

WHILE FATHER CARL IS ON VACATION . . .

From the Desk of Operations Director, Matt Brophy:

When I started working at the parish in January 2021, Father Carl wondered if I would have enough work to keep me busy. The first project was a broken water main to the Gleeson building that occurred over the Christmas holiday. The rest has been history!

As Operations Director my focus is on four components of parish ministry:

- Financial Management
- School Support
- Building Management
- HR Management

Today I would like to highlight one major component of my work with the two campuses, namely building management. The parish has a well-functioning Facilities Committee comprised of members of both the Saint Catherine of Siena-Saint Lucy and the Saint Giles communities. The committee meets a minimum of 6 times per year to review repairs, renovations, capital projects and other needs of each campus. A member of the committee maintains a detailed spreadsheet of work that has been completed on each campus as well as work that needs to be done. All projects and repairs are prioritized as High, Medium, or Low.

At the SCSL campus major boiler and heating repairs have been completed on the main boilers that heat the school, the former convent and the church facilities. The rectory boiler was replaced, the main parking lot was resurfaced, major plumbing repairs were completed in both SisterHouse (the former convent) and the former rectory, and the 4th floor of the school was painted for a multipurpose room to be used as a worship space along with other needs of the school. Housing Forward now leases the entire former rectory with The Neighborhood Bridge. A grant awarded to Housing Forward funded the installation of new central AC and will also fund a new roof to replace the 1964 roof on the former rectory. Faith and Fellowship continues to meet in the building celebrating the legacy of Connie Rakitan.

At the Saint Giles campus some of the repairs have included reroofing the bell tower, replacing exterior sidewalks and/or steps where there were safety or fall risks, and replacement of 12 windows on the rectory and 28 windows on the first floor of the Dore Parish Center. New rooftop AC units were installed for the Church as well as a new unit installed for McDonough Hall after ice fell from the roof and destroyed the original unit. Additional work was completed in the Gleeson building to add central AC to the preschool rooms and enhanced fire safety equipment before the two-year-old preschool opened.

As Operations Director I strive to be a good steward for the financial resources of the parish. Under the guidance of Father Carl, the Finance Committee and the Facilities Committee, I have been able to maintain and make improvements at both campus sites. On behalf of the entire faith community thank you for your generous support of our parish.

CREEDS EXPLAINED

Most Catholics can recite at least portions of the Nicene and Apostles Creed by heart — but though these are perhaps the best-known two creeds of modern times, Church tradition has yielded many more.

A creed (from the Latin "credo," meaning "I believe) is a summary of the most important articles of faith agreed upon by a group of people who hold them as truth. Tradition attributes authorship of the Apostles' Creed to Christ's 12 Apostles. The Nicene Creed originated at the first worldwide ecumenical council in Nicaea in 325 AD. The Athanasian Creed is another famous statement of belief approved by the Church, this one focusing particularly on the matter of the Holy Trinity.

All approved creeds fulfill Christ's Great Commission to "make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19) and the need for Christians to "always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who calls you to account for the hope that is in you" (1 Peter 3:15).

Domestic violence occurs everyday, in every neighborhood around the world.



Start the conversation to end domestic violence.

Please talk about it.

Victims are suffering because of our silence. It could be your sibling, your co-worker, your neighbor.

Your voice may give a victim the courage to seek help.

How can we shift our culture away from blaming the victim and instead hold the offender accountable?

Don't excuse the behavior.

Challenge the myths: "Survivors can

just leave"; "Only certain people are victims"; "Only physical harm counts"; "Domestic violence is a private, family matter".

Question how the media portrays unhealthy relationships. Does the story sensationalize trauma or promote awareness that patterns of domestic violence are a public health crisis?

The causes of domestic violence take conscious action. When children do not receive education about healthy relationships, violence becomes normalized.



MIGRANT MINISTRY UPDATE: VOLUNTEERS ARE SANCTUARY BRICKS

Last Thursday, October 9, was our last Migrant Ministry Services day in Centro San Edmundo, the former Saint Edmund School building, and a lease agreement with the



new site has not been worked out yet. The Migrant Ministry has been pivoting and adapting to a changing reality since it began in June 2023 by offering showers in the former rectory at the Saint Catherine-Saint Lucy Campus to the migrants sleeping at the Austin Police Station. Our pivot now is

crucial—more than just the "free stores", how do we meet the needs of the migrants too afraid and traumatized to leave their homes? Afraid to send their children to school? Their dreams of a safe and secure life in the United States at risk of being shattered?

The free stores are paused, but our incredible volunteers are not stopping. Immigration Support Services and ESL will continue temporarily in Murphy Hall. Mentors continue to accompany the 24 families we have resettled. A training is scheduled for volunteers to learn how to accompany and support migrants attending immigration-related hearings. We have filled requests for specific clothing items from local residents for migrant families they know. Our commitment remains strong.

Padre Vittorio Bruscella, CMF, chaplain for the Migrant Ministry, recently reflected that "the word 'Sanctuary' no longer means a place made of bricks." The volunteers are "a shield and refuge for our migrant brothers and sisters" and "a sign of humanity in the midst of so much violence and cruelty." With their average age in the mid-70s, the over 500 women and men who have volunteered over the past 2½ years are indeed a living, adapting, boots-on-the-ground SANCTUARY. **iMIL GRACIAS!**
