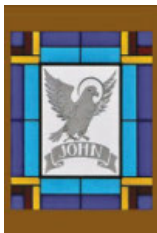

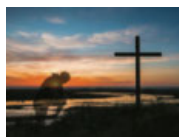

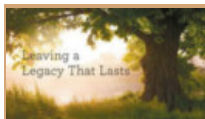

Reverend Timothy is a priest of the Order of Saint Paul the First Hermit, also known as Pauline Fathers and Brothers. He was born in Poland and immigrated with his family to the United States at the age of 12. He grew up in Stamford, Connecticut, and joined the Paulines by starting his postulancy after graduating high school in 2008.

Father Tarnacki attended the Pauline Seminary and the Pontifical University of Saint John Paul II in Krakow, Poland. He graduated with a Master's Degree in Theology, specializing in Biblical Exegesis. He made his final religious vows in 2015 at the Marian Shrine in Czestochowa, Poland and was ordained to the priesthood in 2016 at the National Shrine of Our Lady of Czestochowa in Doylestown (Bucks County).

Following ordination, Father Tarnacki began ministering at the Shrine. Since that time, he has been particularly involved with the Shrine's youth and young adult ministry, being the co-founder of Czestochowa Young Adults (CYA) Group. He has also served in various capacities including Shrine media coordinator; chaplain and theology teacher for the Shrine's homeschooling community; coordinator of lector and altar servers' groups; and more.

Father Tarnacki also serves as Vocation Director for the American Province of his religious community and a member of the Pastoral Council of the Order. He previously served as a chaplain at Holy Family University in Philadelphia.

Father Tarnacki is a doctoral candidate at the Catholic University of America in Washington D.C., working on the Doctor of Ministry Degree, specializing in evangelization.

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Let me offer a word of big congratulations to our 60 young people who were confirmed on Saturday February 24<sup>th</sup>. It was a great joy to welcome Bishop Jeffrey Grob who presided at the Confirmation Mass and made it a day to remember. Let us pray that the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit that the Confirmandi have received will continue to grow stronger in their lives and that they have the be good examples to those around them. May the Holy Spirit continue to guide them throughout their lives. May the Spirit of wisdom and understanding enlighten their minds. ## Informacje parafialne



Dzisiejszej niedzieli, do naszego kościoła, franciszkanin ojciec Dariusz Gaczyński uroczystie wprowadził relikwie błogosławionych ojców Michała Tomaszka i Zbigniewa Strzałkowskiego. To ogromne wydarzenia dla całej naszej parafii. Relikwie zostały sprowadzone do naszej wspólnoty dla publicznego kultu wiernych i pogłębienia wiary, aby za ich orędownictwem wypraszać potrzebne łaski u Boga dla nas samych, naszej parafii i dla całego świata.

Michał Tomaszek i Zbigniew Strzałkowski to polscy duchowni franciszkanie konwentualni, misjonarze i męczennicy, którzy pod koniec lat 80-tych zeszłego wieku wyjechali do Pariacoto w Peru, gdzie oddali się w pełni służbie Bogu i ludziom. 9 sierpnia 1991 roku ponieśli śmierć głosząc Dobrą Nowinę o Bogu. Zostali zamordowani przez terrorystów z organizacji “Świetlisty Szlak”. W pięć lat po ich śmierci rozpoczął się na szczeblu diecezjalnym w Peru proces beatyfikacyjny. 3 lutego 2015 roku papież Franciszek promulgował dekret o męczeństwie o. Michała Tomaszka i o. Zbigniewa Strzałkowskiego. Odtąd przysługiwał im tytuł Czcigodnego Sługi Bożego. 13 lutego 2015 roku podczas spotkania franciszkanów z peruwiańskiej delegatury zdecydowano, aby 5 grudnia 2015 roku w Chimbote w Peru odbyła się beatyfikacja ojca Michała i Zbigniewa. Odtąd przysługuje im tytuł błogosławionych. Spoczywają w Kościele w Pariacoto w specjalnej poświęconej kaplicy, po dokonanej wcześniej ekshumacji ich szczątków i przełożeniu ich do nowej trumny.



Serdecznie zapraszamy wszystkich na parafialne **Rekolekcje Wielkopostne**, które w tym roku rozpoczniemy w czwartek 7 marca o godz. 7:00 wieczorem, a następnie będziemy je kontynuować w piątek i sobotę 8, 9 marca o godz. 7:00 wieczorem. Rekolekcje zakończymy w niedzielę 10 marca na mszy św. o godz. 1:00 popołudniu. Rekolekcje poprowadzi ojciec Tymoteusz Tarnacki, paulin z Sanktuarium Matki Bożej Częstochowskiej w Doylestown, PA. W czasie Wielkiego Postu warto wziąć udział w rekolekcjach, aby zatrzymać się na chwilę, wyciszyć i posłuchać. Oczywiście, nie będzie nam łatwo stać się lepszymi po kilku godzinach nauk rekolekcyjnych. W ciągu kilku chwil nie da się naprawić całego naszego duchowego rozgardiaszu. To jest praca na całe życie. Ale warto od czegoś zacząć. Warto w tych rekolekcyjnych dniach postawić sobie odważne pytania... Czy ja mam jeszcze wiarę? Czy jestem w stanie Bogu mocniej zaufać? Czy kocham Go ze wszystkich sił i całym sercem? Czy ja się jeszcze modlę i rozmawiam z Bogiem? Czy żyję Jego przykazaniami i nauką? Pamiętajmy, że dobrze przeżyte rekolekcje, praktyki i nabożeństwa wielkopostne, szczerą spowiedź i pokuta mają przygotować nas do głębokiego świętowania Triduum Paschalnego i radości Wielkanocy.

## UNIVERSITY OF SAINT MARY of THE LAKE

Congratulations to ***Richard Capinpin***! On March 10, 2024, Most Rev. Jeffrey Grob will preside at the Rite of Institution into the Ministry of Reader and welcome him into that ministry at the Chapel of the Immaculate Conception, University of Saint Mary of the Lake in Mundelein.

At the institution, Bishop Grob will charge that *Richard Capinpin* be faithful in handing on the Word of God so that it may grow strong in the hearts of His people. Additionally, being an instituted Reader also means "taking on a special office within the Christian community." Besides proclaiming the word in the liturgical assembly, an instituted Reader is responsible for:

- instructing children and adults in the faith;
- preparing them to receive the sacraments worthily;
- bringing the message of salvation to those who have not yet received it.

This is an awesome responsibility. But it is part of the continuing discernment process as *Richard Capinpin* moves forward on his journey in formation and listens to God's plan for him in future ministry.

During formation this year, *Richard Capinpin* is attending academic courses which may include Church History, Old Testament, New Testament, Ecclesiology, Spiritual Theology, and Introductory Homiletics. He also participates in Theological Reflection Groups and will attend a cohort retreat prior to his institution as Reader. This year he is engaged in a Service to the Word field education. He attends monthly spiritual direction and is present for numerous formation sessions as he continues his journey on the Candidate Stage toward the Order of Deacon.

Presently, we are blessed to have nearly 500 active deacons in the Archdiocese of Chicago.

Please keep in your prayers *Richard Capinpin*, his wife, *Rose*, and their family, and all candidates in formation, that they might continue to answer God's call to serve His Church.

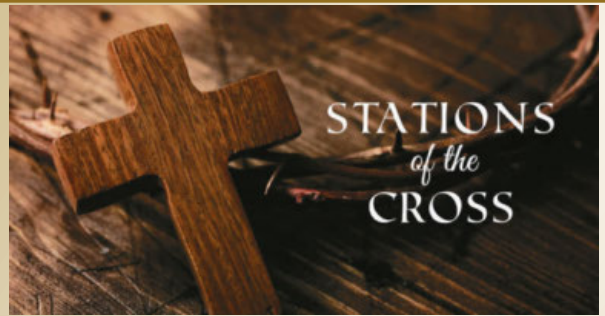

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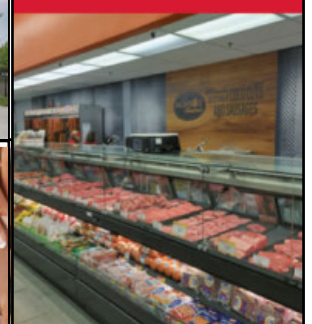


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
