

W najbliższą środę mija kolejna rocznica wyboru naszego wielkiego rodaka Kardynała Karola Wojtyły na papieża. 16 października 1978 roku kiedy biały dym zwiastujący dokonanie wyboru pojawił się nad Kaplicą Sykstyńską już w drugim dniu konklawe, metropolita krakowski stał się 262 następcą św. Piotra. Miał wówczas 58 lat. Jan Paweł II był pierwszym od 455 lat papieżem nie-Włochem, najprawdopodobniej pierwszym w dziejach papieżem Słowianinem i pierwszym w historii Kościoła papieżem, który przybranym imieniem powołał się aż na trzech swoich bezpośrednich poprzedników - Jana XXIII, Pawła VI i Jana Pawła I.

Chociaż kardynał Wojtyła zyskiwał od czasu udziału w obradach konklawe coraz większe uznanie wśród hierarchów z całego świata, to nie był wymieniany przez media w gronie purpuratów, których wybór na papieża jest wielce prawdopodobny. Wynik konklawe był światową sensacją. Postać papieża z Polski stała się przez szereg dni po konklawe kluczowym tematem światowych mediów, które nie kryły zafascynowania jego osobą. Zwracano uwagę na jego horyzonty intelektualne, wszechstronność zainteresowań, bogactwo doświadczeń duszpasterskich; podkreślano, że zna biegle sześć języków, lubi spływy kajakowe, uprawia narciarstwo a do tego jest poetą. Jan Paweł II zamieścił w swoim testamencie jedno ze wspomnień z konklawe. "Kiedy w dniu 16 października 1978 konklawe kardynałów wybrało Jana Pawła II, Prymas Polski kard. Stefan Wyszyński powiedział do mnie: 'zadaniem nowego papieża będzie wprowadzić Kościół w Trzecie Tysiąclecie'. Nie wiem, czy przytaczam to zdanie dosłownie, ale taki z pewnością był sens tego, co wówczas usłyszałem. Wypowiedział je zaś Człowiek, który przeszedł do historii jako Prymas Tysiąclecia. Wielki Prymas. Byłem świadkiem Jego posłannictwa, Jego heroicznego zawierzenia."

Ojciec Święty Jan Paweł II od początku pontyfikatu stał się niezwykle aktywnym i otwartym papieżem, który starał się być jak najbliżej wiernych. W czasie swego pontyfikatu odbył 104 pielgrzymki międzynarodowe, odwiedził 129 krajów na wszystkich kontynentach. Przemierzył łącznie ponad 1,5 mln km. W Polsce był 8-krotnie.

Zmarły 2 kwietnia 2005 papież z Polski, jest jednym z najszybciej wyniesionych na ołtarze wyznawców w czasach nowożytnych. Błogosławionym ogłosił go 1 maja 2011 r. papież Benedykt XVI, a 27 kwietnia 2014 r. kanonizował go papież Franciszek.

Jan Paweł II przez całe swe życie był bardzo blisko związany z Maryją, której zawierzył siebie samego i cały Kościół. Przesłanie Jana Pawła II, jego troska o zbawienie człowieka, o rodzinę, nadal pozostają bardzo aktualne. Ważne, abyśmy pamiętali nie tylko o św. Janie Pawle II, ale także o jego nauce, która pod wieloma względami była bardzo wymagająca, ale jakże pełna prawdy i mądrości. Trzeba nam tę naukę wcielać w nasze codzienne chrześcijańskie życie.




