## A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Several weeks ago in a Midweek Moment video, I made reference to the ways we mark special occasions – especially birthdays. They are a big deal and we should take time to celebrate those momentous occasions. Birthdays seem to be a big deal even when from the time we were children. To this day, children of all ages oftentimes will make a big deal about their birthday and do so days before the actual date.

Why are birthdays such a big deal? For one, we associate birthdays with gifts. That is the most clear and obvious reason. Young children look forward to their birthdays because they know that it will be a day when they will receive presents. Perhaps the reason why gift giving has become a central part to birthday celebrations is the very fact that we have come to see how the day of our birth is an act of gratitude for the gift of life itself.

In that same Midweek Moment video that I just mentioned, I posed an invitation to all of us to reflect on a different birthday – our baptism day. This weekend, I refer back to this invitation because on October 4th, 1970, I was baptized into the Catholic faith. I was reborn as a follower of Jesus. This means that this coming Wednesday, I will begin my 54th year of being a disciple of Jesus as a baptized member of his Church. I want to take this opportunity to invite all of us – perhaps even challenge us? – to begin celebrating our “second birthday.”

The first part of this invitation is simply to ask, “Do you know the date you were baptized and where you were baptized?” Many of us may remember the church where we were baptized. There are some who may not remember that detail. If we have pictures of our baptism, we might be able to tell which church it might have been. I suspect, though, that a good majority of us might not remember the exact date of our baptism. Growing up, I knew that I was baptized at a parish named Our Lady of Grace in the subdivision of Morning Breeze in Caloocan City, Philippines. That is where my family and I were living at the time I was born. I know that detail because I remember my parents telling me that part of the story. But, it was only within the last ten years that I found out the exact date of my baptism. It just happened that my sister was working for our home parish of St. Edward’s on the North Side. She came across my First Communion record and it indicated the date of my baptism as October 4th, 1970. So from that point on, I marked that date in my calendar.

I admit that I have not yet gotten to the point of marking my baptism day with any sort of special celebration. But, I at least know the date and have started giving thanks to God for the most special gift that I received the day I was baptized. That gift is the reason why I am encouraging us all now to bring attention to our baptism day and even the baptism day of our children and perhaps even our grandchildren.

At a recent baptism I celebrated for the grandchild of a family friend, I asked the people in attendance – especially the parents – to think back to those special occasions of their lives. I invited them to call to mind the birthdays, graduations, anniversaries, etc. I further asked them to recall the gifts that they received and reflect on which gift they might have considered to be among the best that they received on any given occasion. For children, it might have been that toy they always wanted. For those who are older or perhaps even adults, it might have been a gadget or even money. When we received those gifts, we might have been overwhelmed with joy upon receiving them.

But, then I asked that same group at the baptism, “How many of those gifts ended up ‘collecting dust’?” Of course, if the best gift was monetary, that gift got spent in some way almost immediately at the moment we received it. In terms of the toys, the gadgets, and the other gifts we received, how many of them ended up put away somewhere in the house? At what point did those things just end up becoming objects that “took up space”? How long did it take us to give those things away or get rid of them in order to avoid the clutter?



I then asked the family at the baptism—as I am asking of us now—if faith is the greatest gift we can ever receive because it comes from God Himself, where is that gift now? Have we put it on a shelf only “to collect dust”? Has it become something that we consider as “dispensable” once it reaches the status of something that simply “takes up space”?

If a relationship with Jesus is truly the most valuable gift that we can receive, why would we want to “put it away”? If faith is the most precious gift that we can give to our children, why would we not want them to get excited about the day they received that gift just as much as they would react when their birthdays come around? Celebrating the day we were baptized does not have to be a huge production. But, it just seems to stand to reason that we should do something to remind us of that great gift of faith.

So I am taking this opportunity once again to issue this invitation—even challenge—to all of us. Whether we are strong and active in our faith or not as strong as we want to be, let us start by finding out the date of our baptism and put that in our yearly calendars just as we might mark other significant moments of our lives. Then, on that date, let us do something to give thanks to God for our faith. Let us also do something to thank whoever it might have been in our lives who helped to nurture the greatest gift that any of us can receive. For those of us who are parents and/or godparents, let us greet our children/godchildren on the day we gave them the gift of faith as a way to remind them of what they received.

Just a week left until I run in the Chicago Marathon for the Pat Kmak Faith Formation Fund (PK Fund) of Team Saint Julie. I am leaning in confidence on the Lord's promise for those who put their 'yes' into action. I ask the Lord's blessing on the 18-week training leading to the big day. I consider the training as already a success itself. It is something you cannot just say 'yes' and leave the training pass by itself. It cannot be made up. In one of the 18 weeks I did not do the weekday workout sessions. Consequently, I failed at that week's weekend long run, and I had to start all over again.

Our Lord in today's Gospel reminds us that the true measure of success is not what we say, but what we do. That's the determining factor of whether we let rebellion or obedience triumph in our life. Conversion is not letting that inner rebellion due to sin shape our decisions and actions. Rebellion can be pretty wild, even exciting, but in the end, it doesn't really lead us anywhere. A believer who says 'yes' to God's will but doesn't do it, in the end, lets the rebellion win and, therefore, goes nowhere. His lips may have said 'yes,' but in the end, his heart said 'no.' A believer who says 'no' in the throes of rebellion but obeys, in the end, has conquered and won. The Pharisees in today's Gospel said 'yes' to God's will, but, in the end, didn't do it. They maintained a façade of obedience that was revealed to be a façade when God came in Person and showed them a different path to follow. The tax collectors and prostitutes, on the other hand, saw the opportunity at the coming of Jesus to quash the rebellion that had been enslaving them even as it had promised to empower them.

## CHAPTER TWO I Believe in Jesus Christ, the Only Son of God

**109. In the Kingdom, what authority did Jesus bestow upon his Apostles?** 551-553; 567 Jesus chose the *twelve*, the future witnesses of his Resurrection, and made them sharers of his mission and of his authority to teach, to absolve from sins, and to build up and govern the Church. In this college, Peter received "the keys of the Kingdom" (*Matthew 16:19*) and assumed the first place with the mission to keep the faith in its integrity and to strengthen his brothers.

**110. What is the meaning of the Transfiguration?** 554-556; 568 Above all the Transfiguration shows forth the Trinity: "the Father in the voice, the Son in the man Jesus, the Spirit in the shining cloud" (Saint Thomas Aquinas). Speaking with Moses and Elijah about his "departure" (*Luke 9:31*), Jesus reveals that his glory comes by way of the cross and he anticipates his resurrection and his glorious coming "which will change our lowly body to be like his glorious body" (*Philippians 3:21*).

**111. How did the messianic entrance into Jerusalem come about?** 557-560; 569-570 At the established time Jesus chose to go up to Jerusalem to suffer his passion and death, and to rise from the dead. As the Messiah King who shows forth the coming of the Kingdom, he entered into his city mounted on a donkey. He was acclaimed by the little children whose shout of joyful praise is taken up in the *Sanctus* of the Eucharistic liturgy: "Blessed is He Who comes in the name of the Lord! *Hosanna* (save us!)" (*Matthew 21:9*). The liturgy of the Church opens Holy Week by celebrating this entry into Jerusalem.

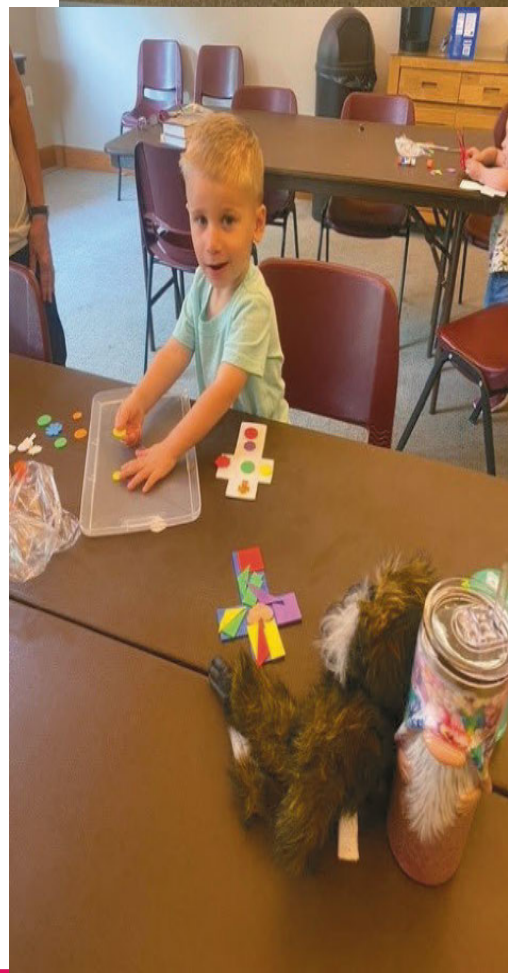
## PREPARING FOR CONFIRMATION

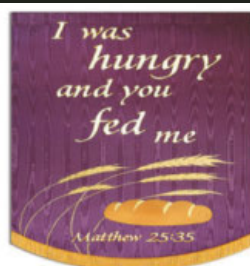

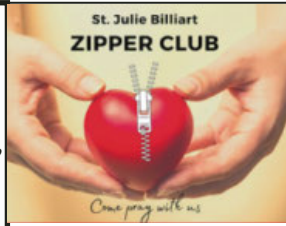

## **YOUR PARISH SCHOOL CONTINUES TO EXCEL!**

Being a twice-awarded National Blue Ribbon School of Academic Excellence has established a high bar, but Cardinal Joseph Bernardin Catholic School (your parish school!) has worked hard to out-do itself yet again!

Among the improvements rolling out this school year are some extensive upgrades that will continue to guarantee our appeal and success for many years to come – even beyond our upcoming 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary (in 2025).

Over summer while families vacationed and students slept in, CJB was busy implementing \$250,000 in technology and security upgrades, as well as socio-emotional programming for students and staff.

With school safety at the forefront of all parent minds, CJB believed it was time for a complete overhaul of our security system. We replaced cameras and wiring with a completely new digital system, adding cameras both inside and outside of the building. "Parents should not wonder whether their children are safe when they drop them off at school. If this new system will make even one parent feel better about the safety of our school, that makes this upgrade more than worth it", said Principal Jeanne Pagliaro.

After noting the ever-increasing need for student support, especially in the areas of social and emotional development, we implemented two new supports. The first was the hiring of a full-time counselor and remodeling and furnishing a new calming and sensory-based counseling center where students can spend time speaking with the counselor. The second is the schoolwide (PK-8) implementation of the tremendously successful Calm Classroom program, a foundational approach to mindfulness through brief, 1-4 minute "brain breaks".

Finally, a tag-team effort between outgoing Principal Kelly Bourrell and incoming Principal Jeanne Pagliaro, resulted in the securing of a \$140,000 grant for the addition of interactive Promethean panels to all PK-8 classrooms and the network upgrades needed to support them. These boards are essentially interactive flat-panel tablets with whiteboard capabilities that allow teachers to project from any wireless device.
