A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

So I bet that you never thought that there were this many "secret prayers" involved in the celebration of the Eucharist. But, there are several more that happen right before and after receiving Communion.

Picking up from last week, right before receiving Communion himself, the priest prays silently:

May the Body of Christ keep me safe for eternal life.

Likewise, with the chalice, the priest prays:

May the Blood of Christ keep me safe for eternal life.

These simple phrases are a strong prayer of trust that it is only the grace of God that the priest — and indeed all the faithful — will be brought to eternal life. The priest prays that receiving Holy Communion with Jesus' Body and Blood will keep himself on the path that will lead him to eternal life. This is a reminder to us that even though the path to salvation has been clearly paved out for us by Jesus himself, we, by our own will, can choose to stray from that path. When we stray from that path, we can lose the gift of eternal life.

Then, at the end of Communion, the priest purifies the sacred vessels. In essence, the priest is "washing the dishes after the meal." This is his responsibility and, even though the purification can be postponed until after Mass, doing so in front of the people conveys a simple yet powerful message. The priest is not above "doing the dishes after the meal." For this very reason, purifying the sacred vessels at the altar immediately after Communion sends the message that the priest has been conformed to imitate the life of Jesus who came to "serve and not to be served."

As the priest purifies the sacred vessels, he is to pray silently:

What has passed our lips as food, O Lord, may we possess in purity of heart, that what has been given to us in time may be our healing for eternity.

With these words, the priest prays on behalf of the entire faithful. He first acknowledges that the Body and Blood of Jesus were received in Holy Communion is food and drink. However, Communion is not so much for physical nourishment for we will never receive the full day's worth of daily nutrients. Still, the Sacred Body and Precious Blood of Jesus provides a nourishment that even earthly food cannot give to us.

As we have seen from these "secret prayers," silence in prayer plays a huge role in the celebration of the Eucharist. Silence opens us up to the presence of God who speaks to us in those silent moments. If we remember the story of the Prophet Elijah in the cave, God's voice was not heard in the loudness of earthquakes and such. Rather, the voice of God was clearly heard in a tiny whispering voice which required the prophet to be in a state of silence in order to hear the voice of God.

Likewise, we need silence in our prayer to be able to focus on the voice of God speaking to us. Prayer is incomplete when we ourselves are doing all the talking. Prayer is true prayer when we are able to be in silence and listen to God talking to us. There are times when we feel as if God is not speaking to us or we cannot hear Him talking to us. Perhaps what we lack is simply the silence in order to develop the skill to open ourselves up to listen to God's voice. I hope this has helped you understand the liturgy a little better.

There are lots of opinions on who Jesus is or who He was, but the Lord reminds us that the most important opinion is our own: who do I say that Christ is? In the Gospel, Jesus starts quizzing His disciples about the rumor mill regarding Him but then hits them with a pop quiz. Who did people think Our Lord was? Simply a prophet, and, for most, not even a new prophet: one back from the dead. Little did the disciples realize as they rattled off the theories that they would have to answer for themselves too.

Peter taught us how we should respond to the question: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Peter's profession of faith was bolstered by grace, not just his own sleuthing. The Father revealed something about His Son in Peter's response, and Peter's faith should be our faith. Peter's faith in Christ was rewarded by Christ's trust in him. Peter was entrusted with the keys to the kingdom of Heaven. Our Lord promised him that the gates of the netherworld would not prevail against the Church that the Lord would found, upon him as the Rock. Who is Christ to you? If our response lacks any element of Peter's response, it is time to reexamine and deepen our faith. COMPENDIUM of the Catechism of the Catholic Church Part One - The Profession of Faith Section Two - The Profession of the Christian Faith CHAPTER TWO I Believe in Jesus Christ, the Only Son of God

94. What is the meaning of the expression "conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit..."? 484-486 This expression means that the Virgin Mary conceived the eternal Son in her womb by the power of the Holy Spirit without the cooperation of a man. The angel told her at the Annunciation that "the Holy Spirit will come upon you" (*Luke* 1:35).

95. "...Born of the Virgin Mary": Why is Mary truly the Mother of God? 495; 509 Mary is truly the *Mother of God* because she is the Mother of Jesus (*John* 2:1, *John* 19:25). The One who was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and became truly her Son is actually the eternal Son of God the Father. He is God himself.

96. What does the "Immaculate Conception" mean? 487-492; 508 God freely chose Mary from all eternity to be the Mother of his Son. In order to carry out her mission she herself was *conceived immaculate*. This means that, thanks to the grace of God and in anticipation of the merits of Jesus Christ, Mary was preserved from original sin from the first instant of her conception.

97. How does Mary cooperate in the divine plan of salvation? 493-494; 508-511 By the grace of God Mary was kept free from every personal sin her whole life long. She is the one who is "full of grace" (*Luke* 1:28), "the all holy". When the angel announced to her that she would give birth to "the Son of the Most High" (*Luke* 1:32), she freely gave her consent with "the obedience of faith" (*Romans* 1:5). Mary thus gave herself entirely to the person and work of her Son Jesus, espousing wholeheartedly the divine will regarding salvation.

SAINTS: WHAT ARE THEY? WHAT ARE THEY GOOD FOR?

Many people have heard the term "saint" before, perhaps even used phrases such as "For Pete's sake". But what exactly is a Saint? Well, the simplest answer is that the term Saint is a word that Catholics use to describe a person who we know is IN FACT in Heaven with God. Since you are reading this now, odds are that you are hoping to be a Saint one day (at least you should have that goal, you can do it!). In order to become a Saint, the Catholic Church has a process that they go through in order to determine whether or not a person has attained the status of Saint. First, a person becomes a Servant of God, when a number of people who knew the person while they were alive petition the Bishop of the area in which the prospective Saint lived. When the Bishop agrees to investigate based on the petitions and person earns the title Servant of God. After The Congregation for the Causes of Saints from the Vatican has reviewed the petitions and determined that the person has lived a life of Virtue, they earn the title of Venerable. This allows individuals to ask for the person to intercede for them. If the candidate answers said prayers with a miracle (which is heavily vetted by outside scientific and medical experts) then the candidate is given the title of <u>Blessed</u>. The final step in the process is for a second miracle to occur at the intercession of the candidate. After the authentication of the second miracle, the candidate is canonized a Saint! Now you know, so go out there and start living a life of Virtue so that you can become a Saint too!!



Sept. 1, 2023 *Pope Francis' message for* **WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE CARE OF CREATION** Pope Francis urges us to "seek first the kingdom of God" (Mt 6:33), maintaining a right relationship with God, humanity, and nature so that justice and peace will flow.

Francis tells us to act now with greater urgency, so we do not miss our chance to create a more sustainable and just world. "We can and we must prevent the worst from happening." An "ecological conversion" is needed, which Saint John Paul II encouraged us to embrace: "the renewal of our relationship with creation so that we no longer see it as an object to be exploited but cherish it instead as a sacred gift from our Creator." We are challenged to be mindful "about our habits and economic decisions so that all can thrive" – using resources with moderation and a joyful sobriety, recycling waste, and making use of available products and services that are environmentally and socially responsible. Francis reminds us we must listen to science and




