My sincerest apologies that this report is coming to you so late in the year. There were several “hiccups” that caused the delay. Thankfully, things seem to be more under control now and I am now able to share the Annual Financial Report from fiscal year 21/22.

As you look at the “bottom line” you will notice that we ended on a good note. This is certainly good news but we are certainly “not out of the woods.” For those familiar with accounting systems, the positive number does not necessarily mean that we have that much “extra cash” in the bank. Even if we did, it would not take us very far. Please understand that this is not the time to reduce our financial support to our parish. We have much more work to do.

Again, we can be grateful that we ended the last fiscal year on a positive note. But there are some considerations that we must also be aware of as we move forward.

1. Luckily, we did not get hit with any unexpected and major repairs that could have taken a huge hit to our finances. If we did, it would have greatly affected the "bottom line."
2. For the current 2022/2023 Fiscal Year, our Business Manager and I did manage to create a budget that projected us in "the black." However, that budget was prepared with the presumption that I did not have to make any changes in staff. Now, we have to factor in the necessary changes in staff that I unexpectedly had to make. Again, the Director of Music position was formerly at a parttime status. When I was looking for a new Director, I knew that anyone capable and qualified would not want to do the job on a parttime basis. Also, when looking for a new Facilities Engineer, I also knew that it had to be moved to a fulltime status. Finally, I decided to move ahead with the plan to hire a fulltime Director of Parish Ministries/Evangelization because it has continued to be an important need. In doing so, I had to consolidate some office positions into one Office Manager/Bookkeeper. I am not sure yet what sort of impact all of those changes may have.
3. As we plan for the future, one of the approaches the Finance Council and I decided to make is to incorporate into the budget the cost of all the major capital repairs that we need to accomplish in the next few years. Among those would be the resurfacing of the entire parking lot which is already slated to be at least a half million dollar project—if we do the whole lot all at once. This is also not to mention the other capital repairs that we need to make on the Devine Center and other needs. Incorporating those expenses into the budget will help us prepare for the future.

In closing, I thank you once again for your generosity and commitment to the parish. Please continue to be as generous as you are. And, if you are at all able, please consider increasing your weekly giving since that will help us tremendously. Either way, may God continue to bring to completion the good work He has begun in all of you!

*Thomas... said to him,

- John 20:28

On Easter Sunday, we and all the rest of the Catholics throughout the world gazed with wonder and gratitude on the Resurrection of

our Lord.

Today, we turn our eyes back to the little group of Apostles who, eight days after Easter Sunday, were gathered once again in the upper room. Jesus appears to them, once again, in the glory of his resurrected body, effortlessly passing through their locked doors and their hidden fears. The first thing he does is go after the one lost sheep whose heart is astray. He lets doubting Thomas touch his glorious wounds, mercifully removing all doubts that had separated him from the rest of the tiny church. Then he looks into the eyes of his Apostles, breathes on them, and gives them the power and task to forgive sins in his name. This was the start of the sacrament of confession, which ever since then has been bringing other stray sheep back into the Good Shepherd's merciful care.

Almost 20 centuries after that encounter between Christ and his Apostles, in the year 2000, Pope John Paul II established this first Sunday after Easter as a universal Feast of the Church in honor of that Divine Mercy. In so doing, he was fulfilling a request our Lord himself made in his appearances to the Polish nun, St. Faustina Kowalska. Just the thought of Christ's mercy fills us with confidence and hope, but it should also fill us with humility. Christ is so eager to spread the news about his boundless mercy because we need that mercy. Sin is a reality in our lives and in our world and it causes real damage to our relationships that only Christ can repair. Last week, we made Easter resolutions of taking up something good. Let us continue doing them in response to God's mercy that we received, making such mercy of God flow through us to those who also need it as badly as we do.

He is the faithful God, always close to his people, in order to save them. He is the highest holiness, "rich in mercy" (*Ephesians* 2:4), always ready to forgive. He is the One who is spiritual, transcendent, omnipotent, eternal, personal, and perfect. He is truth and love.

41. In what way is God the truth? 214-217; 231 God is Truth itself and as such he can neither deceive nor be deceived. He is "light, and in him there is no darkness" (1 *John* 1:5). The eternal Son of God, the incarnation of wisdom, was sent into the world "to bear witness to the Truth" (*John* 18:37).

TODAY'S READINGS AND REFLECTION

First Reading: Every day they devoted themselves to meeting together in the temple area and to breaking bread in their homes. (Acts 2:46)

Reflection Question: We hear how the original believers in the risen Jesus lived in peace and harmony in Jerusalem. What could you do to promote good-will and happiness in your community of friends or co-workers?

Psalm: Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, his love is everlasting. (Ps 118) Or Alleluia.

Second Reading: Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in his great mercy gave us a new birth to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. (1 Pt 1:3)

Reflection Question: Peter speaks of a "new birth" of "indescribable and glorious joy" that awaits all believers "in the final time" (Jesus' Second Coming). How often do you think about your own resurrection from the dead?

Gospel: On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." (Jn 20:19)

Reflection Question: The risen Jesus says to Thomas, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Do you consider yourself blessed in this regard?

11. 18 (3 packages) heavy-duty trash bags, 30-45 gallon
12. One package of dust masks
13. Two pairs of disposable waterproof gloves
14. One pair of work gloves (leather palms necessary)

In accordance with Canon 455, of the Code of Canon Law, we are pleased to appoint you herewith as Pastor of St. Julie Billiart Parish, Tinley Park, Illinois, and we heartily commend you to the good people there. The enclosed copy of the Decree of Canonical Establishment should be retained as part of the permanent records of St. Julie Billiart Parish.

You will note that the Decree takes effect on November 28, 1974, and this appointment to the Pastorate will take effect on the same date, November 28, 1974, and will be valid for a term of six years, that is, to November 28, 1980. We wish you to take canonical possession of this parish as soon as possible thereafter.

You will assume canonical possession and jurisdiction of the above-mentioned parish as soon as the Profession of Faith is taken before the Chancellor, or one of the Co-Chancellors, acting as our Delegate according to the provision of Canon Law.

CATHOLIC REFLECTION OF THE WEEK	RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS
<p>A young, engaged couple sat on the couch in front of me as we chatted about their upcoming marriage. The young lady was struggling to trust her future husband. She told me her father had been unfaithful to her mother. She said of her fiancé, “I want him to prove to me that he won’t cheat on me.” The young man looked at me helplessly, raised his eyebrows and shrugged his shoulders. What evidence could he possibly give to validate such a proof? Nothing. All he could do was invite her to trust him.</p> <p>We all are wounded by experiences of imperfect love. We also are tempted to demand from God proof of His fidelity and goodness. We are like St. Thomas the Apostle who, on that second Sunday of Easter, demands proof of the Lord’s resurrection. “Unless I see the mark of the nail ... I will not believe.” Our science, technology and mathematics can indeed prove a great deal. But there are some things that require trusting another person. We prove promises of love only by trusting. St. Thomas indeed saw the wounds of Jesus and believed. But there is an even greater blessing for us who simply trust Him — and all the truths the Church proclaims — because of the trustworthiness of the Risen One who speaks. This week let’s trust Jesus without seeing him. — Father John Muir ©LPi</p>	<p><u>The Doors We Lock</u></p> <p>As a child, and even for a while as a teenager, I experienced an enormous amount of anxiety whenever I went to confession. For so many years I feared it. For so many years I waited in the confession line trembling, feeling sick to my stomach. In the upper room after Christ’s Passion and death, the anxiety of the disciples was so strong that they locked themselves away. But still Christ found a way into their midst. He would not be prevented from bringing mercy and hope to a place shrouded in despair. No door barred in a moment of fear could keep him out.</p> <p>This is the genius of the sacrament of Reconciliation — and of all sacraments, really. Here we are, restricted in so many ways by an existence that is woefully physical. We feel fear, and our body reacts, just as we feel anger and our body reacts.</p> <p>How can God deliver mercy to us in this flesh-bound state? Through that very flesh which can feel so confining. Through confession, which requires a physical action, and the physical participation not just of the penitent but of the priest.</p> <p>I don’t know how or why my anxiety around the sacrament has lessened over the years. Sometimes, I still feel it come roaring back unexpectedly, and maybe one day it will come back to stay. It doesn’t surprise me: after all, I am in the flesh, and I will, as Peter says today, “suffer through various trials.” But in all of them Christ will find me. WHY DO WE DO THAT?	
<p><u>Question:</u> Do children need to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before their First Communion?</p> <p><u>Answer:</u> For centuries the Catholic Church has taught that a person needs to be in a state of grace (free from mortal sins) in order to worthily receive the Eucharist. To that end, Catholics should make an effort to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation any time they recognize the need for the sacrament (and in keeping with the precept of the Church that asks that we celebrate this sacrament at least once each year).</p> <p>In the case of children preparing for their First Communion, the Code of Canon Law is very clear that they should also celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation before receiving the Eucharist for the first time: “It is the responsibility, in the first place, of parents and those who take the place of parents as well as of the pastor to see that children who have reached the use of reason are correctly prepared and are nourished by the divine food as early as possible, preceded by sacramental confession” (Canon 914).</p> <p>While some might question the significance of the Sacrament of Reconciliation — especially in the case of children who might not fully understand the reality of sin or the meaning of the sacrament itself — a child’s “First Confession” can be a wonderful time for families to reflect together on the quality of their relationships, how they put their faith into practice, and, when it is possible, to celebrate the sacrament as a family. In the end, the celebration of these two sacraments marks important moments in the spiritual journeys of children and we hope their “First Confession” and “First Communion” help instill in them a love of the sacraments of the Church.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">©LPi</p>

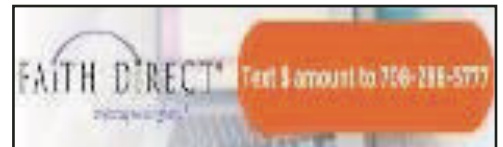

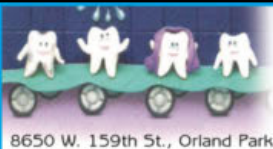
