



Human Dignity-Not Dependent on Citizenship or on a Person's Immigration Status

The U.S. Bishops, Catholic Charities, and the Catholic Health Association of the U.S. will continue to respond to government actions that ignore the human dignity of each person who is created by God and made in His image and likeness. The attached article states this viewpoint. **What can you and I do as Catholics to respond to community actions that ignore the human dignity of others?**

- Pray, pray, pray for our government leaders and those carrying out orders that they treat each person with human dignity. Pray for those who are suffering from fear, anxiety, and cruelty that they receive the resources they need for their families and themselves.
- Attend the Mass for Racial Unity-Tuesday, Feb. 11, 7:00 p.m. at St. Cletus Parish 2705 Zumbehl Road St. Charles, MO 63301. Carpools available from St. Catherine Laboure. Contact Cathy Griner 314-849-2314 if you would like to carpool.
- Request that your senators and representatives pass just laws that respect the human dignity of each person and that provide safety in homes, schools, churches, hospitals, and communities. Participate in the Immigrant Accompaniment Program sponsored by the Immigrant and Refugee Ministry at St. Pius V (a Vincentian parish in the city). Training is required. You can volunteer as little or as much as you wish. migrantministrySTL@gmail.com-314-772-1525
- Read the article below and other documents from the USCCB regarding immigration.
- Do one small action each day with love to help others.

WASHINGTON – The following statement was issued in response to action taken by the Trump Administration rescinding guidance related to "protected areas" in immigration enforcement.

"Catholic health care, Catholic Charities agencies, and the Church's other social service ministries work daily to feed, house, heal, educate, and meet people's needs in communities across our nation. Through these ministries—together with the Church's responsibility to proclaim the Gospel and celebrate the sacraments—we uphold the belief that all people are conceived with inherent dignity, reflecting the image of God. Through our parishes, shelters, hospitals, schools, and other Church institutions, we recognize that this dignity is not dependent on a person's citizenship or immigration status. Moreover, the charitable services we provide are fundamental to who we are as Christians. 'For the Church, charity is not a kind of welfare activity which could equally well be left to others, but is a part of her nature, an indispensable expression of her very being' ([Deus caritas est](#), no. 25).

"We recognize the need for just immigration enforcement and affirm the government's obligation to carry it out in a targeted, proportional, and humane way. However, non-emergency immigration enforcement in schools, places of worship, social service agencies, healthcare facilities, or other sensitive settings where people receive essential services would be contrary to the common good. With the mere rescission of the protected areas guidance, we are already witnessing reticence among immigrants to engage in daily life, including sending children to school and attending religious services. All people have a right to fulfill their duty to God without fear. Turning places of care, healing, and solace into places of fear and uncertainty for those in need, while endangering the trust between pastors, providers, educators and the people they serve, will not make our communities safer.

"Our organizations stand ready to work on a better path forward that protects the dignity of all those we serve, upholds the sacred duty of our providers, and ensures our borders and immigration system are governed with mercy and justice."

LIFE MINISTRY

WASHINGTON – “As we celebrate this Jubilee Year as *Pilgrims of Hope*, Pope Francis invites us to experience God’s love ‘that awakens in hearts the sure hope of salvation in Christ,’” said Bishop Daniel E. Thomas of Toledo. As chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops’ Committee on Pro-Life Activities, Bishop Thomas offered the following reflection on the 52nd anniversary of the decision by the Supreme Court of the United States in *Roe v. Wade* that legalized abortion nationwide:

“I join all Catholics throughout our nation in observing January 22 as a day of prayer and penance. As we prayerfully continue the essential work of restoring full legal protection of all preborn children and supporting parents facing difficult pregnancies, we also recognize our need for asking forgiveness and healing from the Lord for when we have given in to the culture of death.

“Abortion inflicts deep and lasting wounds on society, but more directly on individuals and families. Many mothers and fathers may feel they have no choice except abortion. Some are pressured or coerced. No matter the circumstances of the abortion, we must recognize the often-silent grief of parents for their child and their despair of being worthy of the love and forgiveness of God and others.

“To the parents of children who have died by abortion, I am deeply sorry for your loss. Know that our Lord loves you as His daughters and sons no matter your actions. No sin is beyond His unfathomable Mercy. Jesus greatly desires our repentant hearts and invites us into an encounter with Him. For Catholics, the Sacrament of Reconciliation is always available for those seeking God’s forgiveness, hope, and peace.

“As we celebrate this Jubilee Year as *Pilgrims of Hope*, Pope Francis invites us to experience God’s love ‘that awakens in hearts the sure hope of salvation in Christ’ (*Spes Non Confundit*, 6). Hope allows those who have been involved in abortion to turn to God and repent, confident that He will forgive and make them whole.

“This January 22 and beyond, we need to be reassured that Jesus Himself, who is the source of our hope, was first wounded for our offenses, and suffered for every sin of ours, including abortion. Please join me in praying that God will fill the hearts of mothers and fathers suffering the emotional and psychological wounds from abortion with the hope of forgiveness that only He can give. We invite them to seek support from the Church’s compassionate and confidential ministries.”





The Women Kristin Hannah



Women can be heroes. When twenty-year-old nursing student Frances "Frankie" McGrath hears these words, it is a revelation. Raised in the sun-drenched, idyllic world of Southern California and sheltered by her conservative parents, she has always prided herself on doing the right thing. But in 1965, the world is changing, and she suddenly dares to imagine a different future for herself. When her brother ships out to serve in Vietnam, she joins the Army Nurse Corps and follows his path.

As green and inexperienced as the men sent to Vietnam to fight, Frankie is over-whelmed by the chaos and destruction of war. Each day is a gamble of life and death, hope and betrayal; friendships run deep and can be shattered in an instant. In war, she meets—and becomes one of—the lucky, the brave, the broken, and the lost.

But war is just the beginning for Frankie and her veteran friends. The real battle lies in coming home to a changed and divided America, to angry protesters, and to a country that wants to forget Vietnam.

The Women is the story of one woman gone to war, but it shines a light on all women who put themselves in harm's way and whose sacrifice and commitment to their country has too often been forgotten. A novel about deep friendships and bold patriotism, *The Women* is a richly drawn story with a memorable heroine whose idealism and courage under fire will come to define an era.


