,

Praised Be Jesus Christ. Renewal is one of the fundamental tasks of the Archdiocese and really of the Church at large. Otherwise, we stagnate and become complacent. Ever dwindling numbers become, “just the way things are.” Meager vocations and parish mergers are the result of the reality of a lack of renewal. As harsh as it is, the logic of mergers is sound. Why have 100 people going to Mass at this parish and 100 going to this parish wouldn’t it be better to have 200 at one site, with heating and cooling costs, and hopefully for a better overall experience. That doesn’t even mention that we have so few priests, let alone quality priests to keep these sites open. But the reality of attachment to a place and space is powerful. We get used to crucifixes, and pews, and even things like carpeting. I had a woman explain to me that she hadn’t been back to one church since they changed the carpeting. She admitted it was old ugly carpeting, but it was *their* old ugly carpeting. And so with every merger some people refuse to come back, and unless anything fundamentally changes those mergers cycle into more mergers. Lack of vocations to both priesthood and to religious life goes hand and hand with this. If people don’t want to go to Church why would they want to serve the Church. All the programs we do, become to a degree, entertainment for those who are going to Church, something to pass the time. Renewal is the only antidote for this. It requires a fundamental shift in how we think about Church and ourselves and our faith lives.


Co-Implementation is a program that we have been selected for by the Archdiocese as part of their ongoing renewal efforts. We are one of the early sites selected for this program. What it means is we will be working hand and hand with the Archdiocese to implement programs meant to build a culture of renewal. Believe it or not, there are Catholic Churches that are growing, where people have come to believe in Jesus and to have that fundamentally impact and change their lives. Following some of their template, adjusted to St. Catherine’s and Oak Lawn, makes a lot of sense and gives me a lot of hope. Sean O’Dea is our on-sight coordinator of this program for us. He will be with us for the next three months and then if all goes to plan, for the next three years. He is paid entirely by the Archdiocese of Chicago.



There will be other resources and people we will be getting help from as part of this process. What is required of us is buy in, and an openness to show up and try some of the new ideas. It will mean investing in food and hospitality because that’s part of making a place where people want to come.

One of the great strengths of St. Catherine’s is the willingness to volunteer, to show up and offer hours of time for things ranging from carnival, to picnics, trunk or treats, and softball games. Church stuff is on occasion, included in the list of things for which people are willing to show up. People get uncomfortable sharing faith, being vulnerable, or trying out new things especially when it comes to faith. My only ask is that you being willing to try. We all individually need to renew ourselves if we are going to renew the parish. We are the parish and its not something someone else can do. We are all on to know and love Jesus more and to bring others to love Him more. We are not just a community organization but a Church. Fundamentally its who we are. But, more than that, I also believe that Jesus can and will do wonderful things with us. I believe that when we open ourselves up to Him, and let Him work, great things happen for us. Come Holy Spirit and renew St. Catherine’s.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Each year from January 18-25 Christians around the world observe the "Week of Prayer for Christian Unity." During this week, we join Jesus' prayer that his disciples be united, as he and his Father are one, "so that the world may believe" (John 17:21). As we learned at the recently completed Synod on Synodality, promoting Christian unity is essential to becoming a truly synodal Church. "Ecumenical dialogue is foundational to developing an understanding of synodality and the unity of the Church" (Final Document, par. 137).

The theme for the 2025 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, "'Do You Believe?' was proposed by the ecumenical monastic community of Bose in Italy, in cooperation with the international team appointed by the Vatican Dicastery for Promoting Christian Unity and the Faith and Order Commission of the World Council of Churches. The year 2025 marks the 1,700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, the first Ecumenical Council of Christian churches, called by Emperor Constantine I from May to July of 325.

During this year's "Week of Prayer for Christian Unity," I encourage you to assess your belief in the statement of faith of Nicaea. How does this ancient creedal statement bind all Christians as one and call us to live out this unity? Furthermore, "may we confess our resistance to that unity, embrace our diversity, and remember exactly what we believe together and share with the world: that Jesus is the Christ and the Son of God, who raises all with him to eternal life in a kingdom that will never end." Inspired by Pope Francis' recent encyclical "Dilexit Nos," please take time each day during this week to ask the Holy Spirit to enter into your heart and the hearts of all Christians to draw us ever closer to one another in Christ. If possible, join other Christians in praying for unity in your home, neighborhood, or online. 

St. Peregrine is the patron saint for persons suffering from illnesses of all types in particular cancer. Saint Peregrine was healed of a cancerous ulcer on his leg which was considered beyond saving. The fame of this event in 1325 spread rapidly around the western Church. Christians, and especially the sick, began to invoke his name and seek his intercession for the relief of their suffering and even for a cure from sickness. The canonization of St. Peregrine in 1726 increased people's devotion to him which spread to the universal Church.



St. Catherine of Alexandria will begin offering a Novena to St. Peregrine at 7:00pm in the church. The Novena will be held for 9 Mondays. All are welcome.
