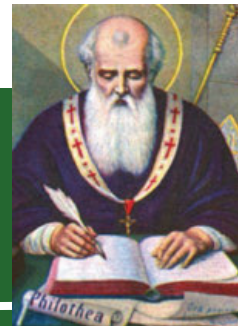

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today we continue reading the Gospel of Mark from where we left off last Sunday. Last Sunday our Gospel told how Jesus was tested by the Pharisees about the requirements for divorce. Recall that these chapters come from the second part of Mark's Gospel, which chronicles the beginning of Jesus' journey to Jerusalem. In today's Gospel, an unnamed man approaches Jesus and inquires about what he must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus replies that one must follow the commandments of the Law of Moses. The man acknowledges that he has observed all of these since his childhood. Jesus then says that only one thing is lacking: he must give his possessions to the poor and follow Jesus. The man leaves in sadness, and Mark tells us that this is because he had many possessions.

The belief in resurrection and eternal life was a relatively recent development in Jewish thought at Jesus' time, and it wasn't shared by everyone. The Pharisees taught that there would be a resurrection from the dead; the Sadducees did not share this belief. Jesus taught that there would be a final judgment for everyone and eternal life (the Kingdom of God) for believers. Jesus makes two requirements of the wealthy man who approaches him.

First, he must give up his possessions. Throughout history, some Christians have taken this literally. Their example witnesses to us a radical commitment to the Gospel of Jesus. Some have read this as a particular requirement directed to this specific individual. Still others have sought to explain the meaning intended by the word possessions as those things that prevent one from following Jesus. Christians have generally understood that at the least, following Jesus requires that believers hold material possessions loosely and remain vigilant against seeking security in accumulating possessions.

The second requirement Jesus makes of this man is the invitation that Jesus extends to all would-be disciples: "follow me."

Jesus very much wants this man to be his disciple. We believe that the Christian faith is one in which each believer is in a personal relationship with Jesus. Just as this Gospel tells us that Jesus loves the man and is sad when he departs, so too, Jesus loves us and is saddened when we are unable to follow him. We see in this Gospel reading another example of Mark's pattern, which shows Jesus offering further elaboration about his message and meaning to his disciples. To his disciples, Jesus laments the challenges faced by those who are rich in following him and entering the Kingdom of God.

In reply to the disciples' astonishment at the strictness of the standard that Jesus speaks about today, Jesus reminds his disciples that nothing is impossible with God. Salvation is determined by our ability to rely completely upon God. Peter replies to Jesus by boasting that the disciples have already given up everything. Jesus acknowledges that those who have given up everything for the sake of the Gospel will be rewarded. This reward begins now, in the new community that one will gain in this life, and will continue in the eternal age to come. Our personal relationship with Jesus is also an invitation to the community of faith, the Church.

School Building Update

Parishioners, we have an update with the School building. The whole Building committee has seen the plans and are very excited. Then it was presented to the Teachers and Staff of the school and they are even more excited. One of our teachers who has been here a numbers made this interesting comment, "we have heard many promises of enhancing the school, but this is by far the furthest we have seen any plans before." We are truly at the last steps, which those of you who are in construction know there are many final steps.

So here is where we are! We have at this time set up meetings with the Fire Marshall to make sure all the safety codes and requirements are fulfilled. We have set up times and dates with all of the committees required to make sure state and city inspection codes are followed. This all leads to the final step after the construction company has set the actual price, which as all estimates presented will fall in the range that we had set with our "Love One Another" Campaign Then finally to get final approval from the Archdiocese who examines to see if all the construction designs and civil codes are followed. And then they finally make sure what percentage of the money the Parish has collected for the project.

At this time with what has been collected with the campaign and additional gifts we are about at 85 % of the total collected which surpasses the requirement of assets needed to proceed. Understand we are finishing the second year of a five-year campaign. We are hoping that people will continue their pledges especially when they see the new addition going up. We have added a new drawing of the ground floor, which is below the first floor which is the main hall of the School on the boards around the Church. You can see the STEM Classroom with its labs areas, as well the new elevator which will make the first floor and ground level accessible for all people.

Thank you for your patience and concern about this project. Some people have questioned why the school, why not the Church or the Religious Education Program. First with the Church over the past fifteen years we have put millions into the Church which truly is essential and beautiful, whereas the school has received little. The Religious Education Program uses the school classrooms and because of our number of Religious Education students, we have had to separate our program into two different buildings. With the addition, both Religious Education and the School will be in one building. We are excited for the future.

Respect Life Month Thoughts

Let your religion be less a theory and more a love affair. (GK Chesterton) It may be that the phrase “respect for life” too often in the popular mind only connotes the fifth commandment, and barely considers death-dealing behaviors like discrimination, gossip, lies, greed, and other forms of injustice against individuals and indeed whole groups of people. Respect for life is however, not just a Christian obligation. Human reason is sufficient to impose respect for life on the basis of what a human person is and should be. This article reflects briefly on the link between respecting life – all of life – from the point of view of the dignity of the human person, a dignity which flows naturally from our being made in the image of God.

Life is a gift and is sacred. Therefore, as a human being I have the gift of reason, I am capable of reflecting, on myself and determining my actions and my destiny and I ask myself, what kind of person should I become? I am also free; how should I use my freedom as a Catholic Christian? Our topic is respect for life, and regardless of our age, the stories of the talents in the gospels of Matthew and Luke provide a useful reflection which can help us to understand and accept that life is a gift and that life is sacred.

In Matthew 25:14-21 life is described as a “talent” which must be used and used well. The giving of the talents itself was done “*each according to his ability*” and implies that individual human beings do not all have the same skill or understanding. One notes however, the punishment meted out to the slave who had buried his, and who was not considered “*good and trustworthy*” as the others who had put theirs to good use and who also received a reward. Since a talent in those days was the equal of 15 years wages of a laborer, the talent is recognized as a treasure, the life given to humankind to be put to good use. The reward implies an active sharing in Christ’s reign.

The idea of using well whatever we are given is also described in Luke 19:12-27. In this instance, the treasure in human terms is vastly reduced, for the pound; the translation of the Hebrew *mina* was the equivalent of three month’s wages for the laborer. The punishment for the one who did not use his pound was similar to that meted out to the one who had buried his talent in the ground.

So as we celebrate “Respect Life Month” even though the abortion issue is the foundational element of the respect of life, let us not forget, those who struggle with physical and mental disabilities, the marginalized in society, and especially in our world today the elderly who find themselves in a world that isolates them from the rest of society. Respect Life is how we use the talents of life to build the talents of Life in the self and others. Holy Mary Mother of God, who gave life to her Son, pray that we can give life to our future generations.



Month of the Holy Rosary

My father had not regularly attended Mass for decades. As a child, I remember going to Mass with my mom and siblings. As an adult, I was always impressed by husbands who went to church with their families. It was a deep longing in my heart, and when it was time for me to settle down and start a family, I knew that I needed to find a man who would come to Mass with me. Then I met my now-husband, who has always been an incredible spiritual leader in our home. We attend Mass as a family most weekends, and I know that our two children recognize the value of this time together.

My son received his first Holy Communion last year. During his preparations, we decided to begin praying a daily Rosary, and a few months into it, my son started offering it up for my dad. After the first few times, when we realized that this intention had become a regular one, we all began offering up our Rosary for my dad. I knew what I was praying for. I wanted my dad to go back to church. One day as we were praying the Rosary at home the doorbell rang and my dad happened to be at the door. I invited him in and asked him to wait because we were praying the Rosary. He waited and we finished with my son ending with the intention of the Rosary. I went into the living room where my dad was waiting. He said nothing and continued to share some family time.

The next week we went to Mass and there in the back of the Church seated in the pew was my Dad. I was surprised. After Mass my Son went up and hugged Grampa, as he exclaimed, Grandpa you made it. His only answers to my Son was how could I let you and the Blessed Mother down. Holy Mary Mother of God pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death.

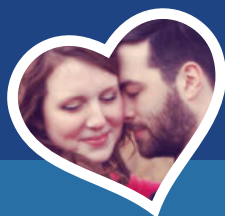

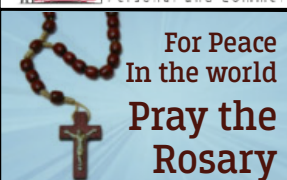
