GOSPEL

Luke 2:22-40 or 2:22-32

When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph took Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of

the Lord, Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord, and to offer the sacrifice of a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons, in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord. Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Christ of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, he took him into his arms and blessed God, saying: "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel." The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted -and you yourself a sword will pierce-so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed." There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived seven years with her husband after her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer. And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem. When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.

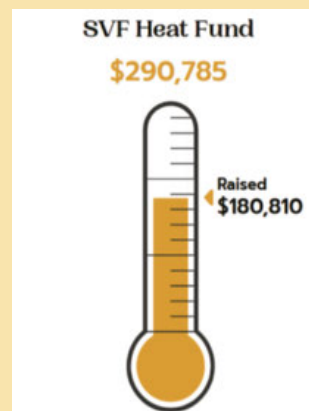

The Benefits of Being a Registered Parishioner at St. Vincent Ferrer....

What does registration as an “official” member of St. Vincent Ferrer Church mean?

It means that you take your faith seriously or want to.

It means that you take seriously your obligations (and rights) to the parish.

It means that you want to identify with the Church in a particular way.

It means that the parish has a “more than usual” obligation to serve you, whether it be when you’re sick, in financial distress, if a loved one dies, if you’re seeking baptism for a newly-born infant, if you want to get married in the parish.

It means that one Mass is celebrated for you and all parishioners at St Vincent Ferrer Church every week.

It means you are entitled to parishioner rates when it comes to school tuition, etc.

It means that you are a “practicing Catholic” known to your parish and as such, assuming you are married in the Church, may request a letter from the Pastor attesting to your suitability to be a godparent for Baptism or a sponsor for Confirmation.

It means that the clergy and parishioners should strive to support you spiritually and otherwise and that you, too, must support the parish through your participation and offerings.

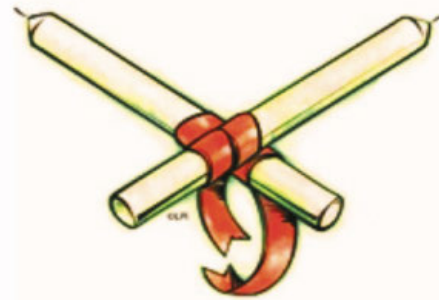
It means that if your children attend public school or are home-schooled, you may enroll them in our religious education program for preparation for 1st Holy Communion and Confirmation.

You are not a registered parishioner if you are an adult who once went to grade school here or used to attend Mass here years ago.

You are not a registered parishioner if your family are long-time parishioners but you, as an adult, have never registered.

Parish registration costs nothing.

Interested parties can register as members of St. Vincent Ferrer in our parish office at 1530 Jackson, River Forest, during the office open hours. Remember: Registration prevents anyone in the parish office from ever saying, “We don’t know you.”

Dear Friends in Christ,

On Christmas Eve, our Holy Father opened the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica inaugurating the 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope. Indeed, Christ is our Hope and in Him we place our personal hopes for the year ahead. Yet amid this call to hope, many of our brothers and sisters on the margins are experiencing great fear and anxiety. I am thinking in particular of our immigrant communities.

Much has been said of what might happen to some of our neighbors beginning in the coming weeks and months. As people of hope, it is important that we do what is right and necessary to instill confidence in those who are afraid, letting them know that the Church is with them.

As the Body of Christ, we serve those in need, respecting and promoting the inherent dignity of every person who arrives on our doorstep. At the same time, parishes, schools and entities of the Archdiocese of Chicago must adhere to federal, state and local laws and regulations.

The Archdiocese of Chicago is working with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, Catholic Charities, state and local governments and other groups to coordinate our activities of support in Cook and Lake Counties. Please find a collection of resources on our website at <https://www.archchicago.org/news-and-events/immigrant-assistance-resources>.

As we are called to do, we will prioritize bringing Christ into this time of fear and uncertainty. By asking, "What is God telling us in this moment?" we help families see that God is with them, even in their fears. This approach—rooted in prayer, solidarity, and tangible action—demonstrates that the Catholic Church, through its unique resources and faith, offers a beacon of hope. Together, we bring love, accompaniment, and the reassurance that no one is alone.

Speaking this year to the ambassadors accredited to the Holy See, the Holy Father observed that migration governance needs to balance regulation with human rights and dignity. "We are quick to forget that we are dealing with people with faces and names." Pope Francis has also been clear that "the principle of safe and voluntary repatriation of those who are forced to flee must be strictly adhered to. No one should be repatriated to a country where they could face severe human rights violations or even death."

Let us continue to work together in this spirit, and be faith-filled instruments of mercy honoring the human dignity of all persons.
