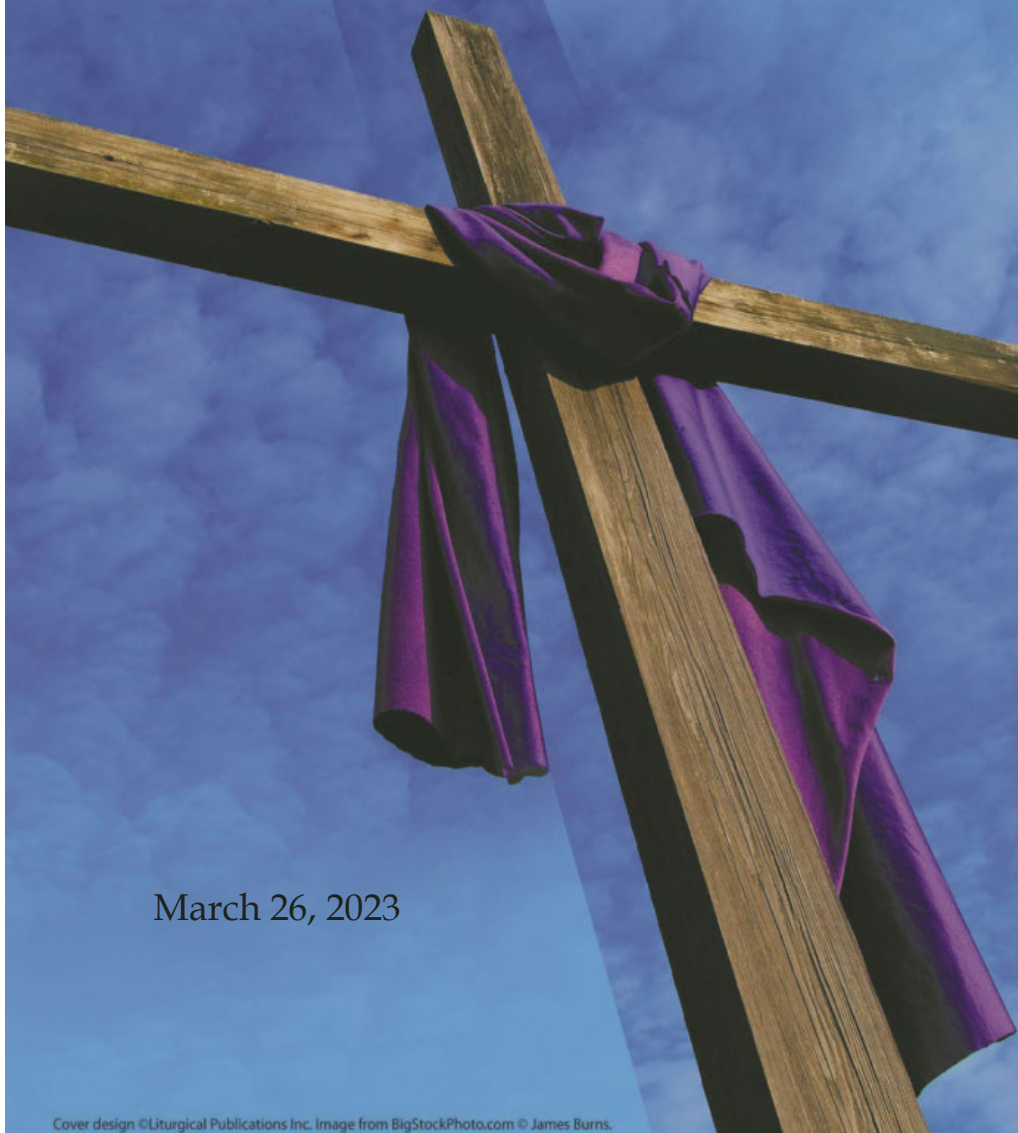

## A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

**Meet the last of our Teen Candidates Completing Their Initiation.**

We have 3 siblings all completing their Catholic Initiation.

**Charlie Sayegh**—I want to get confirmed and finish receiving my sacraments because most of my family are confirmed. I also want to become and grow closer to God.

**Paul Sayegh**—One reason I am joining the Church is because I need to connect with God more. Also it is great to go to church more and hopefully this experience can help me go more.



**Suzanne Sayegh**—I am taking this journey in joining the Church because over the years especially during COVID I felt my relationship with God hadn't been as strong as I would like it to be. So I think joining the Church is a good step in strengthening my relationship with God.

**Filip Kaczmarczyk** is our last teen candidate completing his Catholic Initiation. I was not able to get a photo or statement from him in time for the bulletin. But I ask that we still keep him in our prayers.

## Holy Week Traditions

Now that we have met all of our RCIA catechumens and candidates, I wanted to switch gears and share a little bit about Holy Week Traditions. Again, I am writing from the Filipino perspective because they have spoken to me in unique ways as I have grown older. But, I invite all of us to reflect on whatever Holy Week Traditions we may have grown up with and have become an important part of our faith life.

New to the parish this year, Fr. Roy and I have planned to bring the Filipino Catholic Community of the Southwest Parishes together to celebrate what is known in the Philippines as the "Pabasa Ng Mahal Na Pasyon." This is a tradition that is more common in the central region of the island of Luzon—one of the larger of the islands of the Philippines. The custom is rooted in a long narrative version of Jesus' life, ministry, passion, death, and resurrection that is chanted sometime during Holy Week.

Before the arrival of the Spaniards, there was already a very ancient custom in the Philippines of chanting epic poems. This oral tradition was important in passing on to future generations the great stories of the ancestors. After the Spanish missionaries brought the Catholic faith, the long epic narrative of Jesus' life was developed using stories from Scripture but also incorporating other texts.

The idea of the Pabasa is that it should be chanted by a group of people at some point during Holy Week. Furthermore, the chanting starts with the beginning of the narrative and must be continuous until it is completed. Since it is a long text, sometimes it can take an entire 24 hour period. At other times, the chanting can be extended for even two or three days. During that entire time, devotees take shifts to chant the entire text of the Pasyon. In various parts of the Philippines where the Pabasa is observed, you can walk through entire towns and hear different groups chanting from house to house. Today, there are several chant tones in addition to the more ancient tone.

The other Filipino custom that we will have here at the parish is one that takes place early on Easter Sunday

morning. This one is known as the Salubong which is a Tagalog word that translates to “encounter” or “meeting.” Again, this is a custom that was also brought to the islands by the efforts of the Spanish Missionaries. There are variations of it in different parts of Spain and Europe.

In the Salubong, there are two early morning processions oftentimes taking place before dawn. The first procession is lead by a statue of the Risen Jesus. The men of the town join in this procession. The second procession is lead by a statue of the Virgin Mary dressed in black. The women of the town join in this one. The two processions simultaneously weave through the streets of the town in separate routes. The two processions then meet at the appointed place where a ritual then takes place.

The ritual of the Salubong may be slightly different depending on the particular part of the Philippines but it has common elements. One, at the moment the Risen Jesus comes in sight of the Sorrowful Mother, joyful songs accompany that moment. Second, when the two images come together, a child dressed as an angel removes the black veil from the Sorrowful Mother and replaces it with a white veil. This symbolizes the end of the Virgin Mother’s sorrow and the start of the joy knowing that her son truly has risen as he promised. The rite usually ends with the singing of the Regina Caeli – a Marian Easter hymn – and fireworks. Then, Easter celebrations can officially begin in individual homes.

The Salubong is an encounter that, of course, does not appear anywhere in the gospels. It is a custom that developed through the devotional life of the Spaniards who brought it and the natural love of the Filipino for one’s mother. Through this custom, it is believed that Jesus would not allow his mother to remain in sorrow. Somehow, some way, Jesus first announced the news to his Mother so her pain would end.

As the Filipino community, Fr. Roy, and I share these customs this year, we just want to make it clear that ALL are invited to join in these devotions. They come from the Filipino Catholic experience but everyone can share in them. In the spirit of evangelization, we share with everyone these moments that have helped us to encounter Jesus and grow in our relationship with him.

*I am the resurrection and the life, says the Lord; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will never die.*

- John 11:25a, 26

Jesus is drawing to the end of his earthly mission. His disciples have been accompanying him for almost three years. Here once again they see Jesus showing divine knowledge. He knew how Lazarus' sickness would end, and he knew, without any need for a messenger, when Lazarus had died. Yet, even at this late point in his ministry, after three years of continually witnessing Christ's miracles, and experiencing his divine wisdom, his disciples still don't understand him. They still don't know their Lord. They continue to misconstrue his words. They think he is talking about normal sleep when he is really talking about death. They still doubt his good sense and power and even try to dissuade him from returning to Jerusalem, where his enemies lurk. After all this time and experience, they just don't get it. Any lesser Lord would have long ago given up on these kind of followers, but not Jesus. He is a Lord who serves his subjects, teaching them and guiding them to the fullness of life with tireless patience. The needier they are, the more attentive he is, the more eager to give them whatever it takes to help them believe in, trust, and follow him. Aren't we just like the Apostles? We have been Christians for so long, heard so many sermons, received Holy Communion so often. And yet, in the middle of life's ups and downs we still find it difficult to figure out what God is asking of us. In the midst of life's temptations, we still find it incredibly difficult to trust him enough to follow his will instead of

our whims. But he has not given up on us, and he never will.

Our Lord is truly Lord, but he is a Lord who rules by love. The real presence of Christ in the Eucharist is a powerful reminder of the fact that God never gives up on us. When the priest consecrates the hosts during the Mass, Christ becomes truly present in them, body, blood, soul, and divinity. Then two things happen. First, he gives himself to each one of us at Holy Communion. He is fully present in each host, and so he gives himself completely to each one of us, without holding anything back. He will never refuse to come to us, as long as we have expressed our sincere desire to receive him. We can do this by confessing any mortal sins in our conscience in the sacrament of reconciliation. But that is not enough for his love, just as it was not enough for him to come down to earth in the cave in Bethlehem. He had to show the depth of his love, and to do that he climbed onto the cross at Calvary. Just so, after Jesus becomes present in the Eucharist and gives himself to us in Holy Communion, then he continues to be with us in the tabernacle. He is here, truly present, every day and night, all day and all night. Many times we have received Holy Communion simply out of routine, without really appreciating the greatness of the gift. But Jesus keeps coming. He hasn't given up on us. Many times we forget about his presence in the tabernacle. Instead of dropping by to visit him, to share our sorrows and our joys with him, we leave him alone and do our own thing. But Jesus stays anyway. He never gives up on us. Let us appreciate this gift, and this week, start paying him a visit at the tabernacle. Also, consider spending longer time in adoration every Thursday morning or every first Friday of the month, morning and afternoon in the Sacred Heart Chapel. Let us not leave him alone.

# OUR PRAYER LIFE

## TODAY'S READINGS AND REFLECTION

**First Reading:** I will put my spirit in you that you may live, and I will settle you upon your land; thus you shall know that I am the LORD. (Ez 37:14)

**Reflection Question:** God revealed to the prophet Ezekiel his divine plan for the resurrection of the dead: "I (will) open your graves and make you come up out of them, my people!" As a person of faith, how does this promise give you hope?

**Psalm:** With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption. (Ps 130)

**Second Reading:** If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also, through his Spirit dwelling in you. (Rom 8:11)

**Reflection Question:** Paul insists that for believers, the Spirit dwelling within us gives life to our mortal bodies, raising us from the dead as Christ was raised from the dead. How does this impact your thoughts about death itself?

**Gospel:** "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." (Jn 11:25-26)

**Reflection Question:** In her grief and sadness at the death of her brother Lazarus, Martha professes her belief in Jesus as the Messiah, the Son of God. As the season of Lent draws to a close, in what ways have the last 40 days strengthened your faith in Jesus as our Lord and Savior?

CATHOLIC REFLECTION OF THE WEEK	RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS
<p>Of all Jesus' miracles, the most unsettling might be when he made a dead person alive. We know of three times when he did so: a girl, a young man, and Lazarus. The miracle teaches us he has the power of life and death. He anticipates his resurrection. Sin hurts us. Some sin kills us, spiritually. The three miracles reveal to us that no matter our circumstances, Jesus can give life to us. The three miracles are instructive of the three ways we feel dead. The little dead girl symbolizes sin before it has time to mature. She's in bed and, once alive, gets right back to her life. The young man is lying in his casket in a funeral procession. This is sin allowed to fester, to grow and become somewhat normalized. Once raised, he has a short walk back home. Lazarus, a full-grown dead man, lies wrapped in burial bands in the tomb. Once he is raised, much needs to be done. He'll need to remove those bands, find new clothes, and travel all the way back home. That is sin allowed to go all the way, unchecked for months or years. It's the most spectacular of the three and reveals Jesus' glory more than the others.</p> <p>What hope that should give us, for us and those whom we love! Jesus knows our sin hurts us and can even kill us spiritually. No matter the extent of the damage, he is always ready for the miracle of making the dead fully alive. — Father John Muir</p> <p>©LPi</p>	<p>Offer it up. My grandmother used this phrase with her children, and my mother, in turn, used it with me. It's a kind of verbal heirloom, a gift of wisdom from a generation that knew suffering all too well.</p> <p>We know it to be true that God will work through our suffering if we invite him to. We know it and we have seen it — we have only to look at Lazarus and his sisters Martha and Mary.</p> <p>But, often, I invite God into my suffering only to tell Him where I want Him to stand. I make an offering of suffering but expect God to do something very specific with it. Teach me this, please. Give me this specific grace. Show me this specific answer.</p> <p>The happy ending in today's Gospel is not the alleviation of the sorrow Martha and Mary feel because it isn't alleviated, Lazarus is still human, and death still awaits him. Someday, his sisters will have to mourn at his tomb. That loss and pain will not be avoided.</p> <p>The happy ending is that he is resurrected now, and in doing so, brings so many to belief. The happy ending is that Martha and Mary do not abandon discipleship because things didn't work out exactly the way that they wanted. They run out to meet Christ, eyes dim with tears. <p><b>CATHOLIC TRIVIA – JUST FOR FUN</b></p> <p>Question: How many Stations of the Cross are there?</p> <p>©LPi</p> <p>Answer: 14</p>	
<p><b>WHY DO WE DO THAT?</b></p>	
<p><b>Question:</b> Who invented the Stations of the Cross?</p> <p><b>Answer:</b> The first Stations of the Cross were walked by Jesus himself on the way to Calvary. Known as the "Via Dolorosa" ("The Way of Suffering") or the "Via Crucis" ("The Way of the Cross"), it was marked out from the earliest times and was a traditional walk for pilgrims who came to Jerusalem. The early Christians in Jerusalem would walk the same pathway that Jesus walked, pausing for reflection and prayer. Later, when Christians could not travel to the Holy Land, artistic depictions of "The Way of the Cross" were set up in churches, or outside and Christians would walk from station to station, reading the Gospel account of the Passion, or simply praying and reflecting on each event. While the content or place of each station had changed, the intention was to make a mini-pilgrimage and follow--literally--in the footsteps of Jesus.</p> <p>This devotion became better known in the Middle Ages, and the Franciscans are credited with its spread. Lent is a time when many people make the Stations and some churches present Passion plays or Living Stations. But anyone can pray the Stations at any time. It is a simple and personal reflection on the passion of Jesus and what it means to us.</p> <p>©LPi</p>

We would like to share an amazing opportunity for you to receive a 75% state tax credit for 2023, and assist a deserving child receive a Catholic education at Cardinal Joseph Bernardin, your parish school!
