### A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Whenever we reach the month of October, several things perhaps enter into our minds. Obviously, we would think of Halloween. For many others, October marks autumn in full swing. With the coming of autumn, we might have been hearing comments and seeing memes about pumpkin spice making its annual return. Again, the month of October can evoke so many things in our imagination. This weekend, I turn our attentions to two events that are usually connected with the month of October. The two, though, have no connection one to the other. The first is usually associated with

"having fun" and the other has a direct connection with our Catholic faith.

The first I speak of is the custom of Octoberfest (aka Oktoberfest). When October comes around, many people look forward to celebrations of beer, bratwurst, and anything else German. But, I suspect that many people do not even know the origins of Octoberfest. We might have taken it for granted that October equals beer festival and it has always been so. I did a little research.

It turns out that Oktoberfest finds its origin in Munich, Germany in the region known as Bavaria. It is towards the south of Germany near Austria. All of Germany has been known for beer making and Bavaria is among the famous regions known for this craft. However, it turns out that the festival of beer has a different origin other than beer making.

On October 12, 1810, King Ludwig I married Princess Therese of Saxe-Hildburghausen. The citizens of Munich were invited to join in the nuptial celebration. The event took place in the fields just outside the city gates. To honor the newlyweds, horse races were held and they have since become a part of many Octoberfest celebrations in Germany. Along with the horse races, vendors came with their samples of beer and wine which perhaps became the origin of the beer festival we now know to be a central part of Octoberfest celebrations. Lastly, no celebration would be complete without food, dancing, and merrymaking. So, what originally was meant to be a wedding reception for the King and his bride has now developed into the annual celebration of Octoberfest. Today, no Octoberfest would be complete without the customary beer, food, and merrymaking.

In all of the parishes in which I have served, none of them ever held an Octoberfest — at least on a parish level. For a while, I have wanted to do something like an Octoberfest. This year, I am grateful that a group of parishioners came forward and volunteered to put something together for us. However, since the beer and food are not technically German in origin, we changed the name. So next weekend we will have our own version of Octoberfest. On Saturday, October 28th after the 4:30pm Mass, all are invited to join in a celebration of food and craft beer from local breweries. Again, the food and beer may not be German in origin but the idea is the same. It is a time to come together to enjoy good food and drink and simply have a good time.

On the religious level, October has also been known as the month of the Holy Rosary. The feast of Our Lady of the Rosary was this past October 7th as it is every year. The feast was instituted by Pope Pius V to commemorate a naval victory in the year 1571 over invading forces from the Ottoman Turks. The victory was attributed to the intercession of the Virgin Mary and by praying the Holy Rosary. Since then, October has been designated as the Month of the Holy Rosary.

The Rosary has been and remains a uniquely Catholic devotion. Other religions have a custom of using stringed beads in prayer. In that regard, we Catholics did not invent the tradition of using stringed beads in our prayer. But, it was through Catholic custom that the Holy Rosary has become one of those devotions that distinguish us from all other Christian denominations.

According to Catholic tradition, the Rosary finds its origins in St. Dominic (the founder of the Dominican

Order). St. Dominic lived in the 13th century. It is believed that the Virgin Mary appeared to St. Dominic and gave him the Rosary with the charge to promote the devotion. Yet, even before the time of St. Dominic, there had been a custom of using a string of 150 beads. In a time when the average person could not read, the 150 beads was a way to replace the 150 psalms found in the Old Testament with the recitation of 150 Our Fathers. Even though that may have been the case, St. Dominic is still attributed with the origins of the Holy Rosary as we know it today.

In more recent times, Catholics have been known to use the Holy Rosary in ways it may not have been intended. For example, we might see the Rosary hanging from many rearview mirrors. There was a time when the Rosary was used as a fashion jewelry. Hopefully during these past weeks of October and even in the days remaining, we might have encouraged ourselves and others to use the Rosary in the way that it was intended. Namely, the Rosary is a form of prayer – a way to be in communication with God – much more than it should be something that decorates our cars, homes, or even our necks. October has been named the month of the Holy Rosary to commemorate a victory that was attained through the intercession of the Virgin Mary. As October comes to a close, let us renew ourselves to praying the Rosary every day to remind ourselves that the prayers of the Virgin Mary will help us be victorious over the biggest battle we may ever encounter – the fight against the influence of the evil one.

This Saturday, October 28th, again after the 4:30pm Mass in the north lot, come join us for a celebration of food and beer. Since this is our first time having such a Fall Fest, please be advised that part of the parking lot aisle just in front of the church will be blocked off. You can still access the sidewalk leading to the church for drop off and pick up of family members.

Also, during the remaining days of October, let us turn to our Virgin Mother and pray the Rosary as she has requested. Her desire is that we live lives in union with her son Jesus who is God Made Flesh. Let us turn to prayer because it is only through a relationship with God that we will conquer sin and be victorious.

Palm oil is a popular vegetable oil used in candy bars, snack foods, cookies, baked goods, packaged foods, and personal care products. Too often palm oil tree plantations destroy enormous tracts of virgin tropical forests, exploit child labor, grab

land from local communities and devastate critical habitat for elephants, orangutans, and tigers. The burning of tropical forests for palm oil plantations also releases enormous amounts of CO<sub>2</sub> into the atmosphere. Compare labels and try to avoid products with palm oil.
