

Fr. Stan's Utterances



The coming of the Kingdom of God will bring a time of judgement when Jesus comes with glory with the legions of angels from Heaven, and while Jesus' words in today's gospel seem harsh and not the Jesus we want to hear this way, His words are spoken and are true whether we like His tone or not. Remember, God is God and we are not. Jesus is strongly urging us to seriously consider our choices Jesus proclaims: "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing." There's a vibrant urgency to these words that must have been apparent in his voice. What does he mean? Why is he so passionate about this? In the ancient Jewish world, fire was generally associated with judgment. So what kind of judgment does Jesus bring? He brings the judgment of the Cross. He brings the judgment that God so loved the world that He gave His only Son for us.

He brings the judgment that brought St. Paul to exclaim that "He loved me and He gave Himself for me. So when we really look at the crucifix, we see the judgment of God. We see the horror of sin, and the infinitely greater love of God who came to die to set us free from sin and unite us to Himself.

When Jesus states that He wants to set the world on fire, Jesus really means it, but not a physical fire of destruction, but with the fire of God Himself! The fire of God's love given to us freely by the power of the Holy Spirit. We all have been baptized and confirmed in this fire in Holy Baptism and Confirmation. Recall the words of John the Baptist, "*I baptize you in water for repentance, but the one who is to follow me is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to carry His sandals; He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire (Matthew 3:11).*"

The fire is here now and always as God is fully present in His Church and in all of the seven living sacraments of God! Are we igniting the lives of others with our fire for God!? "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done," as we pray in the Our Father Prayer. Is our fire spreading into other people like wildfires spread in forest fires? This is the fire that Jesus is speaking about and in our very own time. This fire is needed more than ever when we hear and read statistics how less and less families, children and adults, of all ages, are not coming to Sunday Mass. Many have become too comfortably a part of the movement of our modern secular culture, and this comfort has resulted in a dangerous complacency toward the life giving words of Jesus. Too often, we hear Jesus' words, but not allow them to penetrate our hearts, transform our lives, and set the world on fire. There is something ultimately attractive, powerful and free when we become all that God created us to be. It is this striving that we need to rediscover again with zeal as intentional disciples of Jesus. I leave you with the words of St. Cyril of Alexandria (who lived in the 4th and 5th century) as he stated in his homily: "*We affirm that the fire Christ sent out is for humanity's salvation and profit. May God grant that all our hearts be full of this! The fire is the saving message of the gospel and the power of its commandments. The gospel ignites all of us on earth to live a life of piety and makes us fervent in spirit, according to the expression of blessed Paul. Besides this, we are also made partakers of the Holy Spirit, who is like fire within us. We have been baptized with fire and the Holy Spirit. This fire is the fire of the gospel that comes to us by the Holy Spirit in holy baptism and confirmation.*"

Jesus calls us to change the world, to set it on fire with His love. Each person can share in this love, no matter how small the action seems to be today since there is no such thing as a small action in the eyes of God. There's an everyday martyrdom to which we're all called to. It means smiling at someone when we feel lousy at times. It means a kind word when we feel angry or upset when somebody is mean to us. It means, refusing to give in to bitterness or hatred of our society and showing and living in kindness and making a spiritual difference because we do not know what the other person is going through in their own lives. Those little acts of witness to Christ's love, of martyrdom, help to set the world on fire with His love.

May God continue to bless all of us. Our Lady, Undoer of Knots, pray for us! St. Daniel the Prophet, pray for us! Have a great week and enjoy life with a great smile! Pray always!



Registration for Religious Education Classes for 2025-26 is now in progress for children in Kindergarten through Eighth Grade. Consistent class attendance is necessary for the proper education and the formation of your child.

Registration forms can be picked up and dropped off at the rectory. You may also go to the school on the following Tuesdays to register your child/children: August 19, 26, and September 2nd from 6 to 8 PM.

Sacramental Preparation: Students customarily prepare for and celebrate First Reconciliation and First Communion in the Second Grade. Older students prepare to celebrate these Sacraments in a separate program. First Communion and Reconciliation require two consecutive years of preparation. Our Confirmation preparation program is a Two-Year Program starting in the seventh grade. Candidates celebrate Confirmation in eighth grade. All classes will be held on Tuesday evenings from 6:30 - 8:00 PM.

Classes Begin September 13th!




The Respond Program has been Saint Daniel the Prophet's **religious education program for students with intellectual and developmental disabilities** for over thirty years. Through the Respond Program, a generation of students with special needs has been successfully prepared to receive the sacraments of Communion and Confirmation in classes that are adapted to meet their needs and provide a nurturing and accessible learning environment.

Classes will begin in September and will be held on Saturday mornings from 9:30 - 11 AM on a biweekly basis. Students can enroll beginning at age 6 through their late teens, to learn about their Catholic faith and receive sacramental preparation.

The Respond program is a tuition free ministry, which has been supported by donations and fundraising for over thirty years! All materials, including textbooks, are provided.


Meet The Rest Of Our New Faculty Members


