Calculating Love

It is a website where you can supply two names, and the percentage chance of a successful relationship is calculated. Curious, I entered my name and my wife's. Twenty percent! I hope my wife doesn't read this!

I then decided to add my name and God. A whopping thirteen percent! Then for the last attempt, I put in my name and Jesus. A very disappointing zero percent! Am I that unlovable? "If you love me, keep my commandments, says the Lord, and I will ask the Father and he will send you another Paraclete, to abide with you for ever, alleluia."

-Jn 14:15-16

This Scripture passage contains the opening words of today's Gospel reading and also the words of the Communion Antiphon. I have always loved this passage, particularly since learning a beautiful musical setting of this text from back in my Magdalen College days.

Magdalen College, a small, Catholic, liberal arts, lay-run college in Warner, NH, was well-known in my personal circles for its beautiful liturgies and music at Masses. All the students at Magdalen were in the regular choir whether they liked singing or not, whether they had talent for singing or not, whether they wanted to or not. While this seemed strange at first and definitely took some applicants aback, it was quickly realized that the virtues and habits developed from singing in a choir greatly strengthened good community life and improved the way the college students related to each other. As the students were split into the sections of the choir - soprano (high-voiced females), alto (low-voiced females), tenor (high-voiced males), and bass (low-voiced males) - they had to learn to work with the other voices in their sections to create a good blend. They all had to pay attention to one director and follow the pace set by one accompanist on the organ or the piano. They had to learn which voices to rely on for support and which ones needed more guidance. They had to see how the line of music they were singing fit into the greater whole of the music. It was quite amazing what all the students at the school were able to accomplish and the joyful noise they produced when singing for liturgies.

In addition to the "regular choir", there were two "audition-only" choirs at Magdalen, the Performance Choir and the Polyphony Choir (polyphony music is that which contains two or more independent melodic lines that are sung simultaneously to create a beautiful layered musical texture and sound). It was through the Polyphony Choir that I first became acquainted with a beautiful Renaissance polyphonic piece of choral music called "If Ye Love Me" by English composer Thomas Tallis, published in 1565. This is the musical piece that I call to mind each year on the 6th Sunday of Easter when we hear the passage from John 14:15-21. My older sister learned this piece first when she "made the cut" and joined the Polyphony Choir around 2002. I remember her coming home and singing various polyphonic music and encouraging me to learn the alto part so we could sing the soprano and alto together. It gave me great joy when I joined the Polyphony Choir in 2005 as a student at Magdalen College and was able to sing so many of these songs with a full group.

"If Ye Love Me" has always held a special place in my heart. It is not a very long piece, but what it is able to accomplish in a brief amount of time is nothing short of spectacular and beautiful. The choirs at Our Lady have learned this piece in my time here as music director, and the Traditional Choir is singing it this weekend as the Offertory song. This piece of music has "popped up" in other choral groups of which I have been a part as well, including the choir at St. Joseph's College in Rensselaer, IN, where I got my MA in Music and in the archdiocesan choir in the Archdiocese of Indianapolis for priesthood ordination Masses. Every time I have the opportunity to sing this piece, I echo the words of the psalmist today and "cry out to God with joy".

There is a special grace in hearing words of Scripture and calling something else to mind, whether it be music, an experience, a book, a conversation, or something else. May our hearts always be open to connecting with the Word of God and letting it change our lives for the better.

### SUSPENSION OF LIVESTREAM

As a result of the Covid-19 pandemic, the community of Our Lady of Perpetual Help began livestreaming the Sunday 11 a.m. Mass and two school Masses each week. Since the restrictions have long passed, we have decided to discontinue the livestreaming service as of Monday, May 25, 2026. The importance of and the grace experienced by worshiping as a community in person cannot be replicated by watching a livestreamed Mass.

Catholics are obligated to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. We fully understand that some members of our parish are unable to attend Mass in person for health reasons or transportation reasons. Having a serious illness, caring for someone with a serious illness, lacking access to transportation to a nearby church, or experiencing severe weather excuses a person from the obligation of attending Mass in person. We have Our Lady parishioners serving in our visitation ministry who will bring Holy Communion each week to people in the situations mentioned above, either at home or at senior living centers. ## ST. VINCENT DEPAUL MARCH UPDATE

My dear friends in Christ,

During the months of February and March, 2026, your St. Vincent DePaul Society was blessed to assist 33 adults and 26 children in our community. We welcomed a grant from the Lions Club during early February and along with your continuing generosity, we were able to provide rental and utility assistance and Kroger gift cards to help families facing difficult circumstances.

We provided \$3311 in rental assistance and \$2,220.77 in utility assistance. In addition we distributed \$140 in Kroger Cards to help with gas and food expenses. Altogether your kindness made it possible to share \$5671.77 in direct aid with our neighbors in need.

My dear friends, we simply could not carry on out this ministry without your ongoing prayers, generosity and support. We are deeply grateful for the compassion you show to those struggling.

We meet on the third Monday of each month at 6pm in the St. Joseph's Room at the Parish Center for our business meeting. We also gather informally during Coffee and Donuts, after the 9am Mass in Wagner Hall. We would love the opportunity to share more about our mission with you.

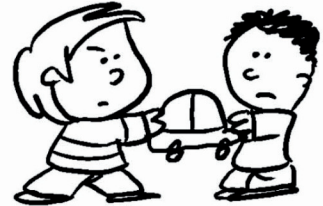

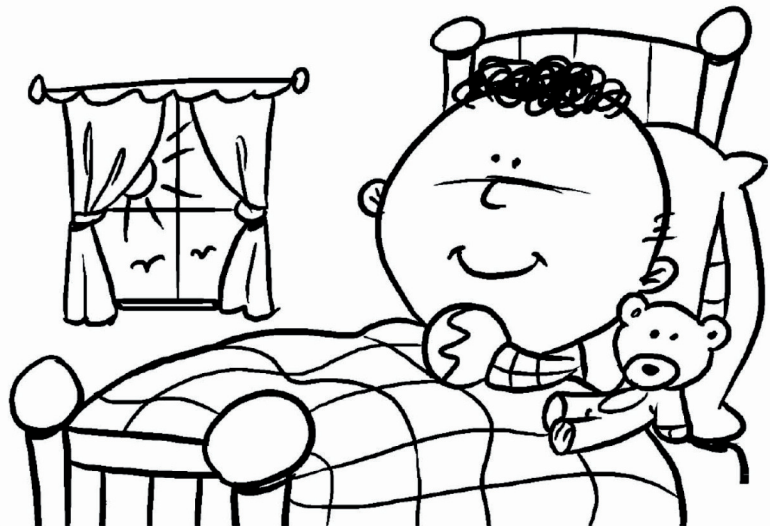

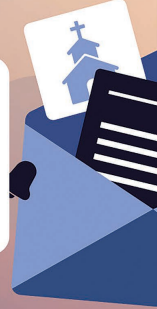
