

Two Sundays ago, we were asked to support seminarians who are preparing to become priests in Mundelein Seminary and we were also reminded to pray for many and holy vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life. This Sunday is Priesthood Sunday.

Priesthood Sunday was established to provide a way for Catholic communities to express appreciation for the priests who serve them. It is also a day to reflect upon the role of the priesthood in the life of the Church as a central one. Without priests the Holy Sacraments simply could not be conferred. When there is a serious illness or death in the family, when a wedding is announced or a baby arrives, priests are called to provide spiritual guidance.

It is disturbing that the number of priests and ordinations in the United States has steadily declined in the past 50 years. With the shortage of vocations, and only a few new priests being ordained every year, more and more priests must serve two or more parishes. Therefore, Priesthood Sunday is a day to pray for our priests, thanking God for their courage and their service. I humbly ask that when you pray the Rosary, please remember the priest who baptized you, the priest who gave you First Communion, the bishop who confirmed you, the priest who witnessed your marriage (or will do so in the future) and pray for the priest who will anoint you at your death and preside at your funeral. Your prayers are always appreciated and needed.



This Tuesday we will begin the beautiful month of October in which we celebrate many great Saints of the Church like - Saint Therese of Lisieux, the Holy Guardian Angels, Saint Francis of Assisi, Saint Teresa of Avila, Saint Luke, Pope Saint John Paul the Great, Saint Sister Faustina Kowalska, Saints Simon and Jude... just to name a few.

In October the Church takes special time to direct our attention to the sanctity and respect for human life from conception until natural death. Children are precious gifts from God who are to be born into loving families with fathers and mothers who are committed to each other in genuine and lifelong marital relationships. The highest honor and privilege of being a woman is the joy of motherhood.

October is also the month of the Holy Rosary, making it a providential time to pray to our Blessed Mother, Patroness of the Unborn, for an end to abortion and other offenses and sins against human life and dignity. As we say the Rosary daily, let us pray for pregnant mothers, let us pray for fathers, and let us pray that conceived babies may be born and live in a world of genuine love and care.

Nie ma złych kapłanów. Są tylko tacy, za których wierni za mało się modlą





Październik miesiąc Różańca

św. Jan Maria Vianney

Dzisiaj Kościół w Stanach Zjednoczonych obchodzi *Niedzielę Kapłańską*. Polecamy Panu Bogu w naszych modlitwach wszystkich kapłanów pracujących w naszej Archidiecezji Chicago, na misjach oraz kapłanów pochodzących z naszej parafii i w niej pracujących.

Jakże trudno w dzisiejszych czasach mówić o kapłaństwie, a jeszcze trudniej jest mówić o samych kapłanach. Już dawno zaczęto niszczyć autorytet kapłanów, choćby w kontekście różnych skandali czy też dlatego, że głoszone przez nich słowa stały się niewygodne dla wielu spośród żyjących obecnie katolików.

Powołaniem każdego kapłana jest troska o powierzony jego posłudze lud. A my wierni, czy chcemy słuchać tego głosu, który Chrystus kieruje do nas przez kapłanów? Czy potrafimy dostrzec w kapłanie człowieka, który został wybrany i posłany przez Boga? Czy raczej wolimy ich krytykować? A to, że nie tak ubrany; a to, że dał mi nie taką jaką chciałem usłyszeć naukę w konfesjonale; a to, że niezbyt ładnie śpiewa; a to, że nie jest "oratorem" na ambonie; a to, że nie zrobił tego co chciałem i tak jak ja chciałem...

Niedziela Kapłańska jest nam dana po to, abyśmy modląc się za kapłanów dostrzegli, że im zależy na naszym zbawieniu nie mniej niż na ich własnym. Dlatego dziś pomódlmy się za tego kapłana, który naszym zdaniem potrzebuje szczególnie dużo modlitwy. Pomódlmy się za tego, któremu szczególnie wiele zawdzięczamy. Pomódlmy się również za tego, w którym trudno dostrzec nam Chrystusa, aby to kapłaństwo, którym Bóg go obdarzył stawało się piękną służbą dla zbawienia wszystkich wierzących. Módlmy się, aby każdy kapłan z głeboką wiarą stawał przy ołtarzu i mocą Ducha Świętego sprowadzał Chrystusa na ołtarz, aby później dawać Go ludziom. Módlmy się, aby każdy kapłan z wiarą siadał do konfesjonału, aby każdego człowieka pogrążonego w grzechu, na nowo oczyścić mocą Krwi Chrystusa przelaną na krzyżu. Módlmy się, aby każdy kapłan z wiarą głosił Ewangelię Chrystusa, abyśmy Go wszyscy jeszcze lepiej poznali i jeszcze mocniej pokochali. Jezus, nasz Dobry Pasterz zachęca: "Żniwo wprawdzie wielkie, ale robotników mało; proście więc Pana żniwa, żeby wyprawił robotników na swoje żniwo" (Łk 10,2). Mamy zatem dzisiaj wspaniałą okazję, aby prosić dobrego Boga za kapłanów, ale też, aby pomodlić się o nowe i święte powołania do służby Bożej w Kościele.



Za kilka dni rozpocznie się miesiąc październik, który tradycyjnie jest miesiącem w szczególny sposób poświęconym modlitwie różańcowej. Przez cały miesiąc odprawia się nabożeństwa różańcowe, które my Polacy otoczamy wyjątkową czcią. Rozważanie różańca oznacza odmawianie modlitwy oraz medytację w tym samym czasie. Każda z tajemnic różańca koncentruje się na jednym ważnym wydarzeniu z życia Jezusa Chrystusa i jego matki, Maryi i pomaga nam naśladować ich w naszym życiu osobistym, rodzinnym i społecznym. Jest to modlitwa, która przemienia świat, zwłaszcza gdy jest odmawiana wspólnie. Nasze rodziny, narody i świat walczą teraz z przytłaczającymi siłami zła. Dziś potrzebujemy pomocy Maryi bardziej niż kiedykolwiek wcześniej.

Nasz rodak św. Jan Paweł II tak nauczał: "Rozważając tajemnice różańcowe patrzymy na misterium życia, męki, śmierci i zmartwychwstania Pana oczyma Jego matki Maryi. Przeżywamy je tak jak ona w swym sercu matczynym je przeżywała. Ona zawsze u boku syna jest równocześnie obecna pośród naszych codziennych spraw".

Zachęcamy do codziennej, gorliwej, wytrwałej i rodzinnej modlitwy różańcowej. Wpatrujac się w Maryję i medytując jej pokorne życie, naśladujmy jej przyklad, aby jeszcze bardziej ukochać Chrystusa Pana.

October is Respect Life Month & Month of the Holy Rosary


St. John's Respect Life Ministry invites parishioners to join us before Wednesday masses during the month of October to pray the rosary for Respect Life and an End to Violence in particular.

The Month of the Holy Rosary in 2024 will be from Saturday, October 1 to Monday, October 31. The Catholic Church dedicates the month of October to the Holy Rosary because the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated on October 7. Respect Life Month is celebrated in the United States every October to reflect on the dignity of every human life. The first Sunday of October is observed as Respect Life Sunday, which is when we will launch the annual Baby Bottle drive for TLC Pregnancy Centers. Please return bottles to church by November 3rd.

Each Wednesday evening in the month of October the Respect Life Ministry will lead the rosary at one of the shrines on St. John's campus. We invite all parishioners to join us or the rosary inside church to pray for an end of violence and for respect for life from the moment of inception until natural death. We will begin promptly at 6:30 PM so that those wishing to attend mass will be able to do so. In the case of inclement weather, we will just hold the rosary inside church.

About the Respect Life Ministry



When most people hear the phrase "Respect Life" they think of the pro-life movement and anti-abortion supporters. The Respect Life Ministry at St. John's is much more than that.

Our mission statement is "To transform our society into a culture of life where every human being is valued and protected from the moment of conception until natural death."

We participate in the following: the Annual Baby Bottle Campaign, monthly rosaries prayed in front of the Streamwood Police or Fire Department and Aurora abortion clinic, marching in the March for Life in Palatine, erecting crosses on the grassy berm of our parking lot representing lost babies, donations of time and goods to TLC and Corbella Pregnancy services, Bella Terra and Alden nursing homes, Gigi's Playhouse, the Crisis Center and any other organizations we learn of serving those in need in our area. Funds raised are donated to organizations helping the respect life cycle from conception until natural death. We have monthly meetings, on the fourth Thursday at 7 PM in the Parish Office, to pray and plan our ministry activities.






We are looking for new Altar Servers! If you are in 4th grade or higher and you would like to serve the church in this special ministry, we would love to have you!

The Altar Server Ministry is an ancient tradition in the Catholic church that continues on today. Altar servers assist the priests and deacons with sincere devotion and decorum in the spirit of the Liturgy for Eucharistic celebrations, Sacraments, funeral masses, benediction, and prayer services. The server role, when conducted with grace and reverence, add significantly to the sacredness of the rituals and help the assembly participate more fully and more prayerfully. This ministry allows the youth of the parish to become involved and contribute to the Liturgy of the Mass by serving others. Typical duties of the server are to carry the processional cross, the processional candles, the incense and boat, to assist with the Roman Missal and other liturgical books used in the liturgy, to assist the Bishop with his miter and crozier and to assist in preparing the altar. An altar server must have received First Communion to participate in this ministry and a willingness to serve at the Table of the Lord. There are 6 sessions held on Mondays from Oct. 14 thru Nov. 18, 7:15pm to 8:30pm. 

All parishioners (of any age) are invited to participate in a special 7-week program each Wednesday after the 7:00 Mass beginning October 16, 2024 in the Parish Center.


