

BEING DISCIPLES OF JESUS

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

You may recall several months ago that the Archdiocese invited all parishes — including our own—to participate in the Disciple Maker Index (DMI). It was a survey that was designed to help parishes gauge where parishioners are at in their own faith life. In doing so, the DMI might become a starting point for parish planning for the future growth of each faith community.

Here at St. Julie, we had a great response where a good number of parishioners filled out the DMI. We had about 500 individuals fill out the DMI either online or the paper

version. So, I first offer a word of gratitude to those who did participate. The input is very helpful.

At first glance, any one of us might think that 500 individuals is not a huge number given the fact that we are a parish community of about 2,000 households. If we look at it in that way, it would seem that 500 is an extremely small percentage of the parish community. However, if we look at it through the lens of our annual October Count, we see it in a different light.

For those who are unaware, every year during the month of October the Archdiocese requires parishes to take a count of every individual who attends Mass on Sundays. In this count, everyone is included—from the baby in the stroller to every adult in the pews. Here during each of the Sunday Masses in October, we have several of our ushers/ministers of hospitality count the various sections of our church and then add up all the numbers. Our count from last year put us at just over 1,000 individuals at Mass every weekend. So, if we use that figure, 500 people responding to the DMI gave us about a 50% response in terms of the total number of people who attend Sunday Mass here on a regular basis. Most parishes in the Archdiocese did not even reach a 10% response of their October Count to the DMI survey. Again, I offer a huge thanks to all of you who shared your input through the DMI.

The results of the DMI were broken down into various categories:

- 1.Demographics
- 2. Strengths and Opportunities
- 3.Key Leader Perspective
- 4.Key Drivers
- 5. Belief in Core Catholic Teaching
- 6.Effectiveness of Parish Support
- 7.Leadership Indicators
- 8.Sunday Experience
- 9. Spiritual Practices
- 10.Missionary Impulse

I have been studying and reviewing the results of the DMI together with the members of the Parish Staff and the Parish Council. There is an overall desire to follow up the DMI on a local level. The 500 people who filled it out have given us valuable insight but we also want to get input from even more of our parishioners. We are discussing plans as to how we might be able to do that. But, for now, I wanted to begin by sharing some thoughts/insights from the DMI results. I will not be able to go over all of the results from each category in a single article. So this might take a series of articles in order to share everything with you.

In terms of Demographics, I think if any of us take a good look at the crowds on any given Sunday, we might not be surprised by the results of the DMI. From the 500 responses we received, the predominant group identify themselves as Caucasian. The next significant respondents identify themselves as Asian-American. Hispanic/Latino comes in as the third most significant group. The majority clearly identify themselves as Catholic and English speaking.

We also have a large percentage of parishioners who have been members for 20 years or more. That is, of course, not surprising since the parish itself is reaching its 50th year. This indicates that we have a good number of parishioners who have been calling St. Julie their spiritual home almost from the very beginning of our parish's history. They were the pioneers who helped to build this parish community from the time Masses were celebrated at a nearby bank.

Again, this is a significant piece of information regarding our parish community but it also points to a reality that parishioners shared with me from the moment I started. Namely, as vibrant of a faith community as we are, many parishioners have told me that we are an "older parish." In other words, one of the major challenges for us is to find new and perhaps creative ways to be able to connect with younger families both those that are moving in or who may already be in the neighborhood.

Another significant piece of information we see through the DMI in the area of demographics is something any one of us might be able to deduce. We are still very much a working class parish. From the 500 responses to the DMI, 318 individuals indicated that they have school aged children. As we can imagine, that in and of itself creates a major concern for families when it comes to their annual income. We have seen and continue to see a generous spirit among parishioners when it comes to providing for the needs of our spiritual home. We also see great responses when specific needs arise. But we also recognize that a good number of families have limited income. (See page 5 and 6 for specific demographic information)



L it me leave you a much needed challenge before I go on a break in the tropical islands of the Philippines to visit my family and friends. It's been five years since I last saw them. This will be a good chance for me to be reminded that God loved me first through them.

True, Christ-like love is what will fill our hearts and give our lives the meaning we so passionately long for. Like learning to swim, there is no shortcut to learning Christ-like love - you really have to jump into the water and get wet. The Holy Spirit is a great instructor, but it takes the willingness on our part to take the risk of diving in to make any progress.

The first thing we need to do is to tell God that we sincerely want to follow His commandments and love like Him - this is how we love God, by wanting what God wills. Holy Communion is the perfect time to make or renew this commitment. But after deciding to take the risk, we have to make sure there is nothing blocking God's grace inside of us, because without that grace, we cannot make any progress. So the second step to loving like Christ is making frequent use of the sacrament of confession - God's power-washing system. Once we have decided to do our best and made sure that no sins are sapping our supernatural strength, we are ready to get to work. This kind of work is very simple, though not easy. It starts by treating those people closest to us with sincere respect and kind attention. We have to start with those close to us - with our family members, coworkers, teammates and classmates. It is easy to put on the appearance of Christ-like love with people we do not have to deal with regularly. But we aren't interested in appearances; we are interested in the courageous lifestyle of Christian love, the only path to an everlastingly meaningful life. That path means, with God's help, putting God first, others second, and self third.

The St. Julie SVdP Chapter is a dedicated group who seek to


help those in need. If you or someone you know is in need of temporary assistance, we may be able to help. Our group is trained to assess all situations in order to best serve the community.


FIRST RECONCILIATION

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We, the Catholic bishops of Illinois, write with a sense of urgency. Unless the General Assembly acts to renew the Invest in Kids scholarship program, more than 9,000 children currently relying on this program to attend a non-public school may have their educational path disrupted. Without an extension of the program in Illinois law now, no scholarships will be awarded for the school year that will begin in September 2024. Most of these children will have to leave the school their families determined was their best chance to receive a high-quality education in a safe and wholesome learning environment. This is an injustice that should and can be avoided, but only if the General Assembly acts when it reconvenes on October 24, 2023.

Invest in Kids has proven to be a beacon of hope for thousands of Illinois students and their families. Children receiving Invest in Kids scholarships come from lower-income families who could not otherwise afford tuition at the Catholic or another non-public school that is the best fit for their child. Childhood is a limited time in the life of a human being and primary and secondary education is not something that can be put off to some future date when it is convenient for adults. This is our one chance to offer these Illinois children a good start. Please help keep education options available and a brighter future possible by contacting your state senator and state representative and telling them to continue the Invest in Kids Program.

Since its inception six years ago, Invest in Kids has generated overwhelmingly positive results. Nearly 40,000 scholarships have been awarded to students attending non-public schools across Illinois. Demand for scholarships is very high - for every scholarship granted, three students are turned down due to lack of funds. Contrary to what you may have heard, this is not a voucher program, nor does it take state funds away from the public schools. These scholarships are funded through contributions from donors who receive a tax credit for their donation on their Illinois state income tax.

What can you do to help? Please contact your state senator and state representative to let them know of your support for extending the Invest in Kids tax credit scholarship program in Illinois. We also encourage you to urge your fellow parishioners to do the same. Our collective voice is vital to the continued help for Illinois families.
