

The Second Sunday of Lent presents us with the powerful story of the Transfiguration of Jesus. In this passage from Luke 9:28-36, we see Jesus, in the company of Peter, James, and John, ascend a mountain and undergo a dramatic change in appearance. His face shines like the sun, and his clothes become dazzling white. As the apostles witness this profound event, they also encounter two figures—Moses and Elijah—who represent the Law and the Prophets. The voice of God the Father then speaks from the cloud, saying, "This is my Son, the Chosen One; listen to him."

The Call to Encounter Jesus in His Glory

The Transfiguration is not just an extraordinary event; it is a moment of revelation. It reminds us that Jesus is not only the humble teacher who walked among us but is also the glorified Son of God, who shares in the divine nature. In this moment, the veil is lifted, and the disciples are granted a glimpse of Jesus' heavenly glory. For Peter, James, and John, this experience would have been both awe-inspiring and overwhelming. They are left in wonder, unsure of how to respond.

In our Lenten journey, this moment of glory serves as a reminder that Jesus is not simply a figure of the past but is also alive, full of light and glory, present in our midst today. Just as the disciples were invited to behold his glory on the mountaintop, we too are called to seek an encounter with Christ in the ordinary moments of our lives.

The Invitation to Listen to Jesus

The voice of God the Father commands, "Listen to him." This is a simple yet profound invitation. In a world filled with distractions, noise, and competing voices, Lent calls us to quiet our hearts and listen more attentively to the voice of Jesus. We are invited to pay attention to his words and his actions in the Gospel, to learn from his example of humility, love, and sacrifice. The Father's directive to listen is not a passive suggestion—it is an active call to be transformed by Jesus' teachings and to live them out in our daily lives.

The Role of Suffering in the Transfiguration

While the Transfiguration reveals the glory of Christ, it is also significant in the context of Jesus' upcoming suffering and death. Immediately after the Transfiguration, Jesus speaks to his disciples about his impending passion (Luke 9:43b-45). The glory of the Transfiguration is not meant to overshadow the suffering that Jesus will endure; rather, it prepares the disciples to understand that suffering and glory are inseparable in God's plan for salvation.

In our own lives, we too experience moments of joy and peace, as well as suffering and trials. The Transfiguration reminds us that the presence of God is with us in both, and that ultimately, God's glory will shine through even our darkest moments. Lent invites us to embrace both aspects—recognizing Christ's glory and accepting the challenge of walking with him through his suffering.

A Call to Transfiguration in Our Own Lives

Lent is a time for personal transformation. Just as the disciples witnessed Jesus' transformation on the mountain, we too are called to undergo a transformation in our hearts during this season. The invitation is to let Christ's light shine in the darkness of our lives, to allow ourselves to be transfigured by his grace. Whether through prayer, fasting, or almsgiving, we are invited to make space for God's transformative work in us.

Let us remember that this season is not just about self-discipline, but about opening ourselves to the glory of God, which can heal, renew, and change us from the inside out. As we continue our Lenten journey, may we listen to Jesus with open hearts, trusting that he will lead us to the glory of the Resurrection.



Please know that all volunteers are welcome from young children to senior citizens, and everyone in between! We can find a job for you.


