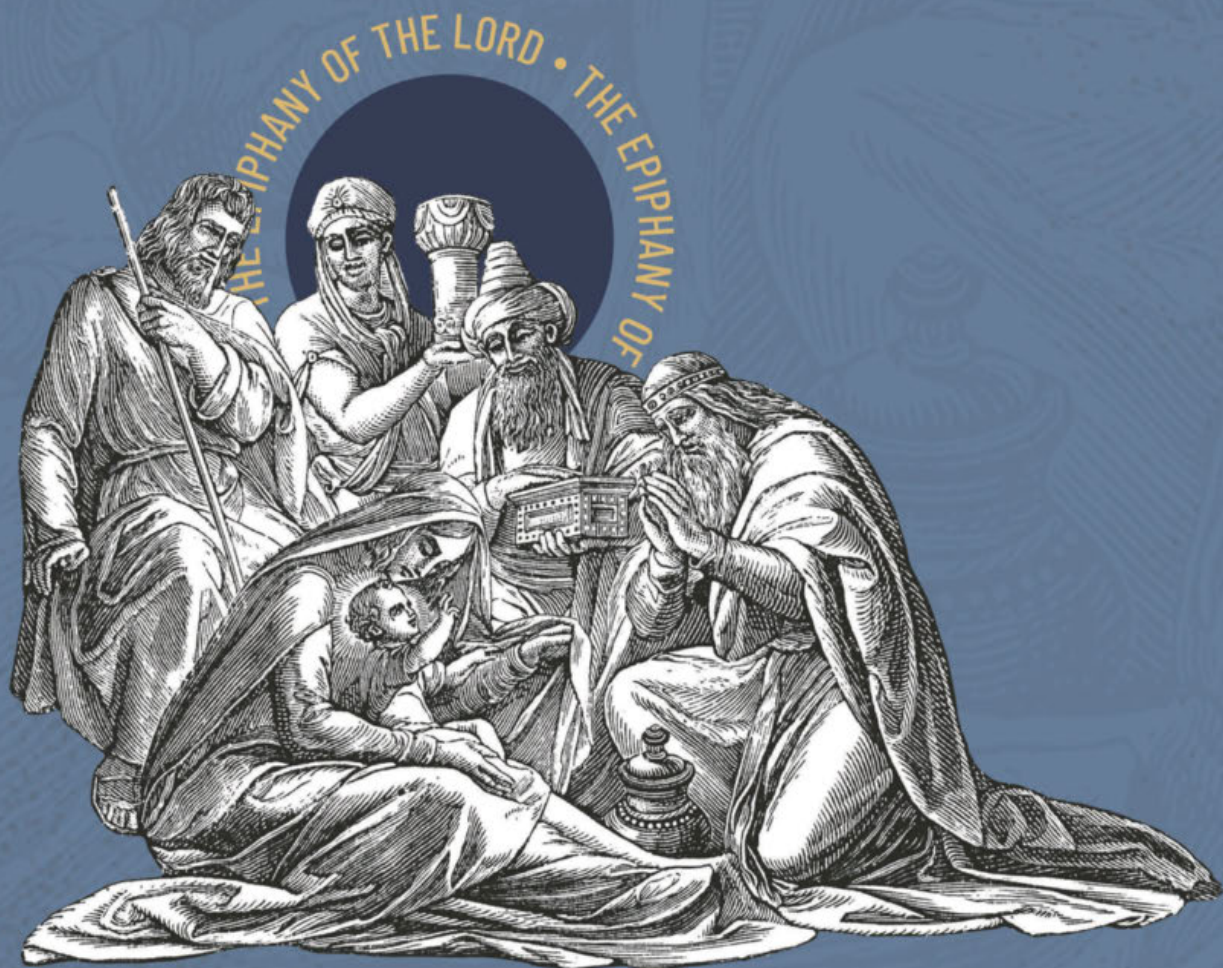

Dear Sacred Heart Parishioners,

Merry Christmas!

I hope you have had a wonderful start to this Christmas season and have been able to spend time with loved ones, celebrating the birth of our Lord.

I want to follow up on what I discussed with you a few weeks ago regarding the plan to address Sacred Heart's facilities. As I mentioned, the diocese conducted two audits of our facilities, in 2019 and 2022, both of which revealed numerous significant maintenance needs. Some of these needs have been deferred for many years, and we are at a point where they must be addressed.

I assembled a team of parishioners and experts in engineering, construction and business to review the results of the audits and determine the best course of action. The team has prioritized the facilities' needs and proposed a two-phase Strategic Plan with the most urgent needs being addressed first. The estimated cost to complete the two phases of the Strategic Plan is **\$1,840,000**. Attached is a breakdown of the needs and their respective costs.

As I mentioned previously, we have retained the services of Lorraine Klemz Consulting, Inc. to assist us over the next three months. In particular, Mrs. Klemz will help to assess our financial capacity to undertake the necessary projects. Mrs. Klemz will seek input from everyone. This will involve individual interviews and a parish-wide survey. I encourage each of you to participate wholeheartedly in this process. Your support and active involvement are crucial as we embark on this journey together.

Together, I believe we can ensure a great future for Sacred Heart parish for many years to come. Thank you for your commitment to the church and to this community. Please keep Sacred Heart in your daily prayers. Know of my prayers for all of you.

SACRED HEART FACILITIES STRATEGIC PLAN

PHASE 1: CHURCH & RECTORY

\$890,000

CHURCH:

- **Tuckpointing** **\$100,000**
 - The bricks and mortar are deteriorating on the east wall of the church. The wall needs to be rebuilt.

- **New Boilers and Electrical Panel Boards Updates** **\$325,000**
 - The Church building requires a new, independent heating system.
 - There are 5 boilers in the basement of the adjacent school building, which service both the school and the church. The boilers were installed in 1959 and have reached the end of their serviceable lifespan.
 - As the school is now closed and the building is functionally obsolete, an independent heating system must be designed and installed in the basement of the church building to service the church alone.
 - The boilers in the school will remain to service the school building in a limited manner until the future of the school building is addressed.
 - Electrical panel board updates are necessary to power the new HVAC system.

- **A/C Replacement** **\$90,000**
 - The roof units servicing the church were installed in 1990 and have reached the end of their serviceable lifespan.

- **Maintenance to Parapet** **\$50,000**
 - Flashing and Sealant
 - Masonry

RECTORY:

- **HVAC Replacement and Electrical Upgrades** **\$300,000**
 - A new split system will be installed to replace the current radiant system.
 - The radiant heating system was installed in 1962. In 1992, it was modified to function also as a cooling system. The modification and poorly insulated plumbing have caused condensation within the walls and ceilings which has resulted in extensive plaster damage. Additionally, individual wall units have exceeded their serviceable lifespan.
 - Electrical updates are necessary to power the new HVAC system.

- **Complete Unfinished Guest Rooms** **\$25,000**
 - One suite, bath and bedroom was gutted in 2019 and never completed.

PHASE 2: STUTZKE & CHURCH

\$950,000

STUTZKE:

- **Demolish Building** **\$300,000**
 - The Stutzke Building served as the Sacred Heart Middle School prior to the 1980s when decreased school enrollment made the building unnecessary. Since that time, it has been poorly maintained. For example, the first floor was gutted and never renovated. For the past 30 years, the building has been used minimally, mainly for storage of unneeded equipment and SVD food pantry.

CHURCH:

- **Extensive masonry and tuckpointing to the Church** **\$300,000**
- **Roof replacement** **\$200,000**
- **Parking lot replacement** **\$150,000**

The Chalking of the Doors: An Epiphany Tradition Explained

The chalking of the doors is a centuries-old practice throughout the world, though it appears to be somewhat less well-known in the United States. It is, however, an easy tradition to adopt, and a great practice whereby we dedicate our year to God from its very outset, asking His blessing on our homes and on all who live, work, or visit them there.

The formula for the ritual is simple: take chalk of any color and write the following above the entrance of your home:

20 + C + M + B + 24.

The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the Magi — Caspar, Malchior, and Balthazar — who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, *Christus mansionem benedicat*: “May Christ bless the house.” The “+” signs represent the cross, and the “20” at the beginning and the “24” at the end mark the year. Taken together, this inscription is performed as a request for Christ to bless those homes so marked and that He stay with those who dwell therein throughout the entire year.

Practicing traditions like the chalking of the doors helps us to live our Faith more concretely and serve as an outward sign of our dedication to Our Lord. Our homes are also the place where many of us will make the greatest strides in our spiritual growth, through observance of daily prayer, spiritual reading, and work offered as an oblation to God.

Blessed chalk is available in the narthex of the church.

A booklet for the Epiphany Blessing of the home is printed on the next two pages of the bulletin.

EPIPHANY HOME BLESSING CEREMONY

The manger is decorated regally, containing the enthroned Christ Child. All gather around the manger.

Leader: God's peace be in this home,
All: And in all who live here.

Antiphon:

L: The star burned like a flame, pointing the way to God, the King of kings; the wise men saw the sign and brought their gifts in homage to their great King.

Canticle of Mary, the Magnificat, Luke 1:26-55:

All: My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior; for He has looked with favor on his lowly servant.

From this day all generations shall call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me, and holy is His Name.

He has mercy on those who fear Him in every generation. He has shown the strength of His arm, He has scattered the proud in their conceit.

He has cast down the mighty from their thrones and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things and the rich he has sent away empty.

He has come to the help of His servant Israel for He has remembered His promise of mercy, the promise He made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children forever.

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit As it was in the beginning is now and will be forever. Amen.

All: The star burned like a flame, pointing the way to God, the King of kings; the wise men saw the sign and brought their gifts in homage to their great King.

L: Many shall come from Sheba.

All: Bearing gold and incense.

L: O Lord, hear my prayer.

All: And let my cry come unto Thee.

L: Let us pray. O God, who by the guidance of a star did this day reveal your Only Begotten Son to the Gentiles, grant that we who know You by faith may be brought to the contemplation of the heavenly majesty, through the same Christ, Our Lord.

All: Amen.

All: Be enlightened and shine forth, O Jerusalem, for thy light is come, and upon thee is risen the glory of the Lord, Jesus Christ, born of the Virgin Mary.

L: Nations shall walk in your light, and kings in the brilliance of your rising.

All: And the glory of the Lord is risen upon you.

HOUSE BLESSING

P: Let us pray. O Lord, Almighty God, bless this house ✠ that it may become a shelter of health, chastity, self-conquest, humility, goodness, mildness, obedience to the commandments, and thanksgiving to God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Upon this house and those who dwell herein may Your blessing remain forever, through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

Proceed to the front door with the blessed chalk.

Final inscription on lintel should read: 2 0 + C + M + B + 2 4:

“The three wise men,

Caspar,	[Caspar inscribes ‘C’ on lintel]	C
Melchior,	[Melchior inscribes ‘M’]	M
and Balthasar	[Balthasar inscribes ‘B’]	B

followed the star of God’s Son who became man

two thousand	[The father inscribes the ‘2 0’ on left]	2 0
twenty-four years ago.	[The father inscribes ‘2 4’ on right]	2 4

“May Christ bless our dwelling, [The father places + after ‘2 0’]

and remain with us throughout the new year, [+ after ‘C’]

and grant that our comings and goings [+ after ‘M’]

Priest/Father: Almighty God, incline your ear. May you bless us and all who are gathered here. Send your holy angel who will defend us and fill with grace all who live here.

The father and the “Three Kings” now accompany the priest as he blesses the house with holy water. Everyone sings: We Three Kings of Orient Are:

We three Kings of Orient are; bearing gifts we traverse afar
Field and fountain, moor and mountain following yonder star.

Refrain: O star of wonder, star of night,

Star with royal beauty bright

Westward leading still proceeding,

Guide us to thy perfect light.

Born a babe on Bethlehem’s plain, Gold I bring to crown Him again
King forever, ceasing never Over us all to reign. **Refrain.**

Frankincense to offer have I; Incense owns a Deity nigh

Pray’r and praising, all men raising, Worship him God most high. **Refrain**

2. Diocesan policy requires that marriage preparation begin at least six months prior to the wedding.

Please inform the parish office if one of your family members is hospitalized at Good Samaritan Hospital, Elmhurst Hospital, or Central DuPage Hospital and you wish a priest to visit. Catholic chaplains are assigned to all hospitals to administer the Sacraments and care for the spiritual needs of patients. Kindly inform the information desk.

Notification of the Death of a Parishioner:

Upon the death of a parishioner, first contact the funeral home. The funeral home will contact the rectory for scheduling your funeral Mass. We will then reach out to you for Mass planning.

Once a funeral Mass is scheduled, it will immediately be posted on the bulletin board in the walkway between the church and school.

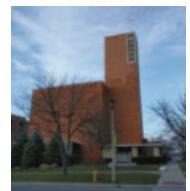
