

#### What are relics?

Relics have been used by believers since the beginnings of the Church. The first Christians would often celebrate the Eucharist above the bones or remains of a celebrated martyr. Since then, relics have been used in the devotional life of the Church. They are simply remains of a revered Saint of the Church that allow the faithful to experience the power of God through the intercession of His Saints.

#### Relics are divided into three separate classes:

First Class – These are pieces of a Saint's bone or maybe even a lock of hair. Whatever it is, a First Class relic is part of a Saint's physical remains and is the highest class of relic.

Second Class – These are items that a Saint might have touched or used in his/her lifetime. A piece from a Saint's clothing would be an example. Or, it may even be any other item that the Saint might have used or even touched while he/she was alive.

Third Class - These are items that have been touched to a First or even Second Class relic. Sometimes, the faithful might bring a piece of cloth and touch that cloth onto a First or Second Class relic. That cloth then becomes a Third Class relic.

#### Why venerate a piece of a Saint's dead body?

To be declared a Saint of the Catholic Church is a declaration that a deceased person's soul is truly and undeniably in heaven. It is only in heaven that a deceased person can become an instrument of God's miraculous powers. Once declared a Saint of the Catholic Church, that Saint's physical remains become a powerful instrument of prayer through which the faithful on earth can experience the power of God.

Normally, the Church does not allow the remains of a deceased person to be divided whether those remains are buried in a casket or cremated. However, the Church allows parts of a Saint's deceased body to be separated from the whole. It is believed that once a person becomes a Saint, his/her remains become a powerful avenue for the faithful to be in the presence of that particular Saint. It is only in these cases that parts or pieces of the remains of a deceased member of the faithful may be separated from the whole.

"Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me."

- Matthew 16:24

Christ dying on the cross was the perfect sacrifice offered to God in loving atonement for our sins and the sins of all people (2 Corinthians 5:15). Christ dying on the cross was the perfect, loving act of obedience that reversed the vile disobedience of Adam in the Garden of Eden. With his arms stretched wide and raised between heaven and earth, Christ reconciled us to God and bridged the gulf opened by sin. If we want to go over that bridge and make our way to eternal life in communion with God, which is the only thing that can make us truly happy, we too must pass through the cross. We must follow the footsteps of our Lord: suffering, self-denial, opposition, humiliation, and difficulty. We may even have to lose the "whole world", like so many saints and martyrs, in order to gain the truly abundant "life."

Sometimes, when life's crosses are especially heavy, it is hard for us to remember this. At times, like Job, we find ourselves rebelling against the suffering that God permits to come our way, instead of finding its hidden meaning. Those can be lonely, dark times, full of temptation and sadness. But God promises that He will be faithful. St Paul wrote: "God is faithful and will not let you be tried beyond your strength; but with the trial He will also provide a way out, so that you may be able to bear it" (1 Corinthians 10:13). What is the "way out" that God provides? Many times, it is the comfort and support of other people; we are called to help each other carry our crosses. Jesus didn't let us suffer alone. He came and walked beside us through the incarnation, comforting, strengthening, and inspiring us with His example of self-sacrificial love. And through the Eucharist, He actually walks with us, letting His strength become our strength when we receive Him in Holy Communion. We must do the same for others. When family members, coworkers, or neighbors find themselves bending under the weight of a heavy cross, we must be Christ for them, reminding them that God's love is real, that Christ has given meaning to their suffering. We are the ones who must help them continue to pray when their faith is wearing thin. We are the ones who must comfort the sorrowful, visit the sick and imprisoned, counsel the confused, and show the face of God to those who are having trouble finding it. The more we help those around us carry their crosses, the more Christ-like we become, and the more Christ himself will be able to help us carry our crosses.


I Believe in Jesus Christ, the Only Son of God

**98. What does the virginal conception of Jesus mean?** 496-498; 503 The virginal conception of Jesus means that Jesus was conceived in the womb of the Virgin solely by the power of the Holy Spirit without the intervention of a man. He is the Son of the heavenly Father according to his divine nature and the Son of Mary according to his human nature. He is, however, truly the Son of God in both natures since there is in him only one Person who is divine.

**99.** In what sense is Mary "ever Virgin"? 499-507; 510-511 Mary is ever virgin in the sense that she "remained a virgin in conceiving her Son, a virgin in giving birth to him, a virgin in carrying him, a virgin in nursing him at her breast, always a virgin" (Saint Augustine). Therefore, when the Gospels speak of the "brothers and sisters of Jesus", they are talking about the close relations of Jesus, according to the way of speaking used in Sacred Scripture.

**100.** In what way is the spiritual motherhood of Mary universal? 501-507; 511 Mary had only one Son, Jesus, but in him her spiritual motherhood extends to all whom he came to save. Obediently standing at the side of the new Adam, Jesus Christ, the Virgin is the *new Eve*, the true mother of all the living, who with a mother's love cooperates in their birth and their formation in the order of grace. Virgin and Mother, Mary is the figure of the Church, its most perfect realization.

# WHO IS SAINT JUDE? (Or is it Thaddeus)

They are the same person! The Apostle Thaddeus later took the name of Jude, much like St. Peter's given name was Simon, until the Lord bestowed the name of Peter upon him. St. Jude is thought to be the brother of the Apostle St. James the Lesser and it is not known how Jesus called him to be an Apostle. Not a tremendous amount is known about St. Jude after the Ascension of the Lord. It is held in the western tradition that he went to preach the Gospel in Persia after Our Lord ascended into Heaven. While in Persia he was martyred along with the Apostle St. Simon the Zealot. St. Jude Thaddeus is the Patron Saint of Impossible Causes/Desperate Cases. St. Jude's Children's Hospital for Childhood Cancer is a modern example of how this Saint's intercession continues to affect our lives today.

As an interesting side story, the historian Eusebius tells us that two grandsons of St. Jude Thaddeus were found to be descended from the Royal House of David by Emperor Domitian of the Roman Empire. The Emperor had the two young men brought to him but upon seeing that they were poor peasants, seeking a kingdom "not of this world" (ie. Heaven, the Kingdom of God) Emperor Domitian laughed at them and sent them away.

Even when we face impossible odds, St. Jude shows us that with a singular focus on Jesus, anything is indeed possible!


#### **Care for Creation**

#### Celebrate the Season of Creation

The Season of Creation is a month-long prayerful observance that calls upon Catholics to pray and care for God's Creation. It starts September 1st and ends October 4th. It's a time to reflect on our relationship with the environment, how we live, and how our lifestyles impact the natural world, humans and other creatures inhabiting it. This "time for creation" offers, in the words of Pope Francis, "individual believers and communities a fitting opportunity to reaffirm their personal

vocation to be stewards of creation, to thank God for the wonderful handiwork which he has entrusted to our care, and to implore his help for the protection of Creation...".

The US Conference of Catholic Bishops reminds us that "we show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of Creation". Pope Francis urges us to recognize our connectedness with the natural world saying, "Nature cannot be regarded as something separate from ourselves or as a mere setting in which we live. We are part of nature, included in it and thus in constant interaction with it." (LS 139). Advocating for Creation Care helps safeguard the inheritance the Creator has given us, ... an inheritance essential to our well-being. Pope Benedict XVI told us that protecting this inheritance is a way of fulfilling our role as stewards of Creation.

# **PERT**MINISTRIES "Whatever you do for the least of these, you do for me."

Inspired by St. Francis and the Franciscan Charism, the Port Ministries mission is to provide the fundamental needs of the mind, body, and spirit. The organization addresses these needs through a series of programs and services that holistically work together to serve the under-resourced and under-served residents of the local communities (Back of the Yards, Englewood, Gage Park).

No one envisioned the rich network of ministries that would develop when Father Augustin Milon, OFM, founded a one-room soup kitchen in Chicago's Back of the Yards neighborhood on May 26, 1985. In a neighborhood stricken by violence, homelessness, drug abuse, gang activity and abandoned buildings, Port Ministries has listened and responded to the pressing needs of the local community with a Catholic spirit of loving outreach.

Our goal is to put faith-in-action to address the underlining issues that plague and limit the potential of these under-resourced and under-serviced communities and their residents.

About twenty-five plus years ago, St. Julie was offered the opportunity to become partners with The Port. It was a simple ask, "Can you make provide us with some bagged lunches?" The rest, as they say, is history. Our faith community has worked together through ministries, the Youth Group, Faith Formation and the Parish at large to provide close to 200,000 simple bagged lunches! Can you imagine?

We didn't set out to make that many, but when you take one step at a time, it's amazing what we can do together! The best part about making the lunches is that ANYONE can do it! Any age, any ability. We can all do it and we can do it together.



Choosing the Cross

I've been called a lot of things in my life, but I've never been called "Satan," at least not to my face.

It seems to me the worst name you could call a person, and today we hear it straight from the lips of Jesus. It's just one of the many small reminders strewn throughout Scripture that Jesus preaches meekness, but he is not mild — not when mildness serves no purpose, anyway.

And here, when Peter is trying to deter Jesus from making the right choice, mildness serves no purpose at all.

Can we blame Peter? I certainly can't. I'm sure I would have said the same thing to my own dear friend. He is, in today's Gospel, wholly unwilling to embrace the cross — he's afraid of it, even — but aren't we all, in the end, afraid of our cross? I am. It's no sin, it's only human. Fear is natural. Self-preservation is a reflex.

What Christ speaks of today is a choice, one we are all faced with, again and again, just as Peter is. We will not always respond perfectly; Peter does not respond well today. He does not respond well on Holy Thursday.

But on his last day, on the day of the ultimate choice? On that day, he chooses the cross.

We marvel at first responders who put themselves in harm's way for the sake of others, because to do so is not human, it is divine. I have to believe that if even a firefighter's loved one threw themselves in his way, he would still charge toward the flames, crying, "Get behind me."

Christ runs into the burning building for us, shaking off not only his own fear (and he had it, I promise you — he was human, too) but the fear of everyone who loved him. "Offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God…" — Romans 12:1

#### Q and A

#### Dropped Host

Question: What happens to a consecrated host if it accidentally falls to the ground?

Answer: This a very practical question because, as we all know, accidents happen, even during the most careful celebration of the liturgy. The short answer to this question is that nothing happens to the consecrated host. The Real Presence of Jesus remains in the consecrated host or any consecrated wine that might accidentally be spilled.

Another question we might ask is: How should the minsters respond if the Eucharist is dropped or spilled? If this happens, the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of holy Communion should immediately pick up the dropped host and consume it. If it is a case of the Precious Blood being spilled, the minister would use the purificator (and additional purificators if needed) to clean the spill and then the area should be reverently washed as soon as the Mass is over and the water poured into the sacrarium (a special sink that is located in church sacristies for reverently disposing of holy water, the water used to clean sacred vessels, etc.).
