#### Dear parishioners,

This Sunday, February 11<sup>th</sup>, is World Day of the Sick, an observation started by Pope Saint John Paul II as a way for believers to offer prayers for those suffering from illnesses. People around the world take the time to pray for the sick and for those who work very hard to alleviate the sufferings of the sick on this day. The day coincides with the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes. On February 11<sup>th</sup>, 1858, a young lady appeared to a sickly child of poor parents by the name of Bernadette Soubirous. This began a series of visions. During the apparition on March 25th, the lady identified herself with the words: "I am the Immaculate Conception." Bernadette gave a testimony that she saw a pretty, young girl with a rosary over her arm. Her white robe was encircled by a blue girdle. She wore a white veil. There was a yellow rose on each foot. A rosary was in her hand.

Through that humble girl, Mary revitalized the faith of millions of people. People began to flock to Lourdes from other parts of France and from all over the world. Lourdes has become a place of pilgrimage and healing, but even more of faith. Church authorities have recognized over 69 miraculous cures as scientifically inexplicable. It is a continuation of Jesus' healing miracles, now performed at the intercession of his Blessed Mother. Many who visit Lourdes return home with renewed faith and a readiness to serve God in their needy brothers and sisters.



The Season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14<sup>th</sup>. On Ash Wednesday ashes are placed on everyone's forehead in the form of a cross which is an act of penance and a sign of repentance meant to help us develop a spirit of humility and sacrifice. Lent is the season of fasting, prayer, and penance. During this six-week holy time, we prepare to celebrate the Paschal Mystery - the passion, death, and resurrection of our Lord, and to renew our Baptism Promises at Easter. Our promise is to renounce sin and to profess our faith in God and to examine our lives in the light of the teachings of the Lord.

Stations of the Cross. The practice of walking the Way of the Cross with Jesus dates to the times when people could no longer make pilgrimages to the Holy Land and retrace the actual steps or "stations" which led the Lord to Calvary and the Cross. St. Francis of Assisi is credited with popularizing this devotion in its present form with fourteen stations. The faithful mediate on the suffering and passion of the Lord, seeking to share in a small but meaningful way in the sufferings of the Lord. We will be praying the Stations of the Cross every Friday during Lent at 6:00 pm in English and 7:00 pm in Polish beginning Friday, February 16<sup>th</sup>.

#### Lenten Fast and Abstinence laws:

Everyone 14 years of age or older is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, and all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Everyone 18 or older, and under 59 years of age, is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

## Informacje parafialne





Dzisiaj obchodzimy Światowy Dzień Chorego, który został ustanowiony przez papieża św. Jana Pawła II w dniu 13 maja 1992 roku. Celem tego dnia jest objęcie modlitwą wszystkich cierpiących, zarówno duchowo jak i fizycznie, zwrócenie uwagi świata na ich potrzeby oraz dostrzeżenie tych, którzy zawodowo, bądź z potrzeby serca, towarzyszą chorym i cierpiącym.

11 lutego Kościół wspomina Matkę Bożą z Lourdes, patronkę chorych. Tego dnia w 1858 roku Matka Boża ukazała się czternastoletniej ubogiej pasterce, Bernadecie Soubirous. Przedstawiła się dziewczynce, jako Niepokalane Poczęcie. Podczas osiemnastu objawień Maryja wzywała ludzi do modlitwy i pokuty. Lourdes stało się jednym z największych i najważniejszych Sanktuariów Maryjnych na świecie. Każdego roku przybywa tam kilka milionów pielgrzymów, aby prosić Maryję o uzdrowienie duszy i ciała.



Już za kilka dni, 14 lutego, Środą Popielcową rozpoczniemy Wielki Post. W Wielkim Poście przygotowujemy się do przeżywania tajemnicy Zmartwychwstania Pańskiego. Jest to czas wyciszenia, wewnętrznej przemiany i nawrócenia. Post wiąże się z dobrowolną rezygnacją z tego, co lubimy ponad miarę. Walczymy w tym czasie ze złymi i grzesznymi przyzwyczajeniami. Wszystkie wyrzeczenia powinniśmy ofiarować Panu Bogu w określonej intencji.

W Środą Popielcową kapłan na znak pokuty i żałoby posypując głowę popiołem wypowiada słowa: "Z prochu powstałeś i w proch się obrócisz", bądź "Nawracajcie się i wierzcie w Ewangelię." To nie tylko wezwanie do refleksji nad sobą, do uświadomienia sobie własnej słabości, kruchości życia i nieuniknionej konieczności śmierci, ale przede wszystkim zachęta do ciągłego doskonalenia się i do nawrócenia. Niech Wielki Post będzie dla nas czasem wytężonej pracy nad sobą i żarliwej modlitwy, odnowy naszych serc i otwarcia się na Bożą łaskę. Módlmy się gorąco dla nas o nawrócenie, a dla świata o miłość i pokój.

Msza św. w języku polskim w Środę Popielcową, 14 lutego, będzie odprawiona o godzinie 7:00 wieczorem. W Środę Popielcową, zgodnie z kanonami 1251-1252 Kodeksu Prawa Kanonicznego, obowiązuje wstrzemięźliwość od pokarmów mięsnych i post ścisły (trzy posiłki w ciągu dnia, w tym tylko jeden do syta). Prawem o wstrzemięźliwości są związani wszyscy powyżej 14 roku życia, a prawem o poście - osoby pełnoletnie do rozpoczęcia 60 roku życia.

Nabożeństwo Drogi Krzyżowej w języku polskim w naszej parafii odprawiane będzie w każdy piątek Wielkiego Postu o godz. 7:00 wieczorem, a Gorzkie żale śpiewane będą w każdą niedzielę na 15 minut przed polską mszą świętą.



Prosimy o złożenie ofiary na rzecz Dorocznej Kwesty Katolickiej 2024 - "Przy wspólnym stole" Jako chrześcijanie, jesteśmy wezwani do hojnego dzielenia się naszym czasem, talentem i zasobami. 
