

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

What is the RCIA?

The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is a journey that helps older teens and adults discerning the Catholic life. When I was first ordained, I became highly involved in the RCIA process in my first assignment. As a "Cradle Catholic," I oftentimes took my faith for granted. As I have worked with older candidates through the RCIA from my first assignment until now, I find myself not only appreciating my own Catholic faith even more but I also am given hope that the Catholic faith truly does have something to

offer that is unique to our particular faith Tradition. Helping in the RCIA has always given me assurance that the Church will continue to grow.

Part of the RCIA journey involves the faith community as a whole. Even when sacraments are received at an earlier age, it is never a journey that one takes by oneself. Preparation for the sacraments is a journey that we take together — both those fully initiated and those seeking to become one with the Church. For those preparing for the sacraments, it is a journey to grow in one's commitment to becoming an active member of the Church. For those who are already initiated and active, it is a journey to support those preparing to enter by our own witness to the faith.

In either case, the journey to the sacraments is a journey that leads us closer to God. As we well know, the closer we are to God the more God's enemy—the devil—becomes jealous. The more envious the devil becomes the stronger will be his effort to lead us astray. This is all the more reason for us to remember that we take this journey together praying for one another that God's grace will keep us strong in the face of the devil's tempting.

During Lent, we pray more fervently for those preparing to receive the sacraments – both young and old. Last weekend, our RCIA participants signed their names in a book that was later presented to one of the bishops at a service at Holy Name Cathedral. For the next three weekends, we will be praying for them again in what is known as the Scrutiny. These series of blessings are the community's prayer that those preparing for the sacraments will be protected by God's grace against the influence of the evil one.

Who is in the RCIA?



Participants in the RCIA are grouped into three categories – Catechumens, Candidates for Full Reception, and Catholics Completing Initiation.

Meet our Catechumens!

A Catechumen is someone preparing to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Because they are adults, they will be baptized, confirmed, and receive First Eucharist all at the Easter Vigil this year.

Amy Lisek—I'm really looking forward to my first Holy Communion and the Eucharist each week at mass starting on Easter!

Alex Nguyen—I've been attending church every Sunday and came across friends there who have helped me to understand more about Jesus and his teachings. So I decided to expand my knowledge and understanding behind what it means to believe in him and the importance of what he stands for.



Overall, I am willing to accept myself to be part of the Catholic Church because I believe in him and he believes in me.

Meet our Catholics Completing Initiation!

This group consists of those baptized Catholics that never finished their initiation. They were baptized in the Catholic Church. For various reasons, they never received the Sacrament of Confirmation, Eucharist, or both in some cases. At the Easter Vigil, they will complete their Catholic Initiation.

Sarah Luna McKinsey – My journey to confirmation really started last year when I lost my Mom. While going through such a difficult time I was truly blessed with such a terrific partner. He steadfast relied on his



faith and it always seemed to give him the right words and prayers that helped to get me to the other side of sorrow. Having been baptized, my Mom always encouraged me to complete the sacraments of reconciliation and confirmation, I am so honored to have the support of my sister who has so lovingly agreed to be my sponsor. I am truly happy to continue my journey in the light of the Lord and with his blessings to one day have a family of my own and ultimately be with those we have lost once again.

"Sir, give me this water, so that I may not be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water."

- John 4:15

Let us imagine this scene between Jesus and the woman at the well. Jesus was tired after his journey. He sat down by the well, thirsty, hungry, worn out. He was so thirsty

that he skirted all social protocol and asked a Samaritan woman to give him a drink. Jewish men at that time just didn't do that kind of thing, but Jesus' thirst went much deeper. He was really thirsting to save her soul. But his tiredness does not hold back his love for a lost sheep that crosses his path.

The Samaritan woman came to the well at noon, the hottest hour of the hot, middle-eastern day. The other women of the village would have come in the cooler hours of early morning and evening. This one was a social outcast, avoiding contact with her peers. Jesus notices this, seeing in her eyes the anxiety that comes from an unstable life, but he also sees a spark of sincerity. Her rocky path through life had worn down any facade of selfrighteousness or self-delusion. Her wounded and suffering heart provides an opportunity for grace, and our Lord, forgetting about his own suffering, seizes it, changing her life forever.

Jesus became one of us on purpose. He knew that because of original sin, we could no longer raise ourselves up to friendship with God, so he lowered himself down to our level instead. This is exactly what he continues to do, every day, through the Church, the extension in time of his Incarnation. The Samaritan woman was so overcome with joy at encountering Christ, so eager to spread the news, that she left behind her empty water jar, the very reason she came to the well in the first place. Christ wants to make a real difference in our lives, to redeem us, to give us a fresh start.







winter we may serve 50+ because of the weather.



CATHOLIC REFLECTION OF THE WEEK	RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS
When I became the pastor of a large parish, I soon found myself, for the first time in my life, riddled with anxiety, headaches, difficulty making decisions, and fatigue. I called a therapist friend and told her my symptoms and asked if she thought I needed a serious medical exam. She said, "How much water do you drink?" I told her, "I haven't had time to drink water lately." She responded, "You're chronically dehydrated. Drink eighty-five ounces a day and call me in a week." I started guzzling water and in a week all my symptoms went away. I felt great. Like me, the people in the Exodus wanderings were dehydrated. But unlike me, they knew it. Their symptoms were bad. They fight with each other. They accuse God of being a monster who wants them and their children to die of thirst. Their thirst drives them to plot the bloody assassination of the man who rescued them. God responds by using Moses to strike a rock from which rivers of living waters flow to quench their thirst for years to come. The Holy Spirit is the living water of love which flows from the pierced side of Jesus, the new Moses. What symptoms in your life suggest you're spiritually dehydrated? Anger at God? Cynicism at your leaders? Bitter rivalry and bickering with others? Don't panic. Of course we have those symptoms. Ask God to provide his water to quench your spiritual thirst, and he will. And all those symptoms will soon disappear. — Father John Muir	The Long Walk The Messiah Before You If you would have asked me on the morning of my confirmation what the chances were of the Holy Spirit getting into my heart, I would have told you they were about the same as getting water from a stone. My faith was fragile at this time in my life, primarily because I viewed it as exactly that — my faith. Something within my possession and subject to my own power. And I hadn't done the things I thought I needed to do in order to be the kind of Christian who knows the truth and lives it. I was waiting to be made stronger. I was waiting to be made more faithful. I was waiting for a transfor- mation. Little did I know, I was like the woman at the well, standing around talking about the coming of the Messiah, unaware that he was standing right in front of me. She wasn't ready; she was still living in her sin. She was caught so unawares that she left her water jar at the well, rushing out to tell what she had seen. When I was anointed with the oil it no longer mat- tered that I wasn't strong enough to break open the stone that I was convinced encased my heart — God's grace gushed forth through the cracks. While I certainly didn't become a perfect Christian — and never will, in this life — I did learn that when God tells you to strike, it's probably best not to second-guess Him. —Colleen Jurkiewicz Dorman
