





## A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

This weekend, I wanted to report on a few things.

First, some have asked about the Holy Land Pilgrimage that we recently announced. We are still working on a few details before we can open it up to registration. Among those details includes financial assistance to interested pilgrims in order to make the trip as affordable as possible. As soon as we can figure out that plan, we can begin taking registrations. But, for those who may be interested and need the dates to request time off, we will be visiting the Holy Land from September 17-26, 2024.

Second, Kristen Maxwell who has been our Coordinator of Youth Ministry for the last year will resign at the end of this month. She felt called to go back to a classroom setting and was offered a position at a Catholic high school. Kristen has done a lot of good work for both St. George and us. I, for one, will be grateful to her for her contributions and wish her well on her next endeavor.

Please join me in thanking God for Kristen who has been a gift to us and to St. George. We on the staff will miss her. But we all understand that Kristen has responded to her vocation in the best way she knows how.

With Kristen resigning, how will we handle youth ministry? This involved a bit of a challenge. For one, there is our continuing struggle with finances. Although we are much better now than we were several years ago, our budget remains very tight. Hiring another Youth Minister — on our own or shared — would involve a big expense in salary and benefits. So, the financial aspect remains a big concern.

To come up with a solution, I consulted first with Nathan Roy our Director of Lifelong Faith Formation. The ongoing faith formation of our youth truly is a part of his role as DLFF. He has agreed to assume some of the responsibilities of providing our youth with those moments to grow in their faith. Yes, this will involve more work on Nathan's part but I am glad that he has agreed to add this to his ministry. Of course, he will need support from the staff which I am sure he will receive. I have every confidence that Nathan will be able to develop a way for the parish to help our youth become stronger disciples.

As Nathan takes on this added responsibility, his focus in regards to youth ministry will be limited just to the parish of St. Julie. In other words, he will not be shared with another parish as we did with Kristen. Running a shared youth ministry program was challenging enough for Kristen. This would be impossible for Nathan. So his focus again will be the youth of our parish but, of course, there will always be room for collaboration with the neighboring parishes.

Third item to report, for the next couple of weeks we will have bulletins with reduced number of pages. We have a contract with a company that prints our bulletins every week. Luckily, the printing of our bulletins is at no cost to the parish. Further, the parish gets some money back from the bulletins because of the businesses who have taken out ads. Our contract, though, requires us to reduce the number of pages from time to time. Together with Darla Draus and Tony Serratore who put the bulletin together every week, we decided that summer weeks would be the best time to reduce the pages. Summer tends to get a little bit lighter with events and activities. So in case you end up wondering what is going on with our bulletins, I wanted you to be informed.

For the time being, I hope that everyone is enjoying your summer months. May this be a time to rejuvenate and reenergize.

Let us talk about an ever present reality in this world—SUFFERING. Jesus has two important thoughts about it. First, here on earth there is no escape from it. We hear from some preachers that if we believe hard enough in Jesus, He will take away all our suffering. Jesus never said that. Jesus told us that if we want to follow Him, we will have to take up our cross every day. He told His Apostles not to be afraid of those who kill the body, but He didn't say that no one would try to kill them. In fact, all of Christ's first Apostles were martyred except St John the Evangelist, who miraculously survived being boiled in oil. Following Jesus will not save us from suffering in this life. That is His first thought.

His second thought explains why He allows His followers to go through suffering. Suffering entered the world with sin, as St. Paul reminds us in the Second Reading. To save us from suffering, Jesus would have to eliminate all sin, but that would mean eliminating all freedom, since sin is a freely chosen rebellion against God. However, eliminating freedom would also eliminate the possibility of experiencing and giving love. If so, we would become God's robots, instead of God's children. Instead of eliminating suffering, Jesus transformed it, turning it into a channel of grace. Being faithful to his friendship, even in the midst of opposition and suffering, will make that friendship grow. "Everyone who acknowledges Me before others," He explains, "I will acknowledge before My Father." In other words, by choosing to bear our sufferings as Christ bore His, with trust in God, patience, courage, and love, uniting our crosses to Christ's cross, those sufferings actually become channels of wisdom, grace, and holiness, which are the fountains of happiness in this life and the life to come.

If we reflect on this more deeply, it would make sense why Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta wanted "to love till it hurts". Let us pray for God's grace for us to do the same in our own unique way.




#### PRAYER TO STS PETER AND PAUL APOSTLES

#### **CATHOLIC REFLECTION OF THE WEEK**

When I was in middle school, there were times I didn't want my fellow students to see my parents drop me off or pick me up in the school parking lot. I was embarrassed of my parents. Why? I have no idea. Maybe it was our station wagon. Or I didn't want to look like a little kid. But in retrospect that was a silly thing to do. I was a kid. And I had two parents who loved me and had built a wonderful family. I was afraid of the other kids' judgment. How silly! I should have been afraid of forgetting or downplaying my family, which is where my identity had its deep roots.

This is a way to understand Jesus' words to his disciples this Sunday, when he says, "Don't be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna." Fear, in this sense, refers to where we find our deepest identity and our highest love. That's why Jesus says next that when we acknowledge him before others, he will acknowledge us before the Father. It doesn't mean we're brash or boastful. But rather we unhesitatingly and humbly embrace our identity as followers of Jesus and children of God the Father. After all, if we love who we are and where we come from, who cares what the other kids think about us?

#### **RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS**

I have a necklace that originally belonged to my great-grandmother. I don't really know much about the man who gave it to her, most of those details have been lost to time. But I know that he wanted to marry her, and that she refused, and it had something to do with religion — ultimately, he did not share her faith. And while I've certainly seen many interfaith couples have loving and successful marriages, in this particular case, my great-grandmother discerned that this would not be one of those marriages.

Like I said, I don't have many details about this man, but I know that she felt she couldn't marry him because it might jeopardize the souls of her children, and therefore the souls of their children, and their children after them — me. She turned him down because of me.

My great-grandmother never sold that necklace, not even when the Great Depression further reduced her financial circumstances. She kept it, and she gave it to her daughter, who gave it to her daughter, who gave it to me. The necklace is always given with a warning: there is something worse than being poor, worse than being scared, worse even than being desperate. Worse than all of these things is separation from God. When I wear this necklace, I think about my grandmother and this man she possibly loved a hundred years ago. I think of the many decisions we make every day — large and small, good and bad — that reverberate down through the generations in ways we cannot, at the time, imagine. I think of the God who knows every hair on my head.

#### WHY DO WE DO THAT?

<u>Question</u>: What is Lectio Divina, and how is it associated with the Benedictine Monastic tradition, whose founder, St. Benedict, we honor on July 11?

Answer: Benedict desired his monks to live in community, praying the Liturgy of the Hours together, contemplating sacred texts, and doing manual labor. The monks developed a technique to facilitate a spiritual and devotional reading of the Bible known as Lectio Divina, the holy reading of a text. This method encourages the reader to hear the biblical text with an open heart and focus on whatever God wants to highlight and then apply it to daily life. There are variations on Lectio Divina, but essentially, the technique consists of a three-step process of reflection. When the reflection is done with a group, the responses are shared by all the participants. Once the text is selected, it is read meditatively, and the following are then explored: a word or phrase that attracts you; how and where the content of this reading touches your life today; what you believe that God wants you to do during this coming week (month, year, lifetime). Thanks to Benedict, the Christian community has been gifted with this special way of entering into the biblical text. This week, use the Lectio Divina process on one of the readings for the coming Sunday and make a note of the life connections you are making. How is this reflection on the biblical text drawing you closer to God and others?



#### **CARE FOR CREATION**

Consider zero-waste options for picnics, BBQ and camping meals. Reusable items add a touch of class, sensibility and significantly reduce waste. Use lightweight reusable plates, utensils, bowls, cups and cloth napkins. Get creative with packaging. Reusable containers? Of course. What about Mason jar desserts? Go heavy on finger foods: cut vegetables and mixed nuts. Wipe off food when finished and use a washable cloth bag to hold used dinnerware for dishwashing later. Reserve a bag for recyclables and a container for compostables. If you must go disposable, use biodegradable paper products instead of plastic. Ditch the straws. Use a large thermos for drinks. Take other beverages in metal or glass containers and recycle. Skipping bottled water saves money and the environment.






