

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Happy 27th Sunday of Ordinary Time! Silent Retreat was a peaceful and restful time with the Lord. Sometimes folks ask what one does on a silent retreat? A typically day consists in some restful sleep with no alarm clock followed by morning prayer and a holy hour in prayer. After breakfast, one can go for a walk and read followed by another holy hour and Mass. After lunch, there is time to exercise, nap, and read followed by another holy hour. After dinner, people typically pray or read until bed. You also meet with your spiritual director everyday either in the morning or afternoon for about 30 minutes.

Reminder, In preparation for the Eucharistic Congress, we will be having a Parish Corpus Christi Procession on **Oct. 15 after 10am Mass**. There will be an open house after the procession with snacks and refreshments at the Parish Office and New Rectory. This will be an opportunity for all parishioners to see the new updates.

As I mentioned last week in my homily, I encourage you to participate in the Eucharistic Procession. We are blessed to be able to participate in our Faith publicly, while in other countries they can be arrested or stoned for doing an Eucharist Procession.

A couple of details on the Procession, it will be one loop around our Church along the sidewalks starting at Holy Family Statue in Parking lot. We then will process down the sidewalk to the front digital sign by Franklin Street. We will then process up the sidewalk towards the school and then conclude in the Church. The procession will last around 30 minutes.

You do not need to attend 10am Mass to participate in the Procession. The Procession will begin roughly at 10:50am in the parking lot by the Holy Family Statue. I am humbly asking, if you attend 10am Mass that week, to participate in the procession. It is only once a year, so I humbly ask you to adjust your Mass plans that weekend for the Procession. I don't want people exiting in cars from the parking lot during the procession for safety reasons and out of respect to our Eucharistic Lord in the Monstrance.



Dear Friends in the Lord,

I am aware that many worthy charities outside our diocese contact you annually for financial support. In the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois, along with parish and diocesan giving, I am reminding parishes and schools of our policy on Fundraising for Missions (\$9000 Fundraising for Missions) and ask for support of the Pontifical Mission Societies (PMS), which includes: the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, Missionary Childhood Association (MCA), Society of St. Peter the Apostle, and the Missionary Union of Priests and Religious.

In addition to our diocesan policy, Church documents direct that the Pontifical Mission Societies should be given "first place" *[Ad Gentes no. 38]* and "the leading role" *[Redemptoris Missio no. 84]* in the Church's work of missionary formation through their material support, benefiting the poorest in the world. Each of us need to support that work as best we can.

Parishes, schools, and religious education programs may elect to support other worthy charities, but this should be *in addition* to their works of prayer and sacrifice through the Pontifical Mission Societies. I also ask that you carefully research any additional groups you choose to support to ensure that their work follows Catholic teaching. The Pontifical Mission Societies, given their standing in the Church internationally, are in the position to vet credentials of other Catholic mission relief groups. If you require assistance, contact our diocesan Office for the Missions at (217) 698-8500.


Following these guidelines should help better support the universal evangelization efforts of the Church through the Pontifical Mission Societies.
