

Jeremiah 31:15; Matthew 2:18

December 28, the Feast of the Holy Innocents, recalls the slaughter of the male babies of Bethlehem under the orders of Herod who was fearful his kingship would be usurped by Jesus, the newborn King of the Jews. In our own day this Feast aptly relates to the killing of innocent, defenseless persons in the womb through the crime of abortion, legal in America since 1973.

Conversations around current events have brought to light an industry directly associated with abortion. This is the industry of fetal tissue harvesting for medical research and testing and the creation of fetal cell lines. These are used extensively by pharmaceutical companies to create and test vaccines and other medical products as well as by food producers to test additives.

What is done in darkness will be shouted from the housetops...cf Luke 12:3

This past May, **Catholic World Report** carried a well-researched two-part essay by Monica Seeley, *Exploring the Dark World of Vaccines and Fetal Tissue Research.* It detailed the complex and disturbing relationship between the creation of vaccines, the eugenics movement, and the abortion industry. As part of her investigation, Seeley interviewed Pamela Acker, author of *Vaccination: A Catholic Perspective.* Her statement on a Catholic news website last January that "the unborn babies used for vaccine development were alive at tissue extraction" have revealed the barbaric nature of fetal tissue harvesting. Acker resigned from her PhD vaccine development project at Catholic University after coming face to face with the evil surrounding fetal cell research and discovering that her project involved the use of HEK-293, the cell line derived from the kidney of a baby aborted in the Netherlands in 1972. The Vatican's 2006 Dignitas Personae reinforced her decision. "The Church was very clear in Dignitas Personae that researchers cannot use these cells. It's not complicated. It's right there," she said.

Acker dispels the myth that these cell lines are created using spontaneous abortions or miscarriages. Live tissue is needed! Seeley's digging into published medical research papers verified Pamela Acker's statement that fetuses are alive while being dissected, an additional act of violence directed to another human being. This atrocity continues today with the creation of new fetal cell lines. Federally funded research programs at universities or medical centers partner with abortion providers to actually schedule the abortions. Fetuses age 2 to five months gestation are delivered via hysterotomy and are alive, hearts still beating when the researchers start extracting organs and tissue. No anesthetic is given as this would disrupt the cells being extracted which must be done within five minutes of the abortion; dead tissue is useless for creating living cell lines. Dismemberment abortions are also arranged so as not to damage the desired organs.

Astonishingly, documented scientific papers show that this method of live "in vivo" fetal dissection dates back to the 1930s beginning with the creation of the polio vaccines of Sabin and Salk. Though abortion was illegal then, a double standard associated with the eugenics movement allowed abortion and sterilization at the New York Belleview Hospital for "insane and feeble minded women." Abortion after abortion since then was done in the service of vaccine research and production, including the production of the MMR and Varivax chickenpox vaccines.

This troubling partnership of abortion with the pharmaceutical and food industries continues strong today. The 1973 fetal cell line HEK-293 is used extensively. There is a continual demand for human fetal cell lines, both finite and immortalized. The Cellosaurus database in May of this year listed 1,559 human fetal cell lines and cell strains commercially available to researchers and manufacturers, and more are being created.

Let that number sink in. Think about it next time someone argues that 'it was just one or two abortions and it was so long ago'...

Monica Seeley's articles and the Pamela Acker interview are readily available online. Why is this information—documented, using industry records, not conjecture or vague rumors—not better known, even among people who are ardently pro-life and otherwise well informed?


Science and technology have brought great benefits to the world. But they are not God. When solutions are created and developed apart from Him the door is opened to great evil. And when we see evil we do not cooperate with it or try to benefit from it, we flee from it. This practice needs to stop, the bodies and cell lines of these children, put to rest.

We didn't know...but now that we do, this is a crushing load. A cry like that of Rachael in Ramah of anguished sorrow and repentance needs to rise up from the earth to the Heart of God. Against the power of multi-billion dollar industries, what can we do? On the spiritual level, offer a great outpouring of reparation, love and adoration to Jesus in the Mass and the Blessed Sacrament. What is done to His littlest ones is done to Him. On the human level, work in a spirit of Hope with organizations dedicated to ending human fetal harvesting, trafficking and testing, listed at the bottom of this article.

So we have work to do. We live in this time, we have an opportunity to do something. May the Holy Innocents of Bethlehem guide our actions.

This week and next all the children who participate in Catechesis is of the Good Shepherd celebrate Christmas in the Atrium.
