A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

The relic of St. Jude Thaddeus will be arriving this Wednesday. Thank you first of all to everyone who has signed up to volunteer. Thank you in advance to those who have yet to sign up. This is a special moment that we can share with people from not only the parish but also in the surrounding area. To have the relic of St. Jude—one of the original Twelve Apostles—visit our parish is a rare honor and one that should give us a sense of gratitude for being asked to host the relic.

This week, I wanted to share with all of you the idea of a plenary indulgence. First, many of us might hear the word "indulgence" and think of a time in our Church's history that was the cause of a great scandal. Namely, there was a time when the Church got into the bad habit of "selling indulgences." In other words, the faithful could essentially "buy their way into heaven" simply by paying all sorts of money for the indulgences. With each indulgence they obtained it would secure for them a shorter time in purgatory. Thus, their entry into heaven would be speeded. Part of the scandal, of course, was a result of the fact that the money made from the selling of indulgences went to finance construction projects of churches and the like.

Today, though, we have moved away from that understanding that a person can "buy his/her way into heaven." But, indulgences are still very much a part of Catholic faith life and devotion. I mention this because there is a plenary indulgence connected to the visit of St. Jude's relic. There will be a banner with this information during the visit of the relic but I wanted to share a summary of it in advance.

What is a Plenary Indulgence?

To understand the idea of an indulgence, we must first reflect on what sin is and the effects it has on our eternal soul. Yes, Jesus has forgiven sin and the mercy of God is always ready to forgive. However, each of us as human beings have been endowed with the gift of free will. In other words, we can still freely choose to offend God or choose to do the good that our relationship with God demands of us. If God removed free will along with the salvation that Jesus won for us, we would be nothing more than puppets—innocent but puppets nonetheless. So free will remains which obviously leads us to commit sin.

When we do commit sin, we incur guilt. Our relationship with God is broken. God alone has the power to restore that relationship. The absolution we receive through the Sacrament of Reconciliation imparts a grace upon us whereby we once again experience the saving power of Jesus' death and resurrection. Sacramental Confession, then, removes the guilt and restores the relationship.

However, sin leaves a scar. For this reason, the soul that God created and placed in each of us undergoes a deformity. Think of it in physical terms. Whenever we experience a serious injury or even major surgery, the wound might have healed but the scar remains a physical sign of what once was broken. People who have gone through major heart surgery, for example, will know the truth to this. Pardon the graphic description but their chests were literally cut open. The wound was eventually sewed up and healed. But, the scar will always be there. It is something that will never go away. Even with makeup to cover up the scar, it still remains beneath. A similar thing occurs on our souls whenever we freely choose to commit sin.

Our immortal soul was created in the image and likeness of God. In other words, the soul was created to love as God loves, to live in perfect harmony with God and others as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit live in perfect harmony with one another. The human soul is ordered and conformed to reflect the very image and likeness of God. The soul without sin is a perfect and mirror image of God's very image and likeness. However, the soul that incurs sin is left with a scar that needs to be reformed in God's image and likeness in order to be properly prepared to enter into eternal life in heaven. Just like sin had no place in God's original

plan for Creation, sin has no place in eternal life in heaven. The soul that is still burdened by sin cannot find the way to heaven.

So here is where indulgences come into the picture. For those who have preceded us in death, how certain can we be that even our loved ones who we admired and adored left this earthly life completely without any scar? This is where the idea of Purgatory enters the discussion because it is the place of "purgation" – the place where the soul is prepared and cleansed of the scars of sin in order to enter into the heavenly kingdom.

A plenary indulgence becomes an exercise of the Pope's privilege as the successor of St. Peter. As we heard in the gospel last weekend, St. Peter received the keys to the Kingdom of Heaven and was endowed with the authority to hold bound or loosen. Even as this authority is shared with the entire Church as the Body of Christ calling every member to be instruments of forgiveness, there still remains a singular and unique ability reserved to the Pope as St. Peter's successor. That is, the Pope can exercise his authority to declare a removal of the scar of sin on a soul. Thus, this reduces the period of purgation and prepares the soul for heaven more quickly. In short, plenary indulgence is a way for the Pope to exercise charity and love for the deceased in the fullest way possible – making certain that the soul is ready to enter into the heavenly banquet and thus enjoy life with God.

In the case of St. Jude's relic, there are certain steps that we need to take in order to be granted the indulgence by the Pope. Veneration of the relic is first. Pray for the Pope. Celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation within 20 days of visiting the relic. Receive Holy Communion within that same time frame. Resolve to end all relationships with sin – venial and mortal. We can either choose to apply the spiritual benefits of the indulgence upon ourselves or upon someone who is already deceased. For those who cannot physically visit the relic, making a resolve to break ties with sin and to receive Reconciliation and Communion as soon as possible.

"Amen, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."

- Matthew 18:18

n this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus is explaining **⊥** to His Apostles, the future leaders of the Church, how they should deal with members of the Church who fall into sin and cause scandal to the family of believers. Here Jesus is referring especially to the kind of sin that affects the whole community directly. He instructs His Apostles not to ignore it, but to do something about it. It may sound so authoritarian to us if we are used to thinking that tolerance, even tolerance of sin, is the highest value. But, that is not Jesus' perspective. He wants His Church to care about tolerance, yes, but He wants it to care even more about truth. Sin is real, and it is destructive, both for the person sinning and for the whole community. Sin is like a destructive fire that starts in one person's soul. If it is not put out quickly with Christ's mercy, it can destroy that person and spread like a spiritual forest fire through a whole community. That is why Jesus instructs His Apostles to do everything possible to bring people back when they stray. First they should approach them one-onone and patiently encourage them to come back to Christ. If that does not work, they should patiently involve some objective parties in the discussion. And only if the scandal continues should there be a public denunciation, in order to make it clear to everyone that the sinful, scandalous behavior is contrary to God's loving plan of salvation - to isolate the fire. This Gospel passage comes right after Christ's parable of the good shepherd who leaves his ninetynine sheep in order to seek out the one who has strayed. Christ is insisting here that all His followers, and especially His ordained ministers, have the same selfless and determined attitude.


CHAPTER TWO

I Believe in Jesus Christ, the Only Son of God

101. In what sense is the life of Christ a Mystery? 512-521; 561-562 The entire life of Christ is a revelation. What was visible in the earthly life of Jesus leads us to the *invisible mystery of his divine sonship*: "whoever has seen me has seen the Father" (John 14:9). Furthermore, even though salvation comes completely from the cross and the resurrection, the entire life of Christ is a *mystery of redemption* because everything that Jesus did, said, and suffered had for its aim the salvation of fallen human beings and the restoration of their vocation as children of God.

102. How did God prepare the world for the mystery of Christ? 522-524 God prepared for the coming of his Son over the centuries. He awakened in the hearts of the pagans a dim expectation of this coming and he prepared for it specifically through the Old Testament, culminating with *John the Baptist* who was the last and greatest of the prophets. We relive this long period of expectancy in the annual liturgical celebration of the season of Advent.





RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Love and Truth

I think even the most devout, the most pious Catholic reading this could summon to mind, if asked, one or even two examples of Catholic teaching for which they have desperately looked for a loophole.

Don't worry, I won't make you share with the group. But bring it to your mind now: the doctrine you once resented, or perhaps still do. The commandment you don't fully understand, the one you bristle against. The rule you find the hardest to follow. The belief you hate explaining to your friends.

If it disappeared from scripture or dropped out of the catechism, would your life really be easier? Would you be happier?

I am thinking of mine. For a long time, I searched high and low for a way around this particular teaching. I read books and Scripture and tradition, I prayed and reflected and tried to argue with myself. For a time, I gave up complying with it entirely. I threw it to the wind, with a shoulder shrug and a self-satisfied assurance to myself that God, being a loving father, does not want his child to be unhappy.

But reader: I was miserable. I was so, so miserable, and I stayed that way until I finally accepted that God is, indeed, a loving father, and desires nothing less than the unhappiness of his children. And so, to ward it off, he has given us the truth, and asked us to share it amongst ourselves like a cherished heirloom, a priceless inheritance.

To share truth, you must show love. To show love, you must share truth. One demands the other. Because this is what Christ does for us, and this is the mission of the Church in this world. Loosening and binding. Bearing witness. Giving testimony. Speaking truth, and in speaking truth, showing love.

Q and A

Should a Catholic Pursue an Annulment?

Question: After a civil divorce, is a Catholic obligated to pursue an annulment?

Answer: Many Catholics are not exactly sure what an annulment does. An annulment does not deny that a marriage took place, nor does it deny that there once was love. It does not mean that people say anything untrue, such as they never loved each other or that everything in their marriage was wrong. An annulment does not negate children, nor make them illegitimate. An annulment addresses the spiritual aspect of marriage. In effect, an annulment says that at the time of the wedding, there was either something present or something absent that prevented the sacrament from taking place. It is a spiritual determination that, if granted in the affirmative, allows a person to marry in the Church.

Annulments have no legal standing and are unable to be used in a civil court. Therefore, a Catholic has no moral obligation to pursue an annulment. However, when the tragedy of divorce occurs, and there is no hope for reconciliation, annulments may help bring some spiritual closure to a person's life. Some people have found the process to be healing and others have found it to be difficult. Speak to your priest or a member of the Diocesan Tribunal staff to decide what is best for you.




