# BEING DISCIPLES OF JESUS

## A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Continuing from last weekend's article, the next "secret prayer" comes at the time of the gospel proclamation. You may have noticed that the deacon stops in front of the presiding priest before taking up the Book of the Gospels. In the absence of a deacon, you may have noticed that the presiding priest pauses and bows before the altar before taking up the Book of the Gospels. There is an assigned prayer at those moments that are also "secret" because they are to be prayed inaudibly.

When a deacon proclaims the gospel, he first goes before the presiding priest and whispers, **"Your blessing, Father."** In his role as the presider, the priest is the proper minister to proclaim the gospel. By virtue of the fact that he stands "in persona Christi" (in the person of Christ) during the liturgy, the priest is the one to proclaim the gospel. The gospel is, of course, the very words of Jesus himself. If the priest stands in the place of Jesus in the liturgy, the proclamation becomes his duty.

But, a deacon assists the priest at the liturgy and in the appropriate times acts like an extension of the priest's role as the one who takes the place of Jesus. The gospel proclamation is one of those moments. The deacon first asks the blessing of the presiding priest in order to fulfill this sacred duty. At this point, I must note that if a concelebrating priest proclaims the gospel, he does not ask for the blessing since, as a priest, his role is already to be the one to proclaim Jesus' words in the gospel.

In response to the deacon's request for a blessing, the presiding priest prays these words audible only between himself and the deacon:

#### May the Lord be in your heart and on your lips, that you may proclaim his Gospel worthily and well, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

There are a couple of things to note well in this prayer.

One, the priest prays that the Lord be on the deacon's "heart and lips." In this, we are to understand that the gospel proclamation—like the first and second reading as well as the responsorial psalm—is more than just a reading of a story. In other words, it is not the same as a "story time" that we might share with young children. A proclamation of Sacred Scripture requires heart and lips because the heart becomes the seat of one's faith and the lips become the instrument of vocalizing that faith. This one phrase in the prayer simply emphasizes the unique difference in what the deacon is called to do in proclaiming the gospel.

The congregation makes a similar prayer after the deacon/priest announces the gospel proclamation. Everyone makes the Sign of the Cross on our foreheads, lips, and chest. This is a communal and individual prayer that we all make asking that the Word of God penetrate our minds, our words, and our hearts so that in everything we say and do the Word of God may become evident.

Second, the priest prays that the deacon might proclaim the Gospel "worthily and well." Again, this simply further emphasizes the nature of the proclamation. It is meant to remind the deacon that what he does is not simply a retelling of an ancient story but he must proclaim the words of the Gospel in such a way that the very proclamation might inspire deeper faith in the ones who are listening to Jesus speaking to them.

In the absence of a deacon, there is a "secret prayer" that the priest prays at the foot of the altar before he goes to proclaim the Gospel. This prayer goes

Cleanse my heart and my lips, almighty God, that I may worthily proclaim your holy Gospel.

**T**appy Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord! Our Lord on that mountaintop event was flanked by Moses, Elijah, Peter, John, and James. He was praised by God the Father. Our Lord was at the center on that mountaintop because He is the center of everything. Salvation history prepared for Him and salvation history was never the same after His Incarnation. The Law prepared for His coming, the prophets testified to Him and what He would do. The Apostles gave witness to who He was, what He did, and what He said, with the testimony we have received from the evangelists regarding this event as a case in point. However, before all this, the Father created the world with His Son in mind. If the Lord is at the center of your life, everything will fall into place and click, not necessarily according to your plans, but according to God's plans, which are the best plans for you. Peter needed lots of time to process this, and he betrayed Our Lord and reconciled with Him between the event on the mountaintop and his testimony in today's Second Reading. Start processing and don't get discouraged by setbacks. No matter how often the Lord is "off-center" in your life, you can always put Him back at the center.

456-460 For us men and for our salvation, the Son of God became incarnate in the womb of the Virgin Mary by the power of the Holy Spirit. He did so to reconcile us sinners with God, to have us learn of God's infinite love, to be our model of holiness and to make us "partakers of the divine nature" (2 Peter 1:4).

**86. What does the word "Incarnation" mean?**461-463; 483 The Church calls the mystery of the wonderful union of the divine and human natures in the one divine Person of the Word the "Incarnation". To bring about our salvation the Son of God was made "flesh" (*John* 1:14) and became truly man. Faith in the Incarnation is a distinctive sign of the Christian faith.

Certification can assure consumers that they are buying forest-related products that were grown, harvested and processed sustainably, protecting the resource for future generations.

### TODAY'S READINGS AND REFLECTION

CATHOLIC REFLECTION OF THE WEEK	RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

What is Christianity finally about? These days if you ask almost anyone who doesn't know the Bible you'll probably hear an answer like this: "Being a good person" or "following the golden rule." No offense to the golden rule, but our faith is simply much stranger than that. This week's feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord is a luminous example of this. Jesus becomes radiantly and overwhelmingly beautiful. The glory of God literally shines forth from his body and even his clothes. Here we see that Christianity is not mainly a moral system, but a relationship with God in Christ, one that finally makes human beings gloriously beautiful.

Now we can see our good and bad deeds in a new and de-centered way. Our morality isn't about a heaven or hell scorecard. It's about lives open (or closed) to transfiguration, lives capable of revealing the glory of God in Christ to the world. Spouses, children, friends, co-workers, priests, consecrated women and men, and so on — we are all called to let the beauty of Jesus make our lives beautiful, little by little. His beauty in us is the center of our faith.

We have all had moments when we seem to get a glimpse of Heaven.

For me, they come with the sacraments: in the pew following my First Communion, kneeling before the bishop as he sealed my forehead with oil at my Confirmation, standing opposite my husband on our wedding day, cradling my newborns as the priest poured holy water over their little foreheads, claiming them for Christ.

Moments when the veil between this world and the one to come is pulled away, and our hearts cry out: "Lord, it is good we are here."

Like Peter at the Transfiguration, we desperately wish the feeling would last forever. We want to hang onto the certainty, the confidence and the joy that radiates from our souls. We want to spend forever looking upon the transfigured face of Christ. But we are not in heaven yet. We raise our eyes, seeing only this world before us, the words of Jesus ringing in our ears: "Rise, and do not be afraid."

#### WHY DO WE DO THAT?

<u>Question</u>: Why do Parishes Offer Special Masses like Thanksgiving and Memorial Day, even though they're not Holy Days of Obligation? Am I obligated to attend?

<u>Answer</u>: Out of respect for the various civil celebrations that take place during the year, many dioceses and parishes will host special Masses. However, while it always worthwhile to come together to worship as a community, Catholics are not obligated to attend these celebrations. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church notes, the only times that we are obligated to participate in celebrations of the Eucharist are on Sundays and holy days of obligation:

The first precept ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor") requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord as well as the principal liturgical feasts honoring the mysteries of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the saints; in the first place, by participating in the Eucharistic celebration, in which the Christian community is gathered, and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days. ©LPi
