Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Second Sunday of Easter or Sunday of Divine Mercy. The Lord is risen as He promised. Let us rejoice and be glad in the miracle of the risen Lord. Christ's resurrection provides us the grace of courage as His new disciples on earth. His Apostles were confused and frightened after His death. But after His resurrection He appeared and said to them "Do not be afraid." He breathed on them and reassured them of His continued presence with them until the end of time. Instantly, none of them seemed to be lost in the intimidation of the religious leaders of their era anymore or afraid of their threats, accusations or their harsh sayings. Rather, in the name of the risen Lord even the shadows of the Apostles were able to heal many sick people.

The role of Thomas in today's Gospel reading cannot be overemphasized. At Christ's first appearance to the Apostles, Thomas was not present. Therefore, he doubted the testimony of the other Apostles. He declared that he would not believe unless he saw Christ by himself and put his hands in His wounds. Jesus understood that Thomas needed more than a second-hand report of His resurrection to engage his faith. So, Christ returned to give Thomas what he needed to get on board. In a similar way, many of your family members and friends may need a little more than your first invitation or a witness to win them back to the Lord.

Christ does not settle for a Church that cares only for the 99 sheep and leaves the skeptical one to wallow or be forgotten in the dust of sin. In His heavenly roll call, there will be perfect attendance. All 100 sheep must be present and be accounted for. We have a great responsibility to look for the lost sheep in our families and in communities and bring them back on board. If we do this, at the end of our lives on earth, our Lord and Savior would say to us "Well done, my good and faithful servant, receive the throne prepared for you since the foundation of the world."

Thank you very much for your support for our beautiful parish by helping to make our Easter celebration this year memorable. May the God of mercy and consolation bless you and your loved ones as we continue to be faithful witnesses of Christ's resurrection. You're invited to participate in our parish's Divine Mercy celebration at 3:00PM, with Confession at 2:00PM. I will return to our parish update message next week. Have a blessed week!

"Following the death of Supreme Pontiff Francis, notice is hereby given that the Eucharistic celebration and Rite of Canonization of Blessed Carlo Acutis, scheduled for April 27, 2025, II Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy, on the occasion of the Jubilee of Adolescents, is suspended," the Holy See Press Office said in a statement on April 21.

What Happens Now

The Transition of Power: Sede Vacante

With the pope's passing, the Vatican enters a period known as *sede vacante*, meaning "the seat is vacant." During this time:

- The College of Cardinals assumes temporary leadership of the Church.
- No major decisions or changes are made until a new pope is elected.

Novemdiales

Pope Francis's death will be followed by a nine-day mourning period called *Novemdiales*, a tradition that dates back to Roman times. Vatican flags will fly at half-staff, and the bronze doors of St Peter's Basilica are closed.

The Election of a New Pope

The process of selecting a new pope is known as the conclave. Two to three weeks after the funeral, eligible cardinals (those under 80 years old) gather in the Sistine Chapel to vote. The election follows these steps:

- The chapel is sealed off, ensuring secrecy.
- Cardinals cast their votes in rounds, with a two-thirds majority required to elect a new pope.
- If no candidate is chosen, ballots are burned with chemicals to produce black smoke, signaling an inconclusive vote.
- When a new pope is elected, white smoke rises, announcing the decision to the world.
- The newly elected pope chooses a name and steps onto the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica, where the world hears the famous announcement: *Habemus Papam!*—"We have a pope!"

Sacraments

Baptism: To schedule a Baptism, please begin by calling the parish office. Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month immediately after the 11AM Mass. Consider scheduling your child's Baptism before your child is born to ensure an opening in the month of your choice. A Baptism preparation class, held on the 3rd Sunday of the month at 10AM, is required for the parents. You may take the class before your child is born. ***You must be a registered parishioner of St. Patrick prior to scheduling a Baptism.***

Matrimony: Couples planning to marry need to meet with the Liturgy Director to begin the process before a wedding date can be finalized. Please contact the parish office to setup an initial meeting **at least 6 months prior to any requested marriage date.** This initial meeting will give you an overview of the requirements for marriage and the preparation required. ***At least one of the couple, or their parents, must be registered parishioners for at least 6 months and be active participating members of St. Patrick Church in order to be married at the church.*** Both individuals must be at least 19 years of age. **Please Note:** If either party has been previously married, regardless of faith, an annulment is required prior to beginning marriage preparation.

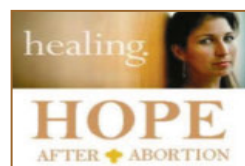

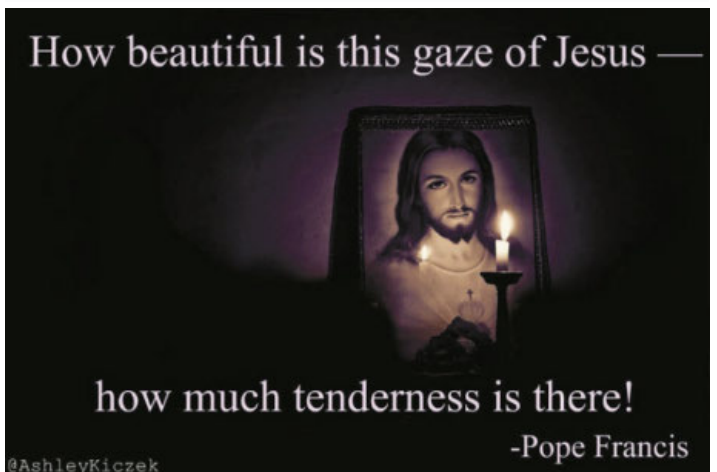

Through the Pilgrim Icon Program, councils arrange to host the current program icon. Our council has previously hosted the St. Joseph Icon. The Sacred Heart Icon Program features an icon depicting the most famous image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, painted in 1767 by Pompeo Batoni and now venerated in the Church of the Gesu in Rome. The reproduction bears the blessing of Pope Francis, through the Papal Almoner, and is one of more than 300 icons traveling across the world, from council to council for veneration and use in prayer services.

The icon will be presented to the parish at the beginning of the 4:00PM Mass on Saturday, May 17th and will remain in the sanctuary until Wednesday, May 21st.

Please join us on **Sunday, May 18th at 6:00PM** for a Sacred Heart Holy Hour. The hour will include readings from Sacred Scripture, reflections from Pope Francis on the Sacred Heart, as well as the Divine Mercy Chaplet, prayers to the Sacred Heart and time for silent prayer. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament with

Benediction will be included in the Holy Hour.

In follow-up to the Holy Hour, families are encouraged to enthrone the Sacred Heart in the homes by placing an image of the Sacred Heart in a place of honor and conducting an entronement ceremony.






