

# From the Pastor



Dear Parishioners:

June 9th would be the Feast of St. Ephrem, however Sunday takes precedence. Ephrem lived from 306— 373. He was a deacon from Syria who is the only Syrian proclaimed as a Doctor of the Church. He would take the popular songs of heretical groups, and using their melodies, comprise beautiful hymns of orthodox doctrine. Ephrem became one of the first to

introduce song in public worship. He earned the title "Harp of the Holy Spirit."

June 11th we remember St. Barnabas. He is closely associated with St. Paul. Paul and Barnabas were official representative to the Church in Antioch. The word Barnabas means "son of encouragement." He encouraged others in the Faith.

June 11th we also remember Fr. William Howard Bishop. He lived from December 19, 1885 until June 11, 1953. In March of 1936, Fr. Bishop published a plan for a society of Catholic Home Missions to operate in rural sections where Catholics numbered as few as one tenth of one percent of the population. The following year he was invited ty Archbishop John McNicholas of Cincinnati to found such a society. Within two years he acquired six students and a priest. In 1949 he started a theological seminary in Glendale, Ohio. The Glenmary Lay Brothers and Glenmary Home Mission Sisters organized by Fr. Bishop were also approved to work in rural areas where there was no Catholic presence or very small presence. Fr. Bishop said, "There was never a time when missionary activity was more needed in our beloved land than it is today."

June 12, 1929 is the birthday of Anne Frank. The story of Anne Frank was recorded in her diary. For two years her family survived in a secret annex during the Nazi occupation of Amsterdam. It recorded her hopes and dreams. In her diary she wrote, "I still believe that people are really good at heart. I simply can't build up my hopes on a foundation consisting of confusion, misery and death. I see the world gradually being turned into a wilderness. I hear the every approaching thunder, which will destroy us too. I can feel the sufferings of millions and yet if I look up into the heavens, I think that it will all come right, that this cruelty too will end, and that peace and tranquility will return again." The date of her death is unknown. She died at the age of 15 of typhoid sometime in March, 1945 in a concentration camp.

June 13th is the Feast of St. Anthony of Padua (1195— 1231). He joined the Augustinian Order. Later when the Franciscan Martyrs bodies went through the town where he was stationed, he decided to enter the Franciscan Order. After illness prevented him from preaching to the Moors, he was stationed at a small hermitage where he spent most of his time praying, recalling Scripture, and doing menial tasks. His call came when asked to preach at the last minute at an ordination. His sermon was outstanding, and from then on he attracted great crowds all over Italy. He

was recognized as a man of prayer and a great Scripture and theology scholar. Anthony became the first to teach theology to the other Friars.

On June 14, 1941 the Soviets started to deport from Lithuania over 280,000 people to Siberian gulags after Soviet troops occupied Lithuania.

June 15th we remember St. Germaine Cousin (1579— 1601). She was born near Toulouse, France. She lost her mother at an early age. She was raised by her father, who was a farmer, and a stepmother who despised the young girl with a paralyzed right arm and other maladies. She was kept from her stepbrothers and stepsisters. She was forced to live on leftover food and table scraps. She slept in a stable or under the stairs. She never learned to read or write. At an early age she was sent to tend the sheep. There she found comfort in talking to God in prayer. Young children gathered around her, drawn by her innate goodness. The sheep never strayed when she went off to daily Mass. Slowly word got around about her holiness. Her stepmother offered her a bed at home but she preferred her humble arrangements. She was found dead on her bed of straw. The people of the village knew a saint had lived among them. She was canonized in 1867.

June 15th we remember Venerable Thomas Choe Yang-eop (1821—1861). He was known as the "St. Paul of Korea" and a "martyr of sweat." Fr. Thomas who was a native Korean, walked more than 1,500 miles each year ministering to the persecuted Christians scattered throughout the Joseon Kingdom, which is present day North and South Korea. He traveled by day and celebrated the Sacraments and had Mass in people houses at night. He fostered vocations, assisted other missionaries, and translated prayers and catechetical books into the Korean language. Fr. Thomas died June 15, 1861 of typhoid and exhaustion.

May 23, 2024, a second miracle through the intercession of Blessed Carlo Acutis was recognized. No date has been set for his canonization. From the age of 7 he tried to receive the Eucharist daily, and go to confession regularly. He also said the Rosary daily. He was into computers and devised a Eucharistic Miracles education exhibit. He died in 2006 at the age of 15. His body is incorrupt and is in Assisi.

Servant of God Mother Mary Lange was recently declared Venerable. She founded a free school for Black children since public schools would not accept Black children,. She also founded the Oblate Sisters of Providence.

Pope Francis has asked us to pray for vocations. In Europe, in the space of ten years, they have lost 27,000 priests, 6,000 seminarians, and 80,000 sisters, according to 2023 figures. With the exception of Africa, all continents are experiencing a decline of the number of seminarians



# Knights of Columbus Blood Drive







# GOSPEL MEDITATION—ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

#### June 9, 2024 10<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time


Jesus asks us a stunning question this week: "**How can Satan cast out Satan?**" To enter into this question opens up the often-hidden dynamics of what Jesus has done and is constantly doing. If we're honest, our response to some degree is: "How *else* can we cast him out? Satan is *precisely* how we cast out Satan!" But Jesus wants us to see this finally does not work. Here's what I mean.

Satanas names the demonic mechanism by which we render wholeness through accusation. When we face a threat, we seek something to protect us (e.g., more money, social status, security, power, etc.). Rivals inevitably arise for these things and so do tensions. Accusation presents itself. "I'll never be successful unless I get ahead of that guy." "She's already trying to get ahead of me." "That group of immigrants is trying to take our jobs." And so on. The accusation grows into a fear-inducing threat — things will break apart — no, they already are! Hurry! We inflict violence on the victim and — as if by magic — peace ensues. For a time. Soon fresh accusations are required to hold new chaos at bay, until there is no community left at all. This is essentially humankind's sad history in a nutshell.

Jesus' cross and resurrection unmasks this broken system of "casting out Satan by Satan" and ushers in a new one he calls "the Kingdom of God." He reveals that the dynamic of accusation is nothing compared to his power of divine mercy and love. The cross (and not Satan) is the real power to tear down strongholds of sin and cast out Satan. This is why he describes himself as the "**stronger man who ties up the strong man to plunder his house**." This week let's notice the ways we "**cast out Satan by Satan**," and then refuse to do it anymore. Because in the long run, that divided house cannot stand.

#### WEEKLY STEWARDSHIP RECOMMENDATION

Consider zero-waste options for picnics, BBQ and camping meals. Reusable items add a touch of class, sensibility and significantly reduce waste. Use lightweight reusable plates, utensils, bowls, cups and cloth napkins. Get creative with packaging. Reusable containers? Of course. What about Mason jar desserts? Go heavy on finger foods: cut vegetables and mixed nuts. Wipe off food when finished and use a washable cloth bag to hold used dinnerware for dishwashing later. Reserve a bag for recyclables and a container for compostables. If you must go disposable, use biodegradable paper products instead of plastic. Ditch the straws. Use a large thermos for drinks. Take other beverages in metal or glass containers and recycle. Skipping bottled water saves money and the environment.

# Thrive spiritually in today's secular world


One challenge for contemporary Catholics is balancing a faithful, God-centered life with the secular temptations of modern society. Here's how we can constructively engage with the world while staying devout:

June 26 – St. Josemaría Escrivá (1975). Born in Barbastro, Spain in 1902, St. Josemaría was ordained a priest in 1925. He ministered secretly during the religious persecution of the Spanish Civil War. In 1928, he founded the Opus Dei organization for those living in the world to become holy by dedicating their daily duties to God.
