Dear Friends in Christ,

On a very warm day in June, I am writing my experience of the Co-Cathedral St. John the Evangelist being a welcoming community to all who come through any one of its many doors. When the COVID-19 pandemic appeared, within days the parish staff experienced its challenges. I am reflecting my experience as a Sister of St. Francis coming here to Mass on Sundays and not Assisi Heights. The doors of Assisi Heights have been closed to the public, including the Sisters not residing there. Only recently have the doors gradually opened for us to come to Sunday Mass and visit the resident Sisters.

The pandemic seemed to consume our lives. Doors were closed to the familiar we took for granted bringing about incredible challenges for us. As this happened I felt an explosion of creativity among our parish staff, which I call the grace of God. They set about providing for the sacramental life as a parish. I am grateful to a staff with responsibilities known and unknown for maintaining a smooth operation of the parish life we take for granted at any other given time. There are unforeseen surprises, all part of life for any of us. For me, the St. John's staff as followers of Jesus continued to make known the presence of Christ among themselves and with every person coming through a social media door, while going about their daily tasks embodied in the sacramental life of our vibrant parish.

In time the 9:30 Mass was live-streamed. Shortly after, the doors for the 4:30 Mass were opened. Then on a cold January Sunday morning I heard Fr. Jerry at "announcement time" what sounded like an urgent call for liturgical ministers for the 11:15 Mass being added to the schedule. After months of sheltering in place, the vaccine opened a door for me to squeeze through. I volunteered to serve as a liturgical minister wherever the greatest need might be, after I completed my vaccination time.

Shortly thereafter, I heard from Margaret that Cindy would contact me when the first of March got closer. Training and protocols would be provided for me as for all the liturgical volunteers. I would be scheduled for whatever the greatest need be: Eucharistic Minister, Lector or Hospitality at the registration table. Hospitality at the registration desk intrigued me as I waited. Then came my assignment, "**Door/Check-in Minister**," whatever that might mean.

We receive three pages of detailed guidelines, inclusive of pictures and a video to watch. I personally experienced the staff's care for the safety of their volunteers and all who come through the doors to attend Mass. I learned what parking lot entrance to use, the check-in process after my arrival and the responsibilities for being a "**Door/Check-in Minister**." Detail included pictures of the north and south interior doors we were responsible for opening. I had never noticed the black box above the "interior left side north parking lot door." It has a switch to activate to "hold open" the door to my left. There was the interior south door, the "garden doors" to push to stay fully open. These are the details attended to by Sebastian for each set of liturgical ministers not found in any liturgical planning book that I am aware of.

Changes continue, doors are opened while masks are worn. The safety of anyone coming through doors into the church continues to be carefully orchestrated through the collaboration our caring parish staff. I/We all thank you, St. John's Staff!!

### WELCOME BACK TO MASS

Bishop Quinn will reinstate the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy days beginning the weekend of July 3-4, 2021.



As stated in the Minnesota Catholic Conference “Back to Mass Statement”: Attending the in-person celebration of Sunday Mass and receiving Jesus in the Eucharist are vital to our lives as Catholic Christians. We were created for Communion. Whether you are returning to your home parish, or seeking a local parish on vacation, your participation in the Mass unites you with the Church — the Body of Christ. This communion transforms us as persons and enables us to make manifest the Kingdom of God in our world. The celebration of the Eucharist truly is the source and summit of our faith.

St. John Chrysostom reminds us, “You cannot pray at home as at church, where there is a great multitude, where exclamations are cried out to God as from one great heart, and where there is something more: the union of minds, the accord of souls, the bond of charity, the prayers of the priests.” (CCC 2179)

As always, there are circumstances where individuals may not be obligated to go to Sunday Mass. If you are sick, a caregiver for children or the elderly, or are unable to attend Mass through no fault of your own, then you are not obligated to come to Mass. There may be additional circumstances that exempt you from attending Mass; if you have questions about your specific situation, you are encouraged to discuss them with Father Mahon.

**“Journeying Towards Care for Our Common Home: five years after Laudato Si’”** (continued) **By Isabella Piro**

## **Second part: Integral ecology and integral human development**

The second part of the document opens with the subject of food, referring to Pope Francis’ words: “whenever food is thrown out it is as if it were stolen from the table of the poor” (LS, 50). Food waste, therefore, is condemned as an act of injustice.

... promotion of “diversified and sustainable” agriculture, defence of small producers and natural resources, and the urgent need for healthy food education, both in quantity and in quality. ... combat phenomena such as land grabbing and major agro-industrial projects that pollute the environment, as well as an appeal to protect biodiversity.

... water, access to which is “an essential human right”. Here, too, there is a call to avoid waste and to go beyond the utilitarian criteria that lead to the privatization of this natural good.

### **Investing in renewable energy**

... an invitation to reduce pollution, to de-carbonize the energy and economic sectors, and to invest in “clean and renewable” energy, making it accessible to all.

The seas and oceans also cut to the heart of integral ecology. They are the “blue lungs of the planet”, and require governance focused on the common good of the entire human family and founded on the principle of subsidiarity.

... the urgent need to promote a “circular economy” that does not aim at over-exploitation of productive resources, but at their long-term maintenance, so that they can be reused. ...

The private sector is called upon to operate transparently in the supply chain. ...the reform of fossil fuel subsidies and the taxation of CO2 emissions.

*How can I advocate for: the right to food and water; clean renewable energy; the protection of our oceans; a responsible “circular” economy; all based on the “perspective of integral sustainability”?*




