

Dear Friends in Christ:

We are Michael and Amanda Hessenauer, and we have been parishioners of St. John for the past six years.

For our first few years in the parish, we attended Mass on Sunday and went home immediately afterward. We are both generally shy and quiet and take a long time to adjust to new situations. Over time, God spoke to us through parish members and staff who invited us to be more involved in the parish community. One Sunday, the people sitting in front of us invited us to join the choir. Amanda joined and loved serving through music. Amanda also responded to Philip's (RCIA director) invitation and served as an RCIA sponsor for a colleague and dear friend. We made friends with the people who sat near us regularly at Mass. We were feeling a greater sense of belonging to the parish, but then the pandemic hit. The choir could not sing, and we could not meet with anybody. We missed worshipping as a community at Mass.

We were thrilled when St. John reopened for in-person Mass. Shortly after we returned, Sebastian, our music director, volunteered us to assist with the many necessary safety precautions. We were happy to help and quickly learned more about our parish community. We have been checking in people as they come to Mass. We have gotten to know many other parishioners by name during this time. We can sense that people come to church with many different emotions and attitudes. We are honored to be part of the human fabric that makes up our parish community.

Amanda has always appreciated the attention and importance placed on art at St. John. Art is a perfect reminder to pause and contemplate the depth and goodness of the Lord. From the beautiful stained glass windows, to the statues in the Chapel, Church, and Gathering Space, each has provided instruction, repose, and inspiration at various times of prayer. Stopping by the church for quiet prayer during the week offers renewal in the days between Sunday Mass.

We are all part of the universal Catholic Church, and our parish brings the universal Church to us. The parish is not a group of people who meet once weekly and happen to be Catholic. We should be on a mission, and we all belong to the Body of Christ. We need to live the gospel in all areas of our lives, and becoming part of the parish community strengthens our resolve.

WELCOME BACK TO MASS

Bishop Quinn will reinstate the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy days beginning the weekend of July 3-4, 2021.

As stated in the Minnesota Catholic Conference “Back to Mass Statement”:

Attending the in-person celebration of Sunday Mass and receiving Jesus in the Eucharist are vital to our lives as Catholic Christians. We were created for Communion. Whether you are returning to your home parish, or seeking a local parish on vacation, your participation in the Mass unites you with the Church — the Body of Christ. This communion transforms us as persons and enables us to make manifest the Kingdom of God in our world. The celebration of the Eucharist truly is the source and summit of our faith.

St. John Chrysostom reminds us, “You cannot pray at home as at church, where there is a great multitude, where exclamations are cried out to God as from one great heart, and where there is something more: the union of minds, the accord of souls, the bond of charity, the prayers of the priests.” (CCC 2179)

As always, there are circumstances where individuals may not be obligated to go to Sunday Mass. If you are sick, a caregiver for children or the elderly, or are unable to attend Mass through no fault of your own, then you are not obligated to come to Mass. There may be additional circumstances that exempt you from attending Mass; if you have questions about your specific situation, you are encouraged to discuss them with Father Mahon. CREATION CARE CHALLENGE – DEATH, RESURRECTION, LIVING NEW LIFE INTO BEING

“Journeying Towards Care for Our Common Home: five years after Laudato Si’” By Isabella Piro

First Part (contd):

Centrality of schools and universities

... schools are invited ... to become a place to develop the capacity for discernment, critical thinking, and responsible action. ... (1) to facilitate links between the home, the school, and the parish; and (2) to launch training projects for “ecological citizenship”, which should promote among young people “a new model of relationships” ... beyond individualism in favor of solidarity, responsibility, and care. Universities are invited to center their curricula on a backbone of integral ecology. Through their three-fold mission of teaching, research, and service to society, ... to encourage students to engage in “professions that facilitate positive environmental change”. ...

Ecumenical and interreligious dialogue

The document also reaffirms that “the commitment to caring for our common home is an integral part of Christian life”, and not a secondary option. ... care for our common home is “an excellent area” to build ecumenical and interreligious dialogue and collaboration. ...

Ecology of the media

The first part of the document concludes with a chapter dedicated to communication and its “profound analogy” with the care of our common home. Both, in fact, are based on “communion, relationship, and connection”. In the context of an “ecology of the media”, the media are urged to highlight the links between “human destiny and the natural environment”, while empowering citizens, and combating “fake news”. Human life and dignity reflect directly on our care for creation. Care for all life and creation, with a particular emphasis on the most poor and vulnerable, show the deep interconnectedness of us all. Broad dialogue will enhance our addressing of the needs of creation by accessing a diverse array of “wisdom” and truth about our common home.


