A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

It is that time of year again when I present to you our annual financial report which you will find in subsequent pages of this weekend's bulletin. The report gives all of us a summary of how the parish ended the fiscal year of July 2022 until June 2023. This weekend, I ask that you look at it. If you have any questions about the report, you can either contact me or Tony Serratore in the office. You can also reach out to Deacon Rich Miska or any one of the Finance Council members whose names are listed in the bulletin.

First, let me start the summary of the report by saying yet again, THANK YOU THANK YOU THANK YOU! It is through your generous support of your spiritual home that we are doing better on the financial level. We all know that the parish is not a business that is out to make a huge profit. The parish is a family of faith that must fulfill its essential mission of PRAYING WELL, TEACHING THE FAITH, and LIVING THE FAITH. I have oftentimes mentioned the task of praying well and teaching the faith. I have recently come to realize that there is a third essential aspect to our mission as a parish which is to live the faith. Again, we know that the parish is not a business, but we also recognize that the parish cannot fulfill its mission without the contribution of all of you our parishioners in every area of time, talent, and treasure. So, I reiterate and express again my sincere gratitude to ALL of you for your constant support toward our mission as a parish.

As you look at this year's report, your eyes might go directly to the "bottom line." As you will notice the bottom line indicates that we ended the last fiscal year with a positive cash flow of almost \$83K. This is good news, but we must not forget the challenges that still lie ahead of us.

As I noted, ending the last fiscal year with a positive cash flow is great news for us. We may remember that before I started at the parish, we had gone through years of financial struggle. As I am now in my fourth year here as pastor, it has been part of my responsibility to lead the parish to a stronger stewardship of our resources. I am extremely grateful to the members of the Finance Council who have advised me so well in that area.

Yes, we are in a better financial situation than we have been before. It is great news to hear that we have a financial cushion. But, if I am going to be fully transparent to all of you as parishioners, I need to make clear that we are by no means "in the clear." In the grand scheme of things, a cushion of almost \$83K is good but it is a very small cushion. I hate to sound like I am "raining on anyone's parade," but even with that small cushion there is a looming concern. Namely, if we are faced with an unexpected major expense, that cushion is going to disappear very quickly. So, we must remain vigilant in our care for this, our spiritual home.

To that effect, I ask that we all remain aware of several needs that we still face as a parish.

- 1. We need everyone to continue to show constant support for the parish. Again, this is not just in the area of sharing our treasure with the parish through our financial giving. Even more important than that is our vocation to go and make disciples. We will make disciples if we focus on the three areas I mentioned praying well, teaching the faith, and living the faith. While it is true that the parish needs financial contributions to continue its mission, making money is not the primary goal of our faith community. Our primary concern must always be to answer the call of Jesus to "Go and make disciples." When we form one another into faithful disciples, everything else will follow. So, this is our first and primary need to live the call to make disciples of all people.
- 2. Even as we live our call to make disciples, we know that we live in a world where it takes a

certain amount of financial resources in order to accomplish this mission. For this reason, we as a parish still need to maintain our financial commitment to the parish. I know how difficult it might be for many of us, but I also need to ask that each of us consider increasing our regular Sunday giving to the parish. We all know that the cost of living keeps rising. So, if it is at all possible, I ask us to pray on this.

- 3. There are several capital projects that we still need to get done as soon as possible. One of the major needs is repairing our parking lot which remains in bad shape. The good news is that the preliminary results of the core sampling indicate that we will not need to dig very deep to repair the majority of the entire parking lot surface. Yet, even with that good news, the cost of repairing the entire parking lot could cost a minimum of \$500K if we were to do it all at once. I would like to start with the north lot but resurfacing the entire lot is a major need that we must address in the next few years.
- 4. The parking lot is not the only major need for which we must be prepared. It might be the most urgent need at the moment, but I do not want us to underestimate anything.
- We need to address the constant leaking in the church roof. We discovered that a major part of the problem is in the caulking of the windows in the arch, which needs to be done at least twice a year. Our maintenance crew can only reach up to a certain height of the windows. But it will require a lift to reach the top of the arch windows. If we can do the sealing twice a year, we are confident that it will resolve the problem but renting a lift two times a year might not come cheap.
- The Devine Center remains a great asset to our parish. We use it primarily for the faith formation of our parents and youth. But we also use it for larger gatherings and events. However, it is one of the original buildings of the parish and it is showing its age. The Devine Center will need a lot of TLC in the next few years. The kitchen renovation will be covered by the remaining funds of To Teach Who Christ Is. But, added to this, we will need to prepare for a complete replacement of the HVAC system among other improvements to the interior.

In summary, we are doing great. But, as the saying goes, there is no rest for the weary. Please accept my gratitude once again and please continue your support of our spiritual home.

CARE FOR CREATION

"Laudate Deum": our Pope's cry for a response to the climate crisis

Pope Francis has recently published an Apostolic Exhortation called *Laudate Deum*, which builds on his 2015 encyclical, *Laudato Si'*, On Care for Our Common Home. He challenges the faithful to take much greater action to effectively address climate change. The Holy Father observes that "the

necessary transition towards clean energy sources such as wind and solar energy, and the abandonment of fossil fuels, is not progressing at the necessary speed" (55). Francis notes the unprecedented speed in which temperatures are rising and warns that many people will be harmed by worsening droughts and increasing incidence of extreme weather events... especially the poor. He counters many of the arguments climate change skeptics use to justify inaction, while criticizing governments for not delivering on their promises to act. Beyond a doubt, human activity is at the root cause of the crisis we are experiencing, and we all have a role in initiating just solutions. Francis reminds us that caring for our common home flows from our Christian faith.

YOUR PARISH SCHOOL CONTINUES TO EXCEL!

Being a twice-awarded National Blue Ribbon School of Academic Excellence has established a high bar, but Cardinal Joseph Bernardin Catholic School (your parish school!) has worked hard to out-do itself yet again!

Among the improvements rolling out this school year are some extensive upgrades that will continue to guarantee our appeal and success for many years to come – even beyond our upcoming 25th anniversary (in 2025).

Over summer while families vacationed and students slept in, CJB was busy implementing \$250,000 in technology and security upgrades, as well as socio-emotional programming for students and staff.

With school safety at the forefront of all parent minds, CJB believed it was time for a complete overhaul of our security system. We replaced cameras and wiring with a completely new digital system, adding cameras both inside and outside of the building. "Parents should not wonder whether their children are safe when they drop them off at school. If this new system will make even one parent feel better about the safety of our school, that makes this upgrade more than worth it", said Principal Jeanne Pagliaro.

After noting the ever-increasing need for student support, especially in the areas of social and emotional development, we implemented two new supports. The first was the hiring of a full-time counselor and remodeling and furnishing a new calming and sensory-based counseling center where students can spend time speaking with the counselor. The second is the schoolwide (PK-8) implementation of the tremendously successful Calm Classroom program, a foundational approach to mindfulness through brief, 1-4 minute "brain breaks".

Finally, a tag-team effort between outgoing Principal Kelly Bourrell and incoming Principal Jeanne Pagliaro, resulted in the securing of a \$140,000 grant for the addition of interactive Promethean panels to all PK-8 classrooms and the network upgrades needed to support them. These boards are essentially interactive flatpanel tablets with whiteboard capabilities that allow teachers to project from any wireless device.
