

Dear Friends in Christ:

Home is where your heart is. I was raised in Illinois in a close, loving family. Throughout my childhood, we would vacation periodically in Minnesota. There was a draw for me that continued to grow and develop. Minnesota for college, Minnesota for married and family life, putting down new roots which our children and grandchildren call home. There were significant times of painful distance between us and family “back home” but we found community in our work, schools, leisure and faith. What started as “outside looking in” became belonging. Not in a fantasy-perfect way, but in a real way, ever more deeply grounded in Christ. The inevitable storms and trials were able to be weathered even transformative because of the grounding in Christ, a welcoming community reaching out and being invited in. 

Where does your water come from? What affects water quality here in our watersheds? What can we do to protect our water quality?*

INTERCONNECTED: 21-DAY CATHOLIC ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE CHALLENGE

Learn, Pray, and Act for Environmental Justice

Today you are invited to learn more about how and where water flows in your community by researching your watershed and identifying the source of your drinking water.

A **watershed** is an area of land that drains all the streams and rainfall to a common outlet such as the outflow of a reservoir, mouth of a bay, or any point along a stream channel. They provide drinking water, habitats for wildlife, soil to grow our food, and locations for fishing, boating and swimming. Everyone lives in a watershed, and watersheds are interconnected and can flow through one another.

Rain that does not soak into the ground becomes runoff and carries soil, pollutants, and other materials from the land into our rivers, lakes and bays. Our everyday activities can affect downstream waters.

Protecting water in one place benefits the entire system.


