



# A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

I wanted to take this time to share a recent development that impacts the parish office. Namely, as of May 24th, we lost our Business Manager. Some of you may not be aware that we had a Business Manager. Many parishes have a Business Manager. Some do not simply because they may not be able financially to afford one. Even though a parish is not run like any other business, nor should it be run like a business, there is still a need for someone to have oversight of the day to day things that are required to keep the parish running smoothly.

Some of the things a Business Manager would handle are the budgets, financial reporting to the pastor and Finance Council, accounts receivable and payable, and the general ledger. Further, a Business Manager would oversee all of the financial aspects of the parish—collection of Sunday collections, preparing the deposit to the bank, much of the internal controls, among other things. These are key responsibilities because it helps me as pastor not only to be able to focus on the pastoral needs of the parish, but also have a competent person in place to keep me aware of how well the staff and I are doing as good stewards of the generosity of parishioners like yourselves.

The timing, of course, is not ideal. We are close to the end of a fiscal year, which concludes at the end of June. We are still in the process of putting a budget together for the next fiscal year. Again, the timing has presented a little bit of difficulty. So, how will I be able to handle all of that without a Business Manager?

Fortunately, we have Tony Serratore as the Office Manager/Bookkeeper. He is familiar with many of the duties that are part of the role of a Business Manager. His title will not change. But, at least for the time being, he will be handling much of the day to day matters not only of the office but also the financial matters.

Assisting him will be Deacon Rich Miska. Deacon Rich had been the Business Manager here many years ago. Even when he transferred over to St. Terrence, before returning to us, here at St. Julie, Deacon Rich had been working as a Business Manager up until his retirement almost three years ago. I am grateful that he is willing to be of help and I am sure it will be invaluable. This will only be a temporary arrangement since I am sure Deacon Rich still wants to enjoy retirement. When he returned to us to be our Senior Deacon, I promised him that I would not impose too much on him. But, in this instance, I will be indebted to him for the help he will give.

Fr. Roy also will be helping as much as he is able. As it turns out, his skills have allowed him to learn many of the procedures that are part of the day to day running of the parish. He has brought many valuable ideas and will be of great help to Tony, especially since Tony will also be focused on the other aspects of running the parish office. This also will be a temporary arrangement since, like myself and other priests, these are not the duties for which he was ordained. He and I should both be concentrated on the pastoral needs of the parish. Still, I am grateful for his help and I am confident that we will be able to manage through the next few months as I consider what route I would like to take.

Hiring a new Business Manager is still on my mind. But, I may take as much time as possible before entering into that process. Again, I am confident that with Tony and the assistance of Deacon Rich and Fr. Roy, we will be able to manage things smoothly in the interim. I recognize that other staff members could also use aides. For example, in the area of facilities and maintenance, we have a team of one person in the role of Facilities Engineer. With a campus this size, one person in that role can take an extreme toll on that person. Our Director of Music can also use some assistance in many of the administrative roles that come with that position. So, I am taking all of that into consideration as I look at how we will be able to manage all of the day to day matters that come with the business and financial side of running a parish.

Again, I am not worried about this transition period. I have full confidence in Tony, Deacon Rich, and Fr. Roy. I know that the other staff members will gladly pitch in and offer whatever support they are able to give. Hopefully, there will not be too many glitches in the next few weeks. But, even if there are, they will be handled as quickly as possible.

At this time, I just ask you again for your prayers that I might be guided by God's Spirit to discern what is best for the parish. Our financial situation has improved a little bit. But, we are still not in the best shape that we can be. We ended the last fiscal year with a little bit of a positive cash flow. We had some unexpected staff changes at the start of this current fiscal year that may have an impact on this year's "bottom line." Added to this, we have so many major and minor needs to address with very little "wiggle room" in which to address them. The Devine Center continues to need more and more attention. The parking lot still needs attention. All of which will again require us to raise the funds to address them.

A little bit of a good news, though, the construction of our electronic sign has begun. If you have not yet noticed, the base of the sign is already in place along the 159th St. side of our parking lot. Hopefully, it will be completed very soon. We kept running into delays with permits and other things. Our contractor is also very swamped with other projects. Our contractor does not have enough employees to be able to give full attention to all of the projects on his plate. So, his team needs to spread themselves out a little bit. However, we can still look on the bright side and anticipate the completion of the electronic sign. Once it is complete, it will have a screen that will be visible from The Home Depot to the east and the apartment complex to the west. We will be able to flash announcements and events on the screen. Hopefully, it will not only keep parishioners posted on what is happening at the parish but also attract new comers to join us. This project has been and continues to be funded by the money we raised through the To Teach Who Christ Is campaign several years ago.

Even with the challenges, we take comfort in the words of our patroness. St. Julie reminds us always of how good is our good God.

# appy Holy Trinity Sunday!

The mysterious and wonderful doctrine about God, that God is both unity and trinity, is called by the Catechism "the central mystery of Christian faith and life" (CCC 234). The Catechism goes on to say, "It is the mystery of God in himself."

We are able to know God from the inside. That is what we, as Christians, have been given a privilege that no one else in the history of the world has been given. Philosophers and others who follow merely natural religions only know about God, from the outside. Through Christ's grace, we have actually begun to know God as He knows Himself. That is how much God has loved us. We are actually members of the divine family; we are actually friends of God; we are insiders in the Kingdom of Heaven. Friends open their hearts to each other; they share secret thoughts, affections, and desires. That is what makes friendship so beautiful and valuable. God, through Jesus Christ, has offered us this kind of friendship with Him: He has revealed His innermost thoughts and identity. Here on earth we only perceive it dimly, but if we let Him, the Holy Spirit will strengthen our supernatural eyesight so we can see and know Him better, and know all things as He knows them.

As we profess our faith in this Triune God who has loved us so deeply, let us thank Him for this truly incredible gift. Let us promise Him that we will no longer take it for granted, but every time we pray in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, we will renew our commitment to live lives worthy of the divine friendship, the divine adoption that we have received.



## May was Mental Health Month

(From the National Library of Medicine) As the United States faces two decades of continuous war, media and individuals with personal military connections have elevated public and professional concerns for the mental health of veterans and service members. The most publicized mental health challenges facing veterans service members are PTSD and depression. Some research has suggested that approximately 14% to 16% of U.S. service members deployed to Afghanistan and Iraq have PTSD or depression. Although these mental health concerns are highlighted, other issues like suicide, traumatic brain injury (TBI), substance abuse, and interpersonal violence can be equally harmful in this population. The effects of these issues can be wide-reaching and substantially impacts service members and their families.

If you would like some information about support groups for our veterans in need of mental health healthcare, please check out some of these. If you know of someone who is struggling, please share these with them.

#### **CATHOLIC REFLECTION OF THE WEEK**

In my experience, one of the peculiarities of being a man is the somewhat unlikely ability to look into the mirror, no matter how out of shape he may be, and declare with full confidence: "Looking good, buddy!" Ask a man. He'll probably confirm it. Therein lies a mystery. You might think I refer to man's ability to deceive himself or his propensity toward vainglory. But in this case, I refer to the mystery of a healthy and proper sense of self-love. We human beings (both men and women) have the utterly weird ability to look at ourselves as if we were another. Then we tend to love this "other." Then, somehow, that love becomes a bond between the two. We are three and yet one. This Sunday is Trinity Sunday. We ponder anew that God in His unity is a play of multiplicity: Lover, Beloved, and shared Love. Or, as we also proclaim, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. If we allow it, this mystery heals our temptation toward self-hatred and destruction. We all know how awful it is to look into the mirror and not know the person we see, or, equally bad, to know and hate who we see. Jesus, the Son of God, draws us into the dynamics of authentic self-knowledge and self-love. Perhaps we could ask the Holy Trinity this Sunday to teach us to truly look at ourselves and to properly love who we see looking back.

#### LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK:

On this Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we are reminded to encourage one another, to show affection and support. Can we do it? Can we do it in our daily interactions, in our families? Can we even do it on social media?

#### **RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS**

The name of the Lord is a curiously powerful thing. Say it deliberately, even in a group of people who are not particularly religious, and you'll know what I mean. There is a shift in the mood, a change in the atmosphere. When we utter the name of the Lord, He turns His head.

Once, in confession, I admitted to the sin of using the Lord's name in vain. "When you do that, tell God that you love him," advised the priest, who was wise enough to know that I would repeat this sin at some point. "You've said His name, after all. You have His attention."

We hear the name of the Lord, and we think of what it represents — John 3:16, salvation history summed up in a neat little sentence, the why and the how and the who of it all laid out before us. The Lord, so slow to anger that He offers us a million chances. The Lord, so rich in kindness and fidelity that He literally gave Himself to us that we might be saved.

But the name of the Lord is more than that. It is not just a symbol, it is an invitation. I think of Moses clutching the commandments, beseeching the Lord: "Come with us. Forgive us. Receive us as your own." The Lord accompanies us down the mountain. We bear the name of the Lord into the world with us wherever we go.

#### WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Question: We live in a country that upholds the separation of Church and state. What is the role of Catholics in society?

In it he wrote, "In their situation in the world God manifests His plan and communicates to them their particular vocation of seeking the Kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and by ordering them according to the plan of God" (On the Lay Members of Christ's Faithful, 15).

God wants us in the hospitals, the board rooms, the law offices, the food pantries, and the little league games! We are to engage in the affairs of the world. But when we're there, we should live

the plan of God. We need to respect those around us, engage in just business and legal practices, and love our children. We should care for the earth, use our money wisely, and get to know our neighbors. We must advocate for social policies that respect human dignity and human freedom. No matter our state in life, we are invited to build the kingdom of God!
