

Daily "Our Father" in honor of St. John the Evangelist

During a vision in which St John the Evangelist appeared to St. Gertrude the Great, Our Lord told her that the Apostle was appointed by Him to be her advocate in Heaven.

Grateful for this favor, St. Gertrude said to Our Lord: "Teach me, my dear Lord, how I can show my gratitude to him." Our Lord answered: "If any person says a Pater Noster (Our Father) daily in honor of this Apostle, reminding him of the sweet fidelity with which his heart was filled when I taught this prayer, he will not fail to obtain the grace of persevering faithfully in virtue, even to the end of his life."

"The prayer of the poor rises up to God" (Ecclesiasticus 21:5)

"Christian hope embraces the certainty that our prayer reaches God's presence; not just any prayer but rather the prayer of the poor!" Pope Francis

Sunday, November 17, 2024, is the World Day of the Poor, a day established by Pope Francis in 2017 for Catholics to "reflect on how poverty is at the very heart of the Gospel." The theme for 2024 is "*The prayer of the poor rises up to God*" (Sirach 21:5).

"The poor hold a privileged place in God's heart," Pope Francis said in his message for the day. "God knows the sufferings of his children because he is an attentive and caring father. As a father, he takes care of those who are most in need: the poor, the marginalized, the suffering, and the forgotten. No one is excluded from his heart, for in his eyes, we are all poor and needy. We are all beggars because without God, we would be nothing."

The pope stressed that God will never abandon us and will never leave us without a response to our prayers.

"He does not forget you nor could he ever do so. We all have had the experience of prayers that seem to remain unanswered. Sometimes, we ask to be freed from a misery that makes us suffer and humiliates us, and God seems not to hear our cry. However, God's silence does not mean he is inattentive to our sufferings; rather, it contains a word that must be received with trust, surrendering ourselves to him and to his will," Pope Francis said.

Why did Pope Francis establish the day in 2017?

After the Year of Mercy, the pope said he wanted to set aside a day so that, throughout the world, Christian communities could become even greater signs of Christ's charity for those in need. We are called, Pope Francis wrote in his first World Day of the Poor message, "to draw near to the poor, to encounter them, to meet their gaze, to embrace them, and to let them feel the warmth of love that breaks through their solitude. Their outstretched hand is also an invitation to step out of our certainties and comforts, and to acknowledge the value of poverty in itself."

The pope said that for Christ's disciples, "poverty is, above all, a call to follow Jesus in his own poverty," and he asked Catholics to take as their example Saint Francis of Assisi, who kept his gaze fixed on Christ, allowing him to see and serve the poor.

Informacje parafialne

W tą niedzielę, 17 listopada, obchodzimy VIII Światowy Dzień Ubogich ogłoszony przez papieża Franciszka, pod hasłem: "*Modlitwa ubogiego dociera do Boga*" (Syr 21, 5). Światowy Dzień Ubogich jest okazją do uświadomienia sobie obecności ubogich w naszych miastach i społecznościach oraz zrozumienia ich potrzeb.

W orędziu na ten dzień Ojciec Święty pisze:

"W tym roku poświęconym modlitwie musimy przyswoić sobie modlitwę ubogich i modlić się wraz z nimi. Jest to wyzwanie, które musimy podjąć i działanie duszpasterskie, które należy rozwijać. Bowiem "najgorszą dyskryminacją, jakiej doświadczają ubodzy, jest brak opieki duchowej. Olbrzymia większość ubogich otwarta jest szczególnie na wiarę; potrzebują Boga i nie możemy nie ofiarować im Jego przyjaźni, Jego błogosławieństwa, Jego Słowa, sprawowania Sakramentów i propozycji drogi wzrostu i dojrzewania w wierze. Opcja preferencyjna na rzecz ubogich musi głównie przyjąć formę uprzywilejowanej i priorytetowej opieki duchowej. (...) Kolejny Światowy Dzień Ubogich jest okazją, której nie można nie docenić, ponieważ pobudza każdego wierzącego do wysłuchania modlitwy ubogich, uświadamiając sobie ich obecność i potrzeby. Jest to dobra okazja do realizacji inicjatyw, które konkretnie pomagają ubogim, a także do uznania i wspierania wielu wolontariuszy, którzy z pasją poświęcają się najbardziej potrzebującym. Musimy dziękować Panu za osoby, które są gotowe słuchać i wspierać najuboższych."

Orędzie Papieża Franciszka zachęca nas wszystkich do zwrócenia większej uwagi duchowej na biednych, którzy potrzebują Boga i kogoś, kto będzie konkretnym znakiem Jego obecności i wysłuchania próśb potrzebujących. Odpowiadając na apel papieża, ale też realizując swoją codzienną misję bycia z ubogimi pamietajmy o nich w naszych modlitwach, a także poprzez konkretną pomoc wszystkim cierpiącym biedę duchową oraz materialną wokół nas.

Listopad jest miesiącem szczególnie poświęconym modlitwie za wiernych zmarłych, za dusze w czyśćcu cierpiące. Modlimy się za nich z ufnością, wiedząc, że "Bóg nie jest Bogiem umarłych, lecz żywych; wszyscy bowiem dla Niego żyją" (Łk 20, 38).

Wypominki za zmarłych w naszej parafii czytane są na 25 minut przed każdą niedzielną polską Mszą świętą przez cały miesiąc listopad. Zapraszamy do wspólnej modlitwy.

A BETTER WAY FORWARD

A Message on Assisted Suicide from the Catholic Bishops of Illinois

Last Spring we wrote to you about legislation, SB 3499 that was introduced to legalize assisted suicide in Illinois. The bill did not pass, but it is going to be re-introduced again so we ask you to prayerfully consider and act on our message about assisted suicide.

Assisted suicide makes it legal for a physician to prescribe an array of lethal drugs to a person diagnosed with a terminal disease who requests to end his or her life. The Catholic Bishops of Illinois oppose any legislation that would legalize assisted suicide as there is a better way forward for our State.

Proponents argue that this legislation will end suffering at the end-of-life. We agree that no one should needlessly suffer or have to watch a loved one experience unnecessary pain and suffering. Fortunately, there are now effective ways to make a person more comfortable at the end of life through palliative care. This relatively new specialty utilizes physician-led teams to care for the whole person – physically, emotionally, socially and spiritually – to relieve the symptoms and the stress that often accompany serious illness and side effects of treatment. A better way forward is to expand the number and availability of palliative care programs throughout Illinois.

Drawing on data from Oregon, the first state to legalize assisted suicide in the US, reports show that pain is not among the top reasons why a person would want to end their life: loss of autonomy; concerns about being either a financial burden or a time commitment to family and friends; and loss of the ability to engage in activities that make life enjoyable are the most cited reasons for choosing assisted suicide. We support expanding mental health coverage and strengthening social supports, such as community programs that compassionately walk with those dealing with depression and feelings of hopelessness.

The unintended consequences that arise from legalized assisted suicide include a large range of possible abuses. It is alarming that in states with legalized suicide, there are documented cases of people being denied life-saving medical treatment by insurance companies in lieu of the much cheaper option of life-ending drugs. The poor and those with disabilities are particularly in jeopardy as they are the most vulnerable to such abuses. In response, every major national organization that represents people with disabilities is opposed to assisted suicide.

The American Medical Association (AMA) has summed up the case against assisted suicide well. "Physician assisted suicide is fundamentally incompatible with the physician's role as healer, would be difficult or impossible to control, and would provide serious societal risks."

Assisted suicide is not the compassionate solution for those who are suffering. Through palliative care, expanded access to mental health care, and stronger family and community support, providers and families are finding better ways to accompany these people compassionately that truly confer the love for, and dignity of, each human life. 
