A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

As you may recall, last weekend we welcomed our seminarian Ben Anderson who shared his vocation story and invited us to support the Annual Seminary Appeal. Also last week end at the 9:30am Mass, we recognized and commissioned all of our catechists. I wanted to refer to those moments last weekend as a way to invite more parishioners to move toward becoming more involved in our spiritual home.

Pastor On other occasions, I explained that there are two things every Catholic parish ought to be doing. The first is Pray Well. The second is Teach the Faith. I shared that if a parish is not doing both of those things then there is something seriously lacking. The staff here have taken those phrases to heart and have joined me in making it the center of our mission. However, as the staff and I have progressed, I have tended now to add a third aspect – Live the Faith.

Praying well is the first step. We have to come together in worship and prayer. We must center our lives on God alone. Otherwise, nothing will make sense and nothing will ever have value. Without God as the very center and focus of everything we say and do, nothing will have meaning no matter how many programs, events, or activities we have as a parish. Praying well is essential and we are already doing that.

Teaching the faith flows from our prayer. We will never be able to understand everything about God or what He expects of us. This is a continual and ongoing process that takes an entire lifetime. As a parish, we need to be teaching the faith not only to children but even to adults of all ages. All of us are learners who are called to sit at the feet of Jesus the Master and learn from Him.

The third aspect is what I encourage everyone to reflect on today. Living the faith must also be a daily call that we must answer. Living the faith involves a spirituality and lifestyle centered around true stewardship. Whenever we use that word, though, we instinctively think of monetary donations. That is only one aspect of stewardship. In reality, stewardship is a sharing of time, talent, AND treasure as a way to express our deep gratitude to God for all that He has given to us.

We may have heard the phrase, "full and active participation." For those familiar with liturgy, this is a call for all the faithful to participate in the act of worship fully and actively according to each one's proper role within the liturgy. However, full and active participation is not limited just to what we do in church on Sundays. Rather, in living the faith, we are all called to put our faith into action in ways that truly express the relationship we have with God. I refer back to our catechists as well as the example that Ben Anderson is currently giving to us.

Our catechists have answered the call to living the faith. In dedicating themselves to pass on the faith not only to children but also to adults, our catechists share their time, talent, and treasure. They, of course, give of their time to prepare for lessons that will encourage others to deepen their own relationship with the Lord. They share the talent of their desire to help others rejoice in the same gift of faith that they themselves have received. They share the very treasure of faith – a relationship with God where we recognize that God is the very best gift that anyone can ever receive.

Ben Anderson is one of our parishioners responding to God's call in a unique way. He is currently discerning a vocation to the priesthood. He has several more years to go but his is a journey that has lead him to hearing God's voice inviting him to take his faith to exploring ordained ministry. Ben is truly an example of one who prays well because in praying he has disciplined himself to listening to God's voice. He is also one who teaches the faith as he has participated in ministries such as Totus Tuus among others. He is one who is striving to live the faith by dedicating himself to a life of service to others in imitation of Jesus Himself.

Starting this weekend, the parish staff and I want to encourage and invite everyone else in the parish to consider ways to share time, talent, and treasure. Imagine a parish community where every single person in the pews is involved is someway in any of the many ministries of the parish. So often, parish communities like ours have reached the point where it is the same people volunteering for everything. There comes a time when they may no longer be able to exercise the ministry in the same way as they did before. However, if no one comes forward to "take the reins," what happens to those ministries?

Here at the parish we have so many people from various walks of life. We have young and old, men and women, people from various ethnic backgrounds. As much as we appreciate the fact that you come here week in and week out to pray with us and worship God in the Eucharist, we pray now more than ever that you might take it to the next level. Instead of just being a faithful churchgoer who comes to Mass every week, we ask you to consider ways you might be able to teach the faith. If you are a parent of young children, look into our Family Faith Formation where both parents and children are given the tools to teach one another the richness of our faith.

We take this time to encourage and invite you to look into ways where you can live your faith through a fuller and more active participation. Living the faith involves understanding the way we express our gratitude. The more aware we are of God's goodness to us the more easily it will come to show our thanks through sharing of time, talent, and treasure. Can you volunteer even a little bit of your time in some capacity? No matter how big or small you might consider it to be, is there a talent you have that might be of benefit to others in the parish community? Finally, treasure does not necessarily involve financial donations. The more we consider our faith to be the greatest treasure, the more we will want to share it. The more we recognize that our relationship with God is the greatest gift we can give to others or to ourselves, the easier it will be to share every aspect of our lives with the people around us.

Let us renew our discipleship by praying well, teaching the faith, and living the faith.

started my marathon running journey with the L motivation of gaining a bragging right when I get it done. Asking the grace of God, I went through (and I am still going through, because growth continues as I breathe) the process of purifying my intention. In all that we do, if we are to strive for God's reward in heaven rather than praise and recognition from other people here on earth, we are headed towards achieving so called purity of intention. We strive to love God and to love our neighbor, to do good to others so as to be mirrors of God's own goodness in this fallen world. God is like the sun, giving off heat and light to all people, the humble and grateful, and also the wicked and self-serving. Purity of intention makes us like that. It frees us from being slaves of other people's fickle opinions, bringing peace and equanimity to our souls.

This does not mean we should not take pleasure in the gratitude and recognition that sometimes comes to us even here on earth - that is fine and healthy. The dangerous thing is to make such recognition our goal. There is one very easy way for us to take the temperature of our purity of intention: look at our reaction when we do something for someone and they do not say "thank you". The natural reaction is to give into feelings of resentment and anger, and maybe even vengeance. The supernatural reaction, the one that shows purity of intention, is to let those feelings pass by, like clouds, and keep the eyes of our soul focused on Christ's cross. When others do not appreciate us, we are being treated a little bit as Christ was treated. And if we are true followers of Christ, that alone should give us deep spiritual joy.

Let us then ask the Lord to give us the interior peace that comes from learning purity of intention. As for me in joining the 2023 Chicago Marathon, I ask the Lord the grace that I may keep in my heart and mind those who will be helped by the Pat Kmak Fund that I raise funds for. **COMPENDIUM of the Catechism of the Catholic Church** Part One - The Profession of Faith Section Two - The Profession of the Christian Faith
