THE MANY WAYS YOU “LISTENED” THEN ACTED FOR OTHERS...

Be a Santa for a Senior Program was coordinated and implemented by St. John parishioner and high school student, Dominick Nowakowski. This is Dominick's reflection of this personal and community experience:

“When we were young, every Christmas we'd pull a couple of tags off a Christmas tree at CVS and create two care packages for seniors in need. The program stopped when I was in middle school and I was unable to get a similar program running with my student council. In my work as a Youth Commissioner this year, I was in contact with Ms. Loeffler at Family Service Rochester. Knowing this community organization serves those in need, I asked her if she knew of any seniors who would be alone this Christmas, that I hoped to get together a group of volunteers to provide gifts for them. She took the project to her team, and they responded with a list of 9 seniors. Some had pets, one had no heat, several were sad and lonely and many had no internet. Their needs were humble - something warm, something for their pets, something to brighten their day.

Christmas in my family is a happy occasion, filled with excitement, extended family, customs and traditions, special dishes and prayers. I couldn't imagine others who live close by having nothing and no one. The isolation this year has made it even harder on them. I created a Signup Genius, with two slots for each senior and appealed to my group of Youth Commissioners, my high school, and reached out to St. John's Church. Megan Rodriguez responded immediately with hope and support and connected parishioners and St. John's youth by sharing the project and the sign-up link. The responses were incredible. St. John's families filled 11 of the 18 spots. The personalized care packages from all the volunteers were beautifully wrapped with individual cards for each senior, one even provided customized additional gifts for other seniors on the list. Their thoughtfulness, generosity, and selfless giving was an inspiration of the true meaning of Christmas.

The following were responses from the seniors: "I saw and read the cards from the young people who picked out these gifts...I never expected this...Eli wouldn't leave me alone until I opened every single thing he got. And of course he loved the treats he got. Thank you so much. I loved everything.", "Yvonne called to say how much the gift from your group made her Christmas so special! She said she has been so lonely and Christmas is an especially hard time for her since losing her daughter, and for the first time in 12 years she felt blessed and loved because of the thoughtful gift she received from your group. She says she opened the gift on Christmas Eve with the help of her rabbit, who was delighted to find treats for him!" Thank you for bringing a little love into the lives of so many others this year and for inspiring me that as a teen, we can make a difference.”

With all the ways 2020 found to upend, confound, and perplex us, it provided opportunities to listen more carefully to the longings of people near and far. Most we have known for a long time, relatives and friends, but others we don't know. It was clear that our needs and longings were different but wove a tapestry with familiar and essential threads – relationship, connection, presence, reassurance, remembrance, and hope. I found my faith to be the thread that bound these longings together. It was love that allowed my response as a helper in weaving this community of caring. Our offerings, God makes holy and grace-filled!

On the backside, it all appears unclear and chaotic, trying to pull all the threads together. Organizations that had served families and individuals with Christmas giving found ways to adjust and continue. New ways to serve our neighbors in need surfaced and you responded from the desire of your hearts to love as God has shown us Love, in the person of Jesus, the Christ.

We have responded to God on behalf of the love for his people. As we prepared to celebrate the coming of God among us, in the helpless, vulnerable form of a human child, other lonely, vulnerable people were brought to our attention with needs so much more acute at this time. We have "listened" to what lonely, vulnerable, needy families, individuals, and seniors have expressed as their needs. You have responded from the generosity of your hearts to acknowledge people who are your neighbors that you have never met.

We partnered with "Adopt-A-Family" through Lutheran Social Services and Olmsted County as we have done for many years. This year Jan Vetter, coordinator of this program, rallied us to provide gift cards...

"Thanks to you about 800+ people have an extra boost to purchase food or a needed clothing item. Some parents have been furloughed, lost jobs, become teachers at home, while trying to keep the bills paid. Many larger families with teens distance learning and eating all meals at home have struggled to provide extra food. Your extra gift cards met this need. Another special thanks!!!"

We also partnered with **Family Promise Rochester** in this unusual time to help with gifts for families in this supported housing network. Our parishioners worked with Nicollette, program coordinator, to provide and deliver gifts to some of these families working their way to a more stable, secure life.

Many of you offered **special support to St. John** which allowed us to respond to the seasonal needs of those who seek help from our community of faith. Like a single Mom who was tearfully grateful to be able to provide some kind of gift and food to celebrate Christmas with her kids.

Christmas Anonymous arranged a monumental re-organization to offer a "drive-thru" pickup of pre-selected gifts, and food boxes for families. In addition, a semi-load of food boxes was delivered to Seniors.

How beautiful that God took what we were willing and grateful to offer and changed it into caring, love, celebration, and hope for others. Jesus truly lives and walks and breathes His Spirit among us!

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION


Our readings today focus on the vital attributes of being a disciple of Christ.

The Gospel of John portrays these attributes as he bears witness to Jesus' first disciples. Upon seeing Jesus, John proclaims, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The lamb is a reference to the Jewish sacrificial offering at Passover and reveals Jesus as Savior. Once the two that were with John heard this, they immediately followed Jesus. Jesus turned to them and asked, "What are you looking for?" They responded with, "Rabbi, where are you staying?"

Imagine Jesus asking you, "What are you looking for?" We might respond with answers like a better job, more kids, retirement, or any number of things that we think will make our lives better. The things we seek may be righteous, but as disciples of Christ, we should first and foremost seek the Kingdom of God. If we strive to respond to Jesus' question in the same way the first disciples responded, essentially by asking, "Where are you, Lord?" then we will not be disappointed with the outcome.

Our story of Jesus' first disciples concludes with Andrew intentionally sharing the Good News of Christ to his brother Simon Peter. Andrew had the gift of meeting the Lord and did not hoard it to himself. Instead, he sought his brother and proclaimed what he had experienced, which serves as a reminder for us. Our calling is to be missionary disciples — to seek the Lord and share what we have found. Our faith is a gift! We should strive to share this gift with others.
