

FR. LEE'S EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL REFLECTIONS

An interesting directive about receiving Communion says, "It is most desirable that the faithful, just as the Priest himself is bound to do, receive the Lord's Body from the hosts consecrated at the same Mass and that, in cases where this is foreseen, they partake of the chalice, so that even by means of signs, Communion may stand out more clearly as a participation in the sacrifice actually being celebrated" [The General Instruction of the Roman Missal #85].



Why such a directive? Aren't consecrated hosts reserved in the tabernacle just as much the Body of Christ as the hosts consecrated at a particular Mass? Of course they are!! But there is an important difference. The bread and wine brought forward to the altar by members of the assembly during the Presentation of the Gifts represent the lives of the people attending that particular celebration of the Eucharist. Receiving Communion (hosts and/or from the chalice) from the gifts presented and consecrated at the Mass in which they are offered is seen by the Church as another way of fully and actively participating by the faithful in the sacrifice being celebrated in this moment.

Although many parishes, including ours, do not follow this directive many times, can we find ways to make it happen at every Mass? It is important to note that consecrated hosts from previous Masses are reserved in the tabernacle so that Communion can be brought to the sick at home, the dying, and hospital patients by Eucharistic ministers. They are not meant to be used regularly to be the Communion received at scheduled parish Masses, whether on Sunday or weekdays. Exceptions to this practice can occur because of unforeseen pastoral need, but the presumption that Communion "from the tabernacle" as a regular practice is not to happen.



What is "most desirable" is not what is practical, easier, or the way we have gotten used to doing things. What is "most desirable" is that our ritual actions fully express that the gifts we bring to the altar at each celebration are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ and then given back to us so that we can become what we receive—the Body of Christ washed clean in his Blood at home, at work, at play, and in service to those in need. What could be more desirable than for our Eucharistic rituals to inform and strengthen our Eucharistic faith?




