FATHER CARL'S CORNER

I feel it and hear it spoken all around me these days.

There is so much bitterness and hardening of hearts in our country today. How do we not give up on hope? Read Luke 8:4-15. Jesus tells the story of the Sower who scatters seed. Some fall on the path, some on rocky ground, some among thorns and some among the good soil.

Jesus speaks about the word of God as a seed that is sown but does not produce fruit in everyone. Many obstacles prevent the seed from taking root and growing. For many of us in our violent and divided country, it can feel as if the soil has grown hard. Words of anger, fear and suspicion seem to take root more easily than words of peace, forgiveness and respect for each other. This is how God's word is being choked out by the thorns of hatred, greed and violence.

However, this story that I encourage you to look up and pray over is also a story of hope. Even in difficult times, the Sower never stops scattering seeds. God never stops sowing His word of life into our hearts, and through us, into our communities and the world.

Our task these days is to ask ourselves, what kind of

soil am I? Am I allowing God's word to be planted deep enough within me to bear the fruits of compassion, careful listening, reconciliation, justice and peace?

Read this passage, and let it encourage you not to give up, not to let fear or bitterness harden your heart and lose hope for ourselves, for our country, and for the world. As we walk into the week ahead, with all the uncertainties and challenges that we face, remember who we are called to be, the "good soil" where God's word can grow strong and our lives can produce the harvest the world needs the most - love that builds bridges, mercy that heals wounds, respect that encourages dialogue, and HOPE that refuses to die.

May sharing in prayer and in the Eucharist each week help us to persevere in bearing good fruit and offering hope to those around us and the world.



PLANNED GIVING

Please Consider a QCD gift for Our Parish

You can make a gift from your individual retirement plan (IRA) that benefits you and our parish. A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) allows individuals age $70\frac{1}{2}$ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free.

There are three main benefits of giving with a QCD:

- If you are 73 years old or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.
- The amount transferred directly to charity does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.
- Your gift will be immediately used, allowing you to see the impact of your gift now.

SPIRITUAL CLASSICS FOR OCTOBER: SAINT FRANCIS DE SALES AND HIS WAY OF DIVINE LOVE

Come to the next Spiritual Classics gathering on Tuesday, October 7 at 7:00 PM in the Ascension Parish Center Dining Room, where we will discuss Saint Francis de Sales' inspirational classic, An Introduction to the Devout Life. Jeff Wood will lead the discussion. All Oak Park parishes are welcome.

An Introduction to the Devout Life, written over four hundred years ago, inspires and guides Catholics in pursuing a holy life. De Sales thought that the holy life was accessible to all people at all ages and in all times. He uses clear, simple language and provides vivid references to images in nature and daily life. At the heart of his message is the conviction that God has made us for himself and that Jesus offers himself in prayer and sacrament as we grow closer to God.

Saint Francis de Sales was born into a noble French family, studied law and theology, and decided against his father's wishes to become a priest. He became the Bishop of Geneva, Switzerland during a time of battles between Protestants and Catholics, yet he achieved a universal reputation for patience and gentleness. He developed a sign language in order to preach to the deaf and he is the patron saint of the deaf.



OCIA COMPANION SPONSOR

A Companion Sponsor for OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation for Adults) is a parishioner who would like to accompany

a person who is preparing to receive the sacraments. While the individual will have a formal sponsor who they choose, a Companion Sponsor plays a vital role in helping the person understand what it means to live as a Catholic and assist in integrating the individual into the life of the Catholic community.

A Companion Sponsor is expected to connect with the person one or two times each month. Activities may include (but aren't limited to) the following:

- Attend Mass together
- Share a meal
- Go to speakers or other events in the Oak Park Catholic parishes
- Go to a Catholic baptism, funeral, or wedding
- Take a walk
- Talk about faith
- Participate in volunteer service

Companion Sponsors will receive training prior to being paired with an individual and will continue to be supported while they work with a person.

The Season of Creation is a month-long prayerful observance that calls upon Catholics to pray and care for God's Creation. It starts September 1st and ends October 4th. It's a time of reflection on our relationship with the environment, how we live, and how our lifestyles impact the natural world, humans and other creatures inhabiting it. This is a time of restoration and of hope, but also a time for action. It's a time we can take to educate ourselves on new ways of living with Creation that better care for both people and the planet. It's a time to craft plans and implement those changes.

What changes will you make as an individual to contribute to a more just and sustainable future? Have you considered joining your parish Creation Care Team, or starting one? The Catholic Climate Covenant has great resources to get one started. Consider reading the encyclical Laudato Si', a great source of inspiration and motivation.

As Pope Francis said, "this is the season for letting our prayer be inspired anew," a season "to reflect on our lifestyles," and a season "for undertaking prophetic actions . . . calling for courageous decisions . . . directing the planet towards life, not death."

MIGRANT MINISTRY UPDATE: **BIDDING ADIOS TO THE** SAINT EDMUND SCHOOL BUILDING



As Father Carl shared earlier, the decision has been made to close the Saint Edmund School building due to the enormous cost of repairing and maintaining the beloved, but very old, structure. The last day the "free stores" and social services will be available for the migrants in the building will be Thursday, October 9. Immigration Support Services has moved to Murphy Hall and that will continue.

Thank goodness (the Holy Spirit!), we have been offered ample space in another Oak Park church. YAY!!! We will share more of this good news as the details are being worked out.

But we will miss Centro San Edmundo and recognize the impact our time there has had not only on the migrants, but also the volunteers and the surrounding community. In the almost 22 months that we have been open, over 20,000 migrants have been served. They left with bundles containing bedding, clothes, shoes, boots, winter coats, and toiletries. The children played happily in their special room. Migrants were fed a warm breakfast and were able to access immigration support, social services, and English lessons. BUT MOST IMPORTANTLY THEY FELT WELCOME, HONORED, AND SAFE. Their countries' flags hung from the ceiling. The walls were lined with BIENVENIDOS! signs drawn by Saint Giles school children. Many volunteers spoke fluent Spanish; others made an honest effort to learn key phrases.

The school building was CHURCH. It housed a ministry that WELCOMED THE STRANGER, FED THE HUNGRY, AND CLOTHED THE NAKED. Thank you, Saint Edmund School building, for 108 years of FAITH IN ACTION. Over the next few weeks, we will share more reflections on the impact of Centro San Edmundo.


