Dear Friends,

Today, Sunday, June 4, is Immacolata's annual parish picnic, 3:00 - 7:00 p.m. Be sure to stop by and visit with fellow parishioners in a fun, relaxed, old-fashioned picnic. This is a good opportunity to meet new parishioners. There will be plenty of food, games, and live music. Hope to see you there!

Today is also **Glennon Sunday.** As the only freestanding Catholic pediatric hospital in the country, **Cardinal Glennon Children's Hospital** serves more than 200,000 sick and injured children each year—regardless of the family's ability to pay. There is a second collection at all the Masses to help continue this inspiring and much needed ministry, "*Where Faith and Healing Unite.*" Thank you for your generosity!

Last Sunday we read Archbishop Rozanski's letter at all the Masses in which he promulgated Immacolata Parish's position in the *All Things New* initiative. As stated in the letter, "Your parish will remain unchanged regarding its present structure and the Reverend Monsignor Vernon Gardin, who is presently assigned to provide pastoral care for your parish, will continue to do so... The Reverend Conor Sullivan, who is appointed to serve on the faculty of Kenrick-Glennon Seminary as Director of Mental Health Services for Priests, will continue to have residence at your parish." The implementation phase of All Things New now begins. For information on all the parish changes in the Archdiocese, please check the website:

www.allthingsnew.archstl.org. There is certainly a lot of information to digest. One important fact to keep in mind is that if nothing at all were done regarding the 174 parishes in the Archdiocese, then within three years (2026), there would be more parishes than Archdiocesan priests. Currently, there are about 190 active diocesan priests (not retired); some 26 are retiring this spring. The "aging of America" is affecting all aspects of American society, including the Archdiocese. Also, the metropolitan population continues to spread outward (as it always has!), with the largest large parishes in St. Charles county. Balancing of resources is necessary to meet these challenges. We are blessed at Immacolata to have a vibrant parish community, in spite of our relatively small size, and a growing school. As the Archbishop encouraged us in his letter, let us all pray that the Holy Spirit will "draw us all closer together as we commit ourselves to following the Lord Jesus and spreading His message by the witness of our lives."








