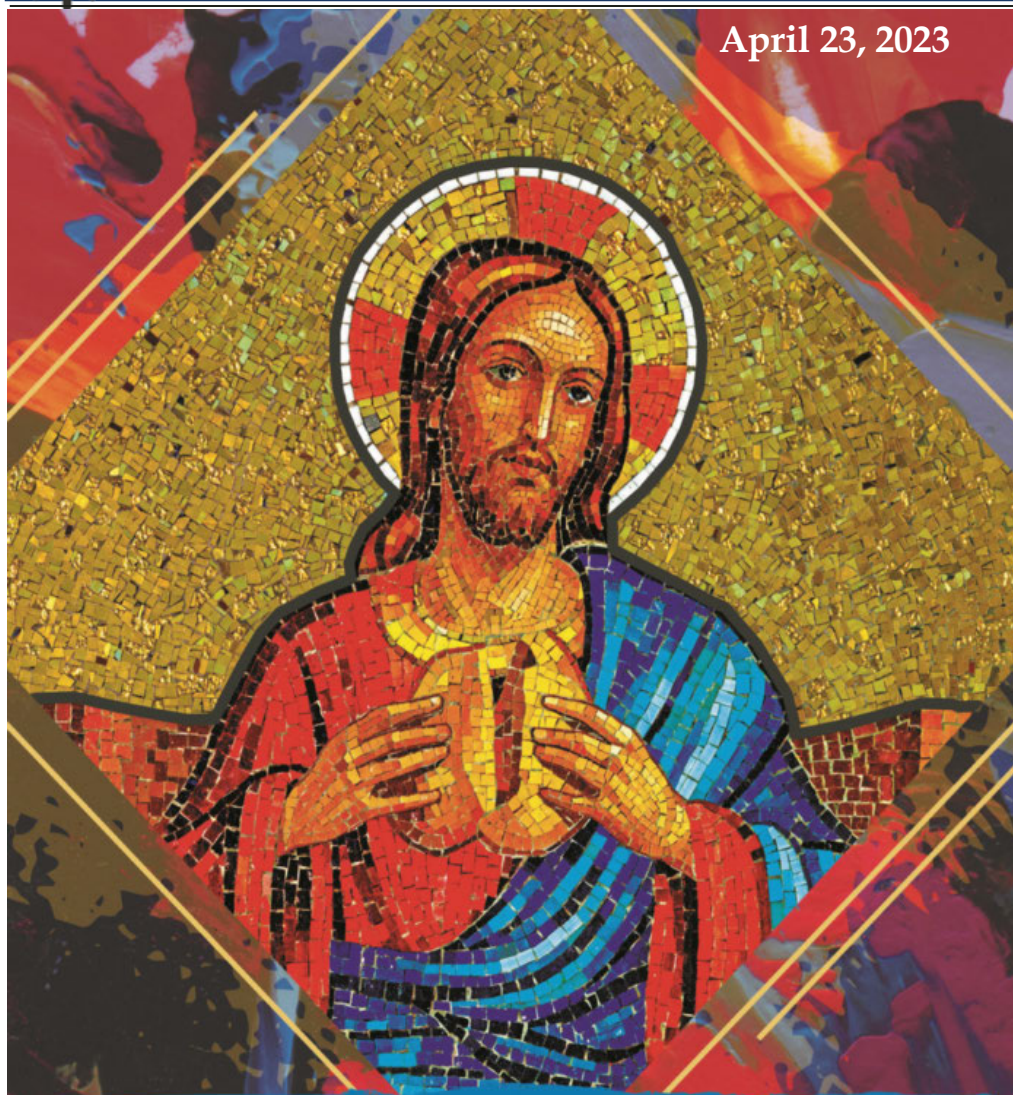

# BEING DISCIPLES OF JESUS

## A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

It is about that time of year for Catholic parishes. What I mean is this time of year usually means the celebrations of the Sacraments. Parishes will oftentimes schedule the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Communion during the latter part of April into May. Such is the case with our own parish.

Our Sacrament of Confirmation took place last weekend on April 15th during the 4:30pm Mass. Bishop Lombardo was the confirming bishop who invoked the Gifts of the Holy Spirit and sealed our teen candidates in that same Holy Spirit. The Sacrament of Confirmation is still generally reserved to a bishop. In some cases, like that of adults, priests like myself can receive delegation to administer Confirmation. This happened, for example, at this past Easter Vigil where I had the privilege of confirming our adults and older teens of the RCIA. The bishop, however, is still the ordinary minister of the Sacrament of Confirmation.

As for the Sacrament of First Communion, most parishes will schedule that celebration either in late April or early May. The most popular time of the year for First Communions has been around Mother's Day although there is no real specified time when First Communions are to be celebrated. It should, of course, be scheduled after the period of preparation and catechesis has been completed. It has just turned out that spring has become the preferred time for First Communions.

In the past, our parish has followed the custom of most other parishes. Namely, Confirmations and First Communions were separate celebrations apart from the regular Sunday Masses. Many may have noticed that we have started to move away from this. Instead, we have chosen to celebrate these Sacraments within the context of one of the Sunday Masses. Last year was the first time we celebrated First Communions at the Sunday Masses. I proposed the idea to Pat Kmak at the time. My brother's parish in Denver allowed families to schedule the First Communion of their children at whatever Sunday Mass time which the family regularly attended. I liked the idea and suggested it to Pat who also embraced the idea. So last year as many might remember, there were several children at various Sunday Masses who celebrated their First Communion together with other parishioners. When Nathan Roy took over after Pat retired, we chose to continue this. However, for this year, we chose to limit the number of Sundays in order that there might be a significant group of First Communicants at a particular Mass.

When planning for this year's Confirmation, Nathan Roy and I had a similar idea. Namely, instead of scheduling a separate Confirmation Mass, we chose to incorporate the Sacrament into one of the Sunday Mass times. Again, this was the case last Saturday April 15th.

As is the case with both First Communions and Confirmations, it will always mean that a particular Mass time might go a little bit longer than normal. This was clearly the case with Confirmations. Some were not happy about the idea. Some were okay with it. But, why did we chose to go this route?

The celebrations of each of the Sacraments are truly a "family affair." If we think about it, we can see how true this is. When a baby is baptized, the celebration of baptism becomes a joyous event for the child's parents, siblings, grandparents, godparents, aunts, uncles, and every other relative. The occasion of a baptism brings the entire family together especially when the family does not get together on a regular basis.

The same is obviously true with marriage. When couples get married, it becomes another occasion for the family to come together. Weddings can also bring family members together to one celebration who have not seen one another in any given amount of time. The joy of seeing bride and groom becoming joined as one is again more joyful when it is seen as a "family affair." In many cases, the entire family

comes together not only in the actual celebration but also assists the couple in the preparation and planning.

First Communions and Confirmations are also occasions that bring families together. The joy of seeing young children dressed in their finest to mark a special moment in their lives becomes a special moment for the entire family. Again, it is an event for the whole family.

But each of the Sacraments of the Church – baptism, confirmation, Eucharist, anointing of the sick, reconciliation, matrimony, holy orders – are not meant simply as celebrations for a particular nuclear family (parents and children) along with selected extended family members. More importantly, every Sacrament of the Church is an event for the ENTIRE family of God. In other words, God is the parent. We are His sons and daughters. We are brothers and sisters to one another. It becomes natural, then, that celebrations of the Church's Sacraments become a "family affair." However, we must broaden our idea of "family" to see ourselves and those receiving the sacraments as truly part of God's family.

So, even when we do not personally know any of the children receiving First Communion or those who received Confirmation recently, our presence at those celebrations becomes a reminder to our young children that they are part of the larger family of God. Our presence also reminds us that – as their "older" brothers and sisters – we have a responsibility to pray for, support, guide, and mentor the younger members in the ways of our faith. This is a promise we each made when we became part of God's family.

To emphasize this truth, we chose to move toward the route of celebrating the Sacraments as members of the larger family of God. Obviously, we cannot do this at all of the parish's Sunday Mass times but we chose to do so to the best of our ability. Either way, we each have that responsibility to be full members of the larger family of God supporting each other along the path following behind Jesus himself. My hope is that we will all see in the young children receiving the Sacraments not only hope for the future but a reminder of our promise to one another to walk to heaven together as sons and daughters of God who made us into His beloved family.

## *Do you love me? Tend my sheep.*

- John 21:15-17

**T**welve years ago on Wednesday, April 26, I was ordained priest together with three others for the Diocese of Tagum, in the Philippines.

The gospel reading on our ordination is John 21:15-17, the post-Easter threefold confession of Peter. This is an essential part of the Risen Lord's ensuring the continuation of the divine saving mission when He returns to His Father. This threefold confession of love by Peter at the Lord's initiative take on a deeper meaning of forgiveness and mission, as it counteracts Peter's previous threefold denial. Peter receives the mission of "feeding the lamb and tending the sheep" not on his own merit but on God's loving grace and initiative.

As ordained ministers, we come to share the mission that Peter received from the Lord to fulfil His promise of making the gift of salvation readily available to all generation. Many times we fail to recognize and remember that it is the Lord's mission, and it is His initiative. But, way more times the Lord's grace and mercy abound the more to renew us and make us stronger for the mission.

Join us at 8am Mass on Wednesday, April 26, to thank the Lord for the gift of the vocation to ordained priesthood. We will be joined also by three of my co-priests of the Diocese of Tagum who are currently on Mission Ministry in the Diocese of Greensburg, Pennsylvania. They are Rev. Peter Guardiano (celebrating 12th priesthood anniversary with me), Rev. Marlon Pates, and Rev. Julius Capongpongan.

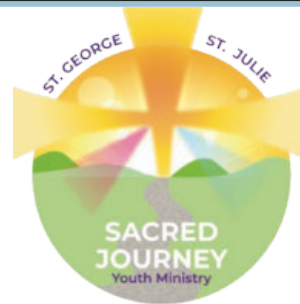

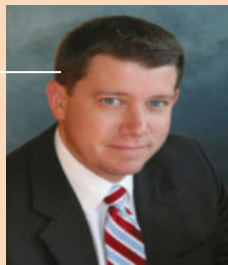

Each bucket contains 14 common cleaning items. We have partnered with organizations such as Catholic Charities, local disaster coordinators, The International Union of Operating Engineers and various moving companies to move filled buckets to a place of need. **To date, we have shipped 2,900 filled Buckets of Hope valued at \$87,000 worth of cleaning supplies to disaster areas.** This has been accomplished through the generosity and cooperation of many pastors, deacons, parish staff, and many interested individuals. ***Thanks Be To God.***

7. One large auto-style sponge
8. Three to five scouring pads, one pack
9. 36 to 50 clothes pins
10. Clothes line (one 100-foot)
11. 18 (3 packages) heavy-duty trash bags, 30-45 gallon
12. One package of dust masks
13. Two pairs of disposable waterproof gloves
14. One pair of work gloves (leather palms necessary)

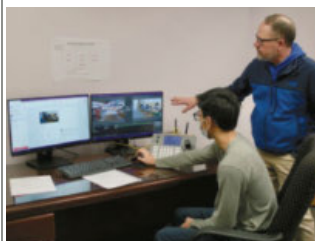

CATHOLIC REFLECTION OF THE WEEK	RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS
<p>I always feel a little sad when someone begins to speak to me with the words, "Father, I know you're so busy, but ..." It happens a lot. And I get it. He or she is trying to be respectful of my time. But it saddens me because a priest makes Jesus present to people in a special way, and Jesus always has time for us. Don't we all feel at times that God just doesn't have time for us? Nonsense. Just look at the stunning "Road to Emmaus" story we hear this week. It's the day Jesus rose from the dead. And the Risen One appears in disguise to two disciples. He walks with them, chats with them, and eventually eats with them. It could have been hours he spends with them — two unnamed persons — in the middle of nowhere. On the day he rose from the dead!</p> <p>My friends, please take this to heart: The Risen Jesus is not too busy to spend time with you! He doesn't have "better things to do." You and I are members of this crucified and risen Body. He therefore has all the time in the world to be with us. So, I challenge you this week to approach him confidently in prayer and conversation. After all, being with you and me is the reason he rose from the dead. — Father John Muir ©LPi</p>	<p>"I Am Not Afraid — I Was Born to Do This."</p> <p>Have you ever felt like you weren't doing the work you should be doing? We have all had jobs that leave us feeling unfulfilled. Bored. Dreading the next day. We may even experience a sensation of unfamiliarity, of being unable to recognize ourselves.</p> <p>Most of us have also been lucky enough to have a job that we love — a vocation, a calling that makes us look in the mirror and think, This. This is who I'm supposed to be. I recognize this person.</p> <p>For me, that work is the work of marriage and motherhood. The hours are terrible, the pay is even worse, and my coworkers are frequently disappointed in me — but it doesn't matter. When I look in the mirror every morning and see my tired, wrinkled face gazing back, choruses of "I said I don't want the BLUE SHIRT, MOMMY, ugh!" and "Honey, I've got an early meeting, I'm so sorry but I have to run," ringing in the background, I think to myself: I recognize this girl. She was born to do this.</p> <p>Christ's own disciples did not recognize him on the road to Emmaus. It wasn't until he took the bread and broke it that their eyes were opened, and they realized they had known it all along — "Were not our hearts burning within us?"</p> <p>In that moment, Christ was doing the very work he was born to do, making the sacrifice.</p> <p>I don't know what kind of vocation you are called to. I don't know what kind of work reveals your true self. WHY DO WE DO THAT?	
<p><u>Question:</u> What are the requirements for being a confirmation sponsor?</p> <p><u>Answer:</u> Although many dioceses have specific requirements for who can be a sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Code of Canon Law identifies certain requirements that are true for all dioceses and parishes. First, the sponsor should be chosen by the one to be confirmed (or, in some cases, by the parents or even the pastor). Second, a sponsor must be at least sixteen years old (unless the local bishop has chosen another age, or a special exception has been made). Third, the sponsor must be a Catholic who has been confirmed and who has already received the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Beyond this, they must lead "a life of faith in keeping with the function to be taken on." Fourth, they can have no sort of canonical penalty or impediment. Finally, they cannot be either the father or mother of the one to be confirmed (See Canons 893, §1 and 874, §1).</p> <p>In some cultures, it is customary for one of the confirmand's godparents to act as sponsor, although this is not required by Church law.</p> <p>To learn about the requirements for your parish or diocese, you can consult your pastor or your parish or diocesan director of religious education or the diocese's office liturgy and worship. ©LPi</p>

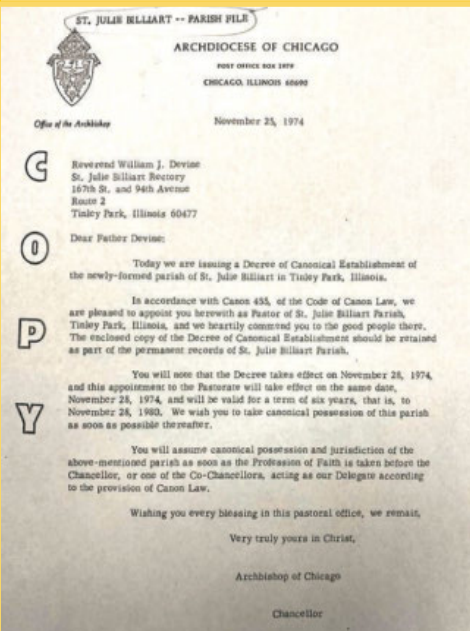

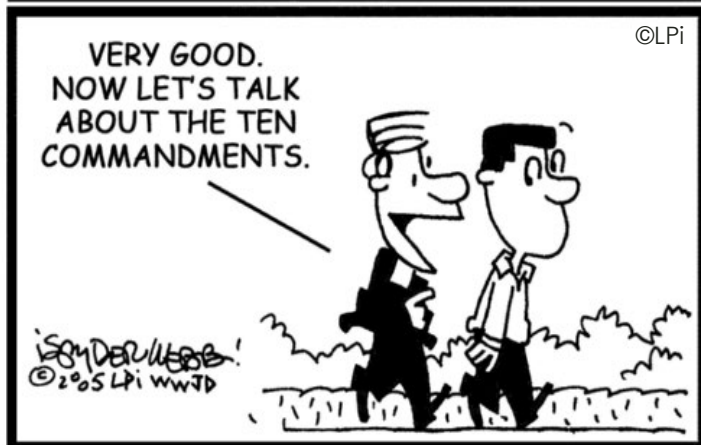

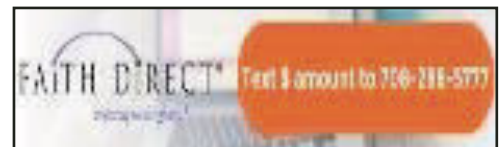
