May you be blessed with a deep of awareness of God being born of Mary!!!

The Christmas season calls us to a profound need of once again being passionate about the will of God in our lives and following in the example of Mary, Joseph, the Shepherds, the Kings and the people of faith across the centuries. We need not be trapped in the sentimentality of the season as this leads to nothingness and a shallow path, but our call is to be shaken out of our routine of believing and be moved by the reality of God becoming a human being. The “yes” of Mary through the gift of the Spirit needs to be our starting point and we recognize how we are looked at by the Spirit of Jesus now and long to stay with Mary and learn from her heart.

You may recall the ministry of St. Damian of Molokai to the lepers on the Hawaiian Island. While serving those isolated to the Island, he too became a leper and daily repeated: “The good God knows what is best for my sanctification. I daily repeat from my heart, ‘Thy will be done’.” Of course, we say this too every time we pray the Our Father, but often for me it is once again a routine phrase that just passes over along with my distractions. St. Catherine of Siena was also a profound example of being open to the will of God as she states: “Do not be satisfied with little things, because God wants great things.” Great things happen when we follow and know the will of God in love and we need to be looking from a place of need and longing.

To have a desire to be open to the will of God is not abstract. I quote from an author in this reflection about Mary: “To hope means to trust. In facing an angel – an otherworldly being – Mary trusts. Greeted with loving assurance and told of an incomprehensible role, Mary trusts. She trusts as God who created her, a God who loves her, a God who accompanies her, and a God who will deliver her. She trusts because she knows that the God who speaks to her is Truth itself. And when she confides in her cousin Elizabeth, her lips spill forth the greatest of poetry. Mary speaks of greatness and blessing, mercy and holiness, goodness and fullness. It is the poetry of hope.”

This poetry of hope is filled with the promise of all the possibilities that the Magnificat offers to us as Mary states: “for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name.” Mary calls us not to be afraid and I turn to Joseph who received the message from an Angel: Do not be afraid! I have been so enthusiastic to begin the unfolding as Pope Francis proclaims the “Year of St. Joseph”. In a new Apostolic Letter entitled *Patris corde*, (“With a Father’s Heart”), Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient and accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows.

In the Christmas time, I offer one section of the letter from Pope Francis about fatherhood:

“Fathers are not born, but made,” says Pope Francis. “A man does not become a father simply by bringing a child into the world, but by taking up the responsibility to care for that child.” Unfortunately, in today’s society, children “often seem orphans, lacking fathers” who are able to introduce them “to life and reality.” Children, the Pope

says, need fathers who will not try to dominate them, but instead raise them to be “capable of deciding for themselves, enjoying freedom and exploring new possibilities.”

This is the sense in which St. Joseph is described as a “most chaste” father, which is the opposite of domineering possessiveness. Joseph, says Pope Francis, “knew how to love with extraordinary freedom. He never made himself the centre of things. He did not think of himself but focused instead on the lives of Mary and Jesus.”

Happiness for Joseph involved a true gift of self: “In him, we never see frustration, but only trust,” writes Pope Francis. “His patient silence was the prelude to concrete expressions of trust.” Joseph stands out, therefore, as an exemplary figure for our time, in a world that “needs fathers,” and not “tyrants”; a society that “rejects those who confuse authority with authoritarianism, service with servility, discussion with oppression, charity with a welfare mentality, power with destruction.”

True fathers, instead, “refuse to live the lives of their children for them,” and instead respect their freedom. In this sense, says Pope Francis, a father realizes that “he is most a father and an educator at the point when he becomes ‘useless,’ when he sees that his child has become independent and can walk the paths of life unaccompanied.” Being a father, the Pope emphasizes, “has nothing to do with possession, but is rather a ‘sign’ pointing to a greater fatherhood”: that of the “heavenly Father”.

Learn about our Patron:

Saint John the Evangelist—Feast Day December 27th.

St. John was also known as the "beloved disciple" or "the disciple Jesus loved." He is an example of someone who lived with a simple, but deep love for Jesus. He encouraged all believers to love Jesus and to love one another. Church tradition has held that he is the author of the Gospel of John and four other books of the New Testament — the three Epistles of John and the Book of Revelation. John was the only one of the Twelve Apostles who did not leave Jesus during His final hour on the cross before he died. John stood faithfully at the cross where Jesus gave his mother to John and to all of us. John stayed with Mary and continued to take care of her. As you may know we have a devotional space dedicated to St. John the Evangelist and Mary that depicts a beautiful interpretation of their relationship.




Idea to Celebrate our Patron's feast:

St. John's Day was a general day of celebration in medieval times, not only as the third day of Christmas but also to celebrate the Feast day of St. John the Evangelist/Apostle. The significant part of the traditional celebration was the blessing and drinking of wine. This is because, according to legend, St. John once drank a cup of poisoned wine without suffering any harm. In central Europe people still practice the custom of bringing wine and cider into the church to be blessed. While this year we won't be inviting you to come to the Church to have wine blessed (hopefully next year!) you could still celebrate our Patron St. John the Evangelist in your home on December 27th by toasting a glass of red wine or of some sparkling cider!
