


COURTYARD CONCERTS AT SAINT GILES!

MIGRANT MINISTRY— TRANSFORMED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT

When the Migrant Ministry team began nearly three years ago and we prepared to resettle our first migrant family, little did we know how much the effort would transform us. Jorge Borrayo's funeral held at Saint Edmund Church on August 5 revealed to us how broad and profound that transformation has been. The 25-year old Guatemalan migrant who volunteered with us at Centro San Edmundo was killed in a car accident. He had received his work permit a few days before and was excited about moving forward to build a life in America.



The bilingual, intercultural, interdenominational service brought together volunteers, migrants, immigrants, various faith centers, and a rural community in Guatemala with a suburb of Chicago. Jorge was raised Catholic, but his best friend, Hector was Evangelical. In Chicago, they found a spiritual home at Grace Episcopal in the Loop, near the

shelter where they were placed on arrival. Hector also attended a Seventh Day Adventist church. The different denominations were present and played a role in the service, with Reverend Amity Carrubba reading the Gospel and sharing a short homily in English. Father Vittorio Bruscella, CMF gave a homily in Spanish.

An image of the patroness of Escuintla, Guatemala, La Inmaculada Concepción, was placed near the altar to connect Saint Edmund with the cultural and spiritual traditions of Jorge's hometown. Bilingual hymns united the voices of the nearly-packed church. The service was videotaped and will be uploaded on YouTube to share with Jorge's family.

Clearly, the transformation that we have experienced in the Migrant Ministry is not the result of our human efforts. It is the Holy Spirit dwelling among us that has brought such diverse communities together in praise, worship, and service.

Pivoting has been our hallmark in the Migrant Ministry. Services in the Saint Edmund school building will end on October 9 and will move to another space. The last day for donations will be Monday, September 15.



2025 MISSIONARY COOPERATION PLAN SECOND COLLECTION THIS WEEKEND

Each summer, parishes host a missionary representative who speaks and seeks contributions in support of their cause. On August 16-17, our parish will welcome Reverend Boniface Agbata who will share information on the Catholic Diocese of Aguleri located in southeastern Nigeria. It covers an area of 8 square kilometers (536 square miles) and was established by Pope Francis on February 12, 2023. The diocese encompasses 26 communities across four Local Government Areas, all within Anambra State, Nigeria. It serves a population of over 1.8 million people, of whom approximately 357,000 are Catholics.

Their Mission Appeal focuses on support for basic education for their children specifically the urgent need to educate women, particularly young girls. A pressing challenge is the prevalence of early marriages among girls; many who are married as young as 12 years old, often to older men. These girls begin to give birth as early as 13, before they are physically and mentally mature enough to care for themselves or their families, often marrying into impoverished households. Child marriage infringes upon the fundamental rights and freedoms of young girls and poses a critical issue that affects their development and well-being.

Their diocese is deeply committed to addressing this situation. They are working hard to build Catholic schools and provide educational sponsorship for these girls. The aim is to establish modest boarding schools to protect and educate them until they reach a more mature age for marriage. However, this endeavor presents significant financial challenges as building schools and hiring teachers are costly. However, educating women ultimately uplifts the entire society; by preparing these girls for a better future, and contributing to building a more livable community.

The cost to keep a girl in school for one year, including basic needs, is approximately \$500. Their goal is to support 600 girls from the "peripheries" of their diocese and raise about \$300,000.

Our support will enhance the quality of life in their society and strengthen the work of evangelization in their young Diocese. A second collection will be taken this weekend. Your generosity is appreciated.

Calculate your carbon footprint.

Popes Francis, Benedict XVI and John Paul II have all spoken of the need to address climate change. It's influenced by the amount of heat trapping CO2 and other greenhouse gases (GHGs) in the atmosphere. Small atmospheric GHG % increases can have a significant impact on Earth's temperature rise. Every day, across everything we do and buy, we contribute to GHG emissions. Calculators can help us better understand how much carbon is produced by different activities. Then, if you decide to reduce your emissions, you'll know where you can generate the biggest impact. Start with this easy to use calculator: https://www3.epa.gov/carbon-footprint-calculator/

(This EPA calculator does not include air travel, which often is a major contributor to household emissions, but can still help you ID great savings opportunities).
