FATHER CARL'S CORNER

Brothers and sisters in faith, our country is living through a difficult

season. Political divisions run deep. Too often, as we have recently seen very publicly, the anger that comes with disagreement spills over into hostility and violence that leads to death. As Christians, we must be clear: political violence is a sin. It denies the dignity of the person, it destroys the peace we are called to build, and it betrays the gospel of Jesus, who told us, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God."

It is not wrong to disagree about political issues. In fact, thoughtful respectful debate can be a healthy part of democracy. However, when our differences turn to hatred - when we begin to see one another as an enemy to be destroyed rather than a fellow human being made in God's image – we have lost sight of Christ's way.

Each time we make the sign of the cross at the beginning and end of our prayers, the cross reminds us that violence is never the answer. Jesus did not respond to betrayal, false accusation, or injustice with violence. He chose love, forgiveness, and truth. That same choice is being asked of us today.

What can we do personally?
One simple but powerful step is this: examine our words.
Before speaking, posting or sharing, ask: Does this build up or tear down? Does this reflect love, or does it sow division?
Choosing restraint, respect, and kindness in our speech is a way of disarming the cycle of anger. It might seem small, but

these small acts of peace ripple outward. If enough of us commit to responding with dignity, respect, and prayer instead of hostility, then we become a leaven of hope in a divided nation. Let us pray for peace in our country, for healing across divides, and for the courage to witness to the gospel of love even when it is hard.

I invite us all to take this prayer and place it where we will see it, and pray it each day. We need peace and civility in our nation.

A Prayer for Peace in Our Nation

Lord Jesus, You are the Pince of Peace.

You teach us to love our enemies and pray for those who oppose us.

Heal the divisions in our country.

Forgive us when our anger turns to hatred and when words and actions cause harm.

Give us courage to choose peace over violence, truth over distortion and love over fear.

Make us instruments of your peace, in our families, in our parish, and in our nation.

We commit ourselves today to speak with respect, to act with kindness, and to work for the dignity of every person.

Mary, Queen of Peace, pray for us.

Amen

Let us pray for all who have lost their lives to political violence. May they be resting now in true peace, God's peace.

Have a safe and good week ahead.

In school this week...

Middle School Science Gets Messy with Oobleck!

This week, our middle school scientists rolled up their sleeves for a hands-on experiment with oobleck — a strange, slimy substance made from cornstarch and water. Named after the Dr. Seuss story, oobleck is a non-Newtonian fluid, which means it sometimes acts like a liquid and sometimes like a solid, depending on how you touch it. Students tested its unique properties, asked "what if" questions, and made predictions as they explored the science of states of matter. It was a messy, laughter-filled day in the lab, and a perfect example of how curiosity leads to discovery!



SPIRITUAL CLASSICS FOR OCTOBER: SAINT FRANCIS DE SALES AND HIS WAY OF DIVINE LOVE

Come to the next Spiritual Classics gathering on Tuesday, October 7 at 7:00 PM in the Ascension Parish Center Dining Room, where we will discuss Saint Francis de Sales' inspirational classic, An Introduction to the Devout Life. Jeff Wood will lead the discussion. All Oak Park parishes are welcome.

An Introduction to the Devout Life, written over four hundred years ago, inspires and guides Catholics in pursuing a holy life. De Sales thought that the holy life was accessible to all people at all ages and in all times. He uses clear, simple language and provides vivid references to images in nature and daily life. At the heart of his message is the conviction that God has made us for himself and that Jesus offers himself in prayer and sacrament as we grow closer to God.

Saint Francis de Sales was born into a noble French family, studied law and theology, and decided against his father's wishes to become a priest. He became the Bishop of Geneva, Switzerland during a time of battles between Protestants and Catholics, yet he achieved a universal reputation for patience and gentleness. He developed a sign language in order to preach to the deaf and he is the patron saint of the deaf.

THROUGH 8TH GRADE

Children who are in 4th Grade through 8th Grade and have not yet received their First Communion are welcome to join with their peers to prepare for celebrating the sacraments of Reconciliation and First Communion during the Fall.

MIGRANT MINISTRY UPDATE HOPE SOMETIMES HARD TO FIND



While not officially a part of the Migrant Ministry program many of our parishioners attend the Friday morning 7:15 AM Prayer Vigil at the Broadview Processing Center,

1930 Beach Street. Migrants continue to be detained there usually sleeping on the floor with little access to bathrooms. Recently this time and location has become a focus for protestors because that is the time migrants are bused to the airport for deportation.

On a recent Friday morning, the road was blocked, windows boarded up, a full contingent of media was there and many protestors, mostly young - but some of retired age and even one family with three small children. The crowd was noisy but guiet as we held the prayer service, except when ICE officers arrived or departed. The noisiest time was when a full contingent of about 20 National Guardsmen marched out in full battle gear including weapons.

And yet this week at Centro San Edmundo, we continue to provide clothing, breakfast, toiletries, and help with immigration forms. The migrants are always so grateful. One of our resettled men came this week to apply for a work permit. He is a very young man with a young family who is trying to help several friends with young children. We are proud of him and of our housing program which supports him.

Pivoting has been our hallmark in the Migrant Ministry. Services in the Saint Edmund school building will end on October 9, and we hope to move to another space. Until further notice, we will pause donations on Monday, September 15. Immigration has moved across the street to Murphy Hall, and we are still seeking a location for the "free stores."

Electric Vehicles: A Creation Care Benefit or Harm?

Transportation emissions in the United States are a huge source of both air pollution and carbon emissions. Any car, whether it has an internal combustion engine (ICE) or whether it's fully electric (EV) also has a heavy carbon footprint related to its manufacture. The longer you can keep from buying a new car and make use of the old one, the better. Reducing the number of cars your family uses is better yet. As such, purchasing an EV will not solve climate change, but it could help significantly.

When it's time to acquire a new vehicle, drivers minimize their footprint by purchasing the most fuel-efficient vehicle in the class of vehicle they really need. EVs have a heavier carbon footprint in manufacture than an ICE vehicle. But after 2 years of average driving (about 25,000 miles) that higher carbon manufacturing disadvantage goes away, and the EV becomes a "cleaner" option in "cradle-to-grave" and "well-to-wheel" carbon emissions. According to the US Dept. of Energy, electric vehicles today produce 46% fewer GHGs than comparable gasoline powered vehicles on a life cycle basis.


