Thank you for choosing me: A deacon's reflection on his first year at the Co-Cathedral of Saint John the Evangelist

Thirty-eight years ago on July 23, when Terese and I were married at Saint Pius X Church, we selected the reading from John's Gospel that included the verse "it was not you who chose me, but I who chose you". At the time, we did not fully realize the depth of what this reading truly meant, but we have learned over the years what it means to be chosen and to trust in God's will. Little did I realize, as the verse continues with these words: "and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain".

Now, it is nearly a year since Bishop Quinn ordained me a Permanent Deacon on August 23, 2020 and assigned me to serve at the Co-Cathedral of Saint John's. And what a whirlwind year it has been, learning what it means to be a deacon while serving in the midst of COVID lockdowns and protocols. But as we think back on this past year, Terese and I are filled with joy and gratitude for the many blessings and amazing possibilities we have experienced through the vibrant parish life here at the Co-Cathedral.



We had been content members of Pax Christi Church for 30 years, but we also recognized that my ordination would likely lead us to a new parish. We both placed our trust in God's hands, which I could actually feel when Bishop Quinn laid his hands on me at the moment of ordination. This total trust leads to obedience and a true freedom to accept God's will, and it allowed me to fully embrace being chosen for my assignment with you! Terese and I are absolutely delighted with our new "home"!

We have been overwhelmed with the welcome we continue to receive from each of you, and I look forward to spending more time in the gathering space after Mass and being available to get to know you. I have also observed the friendly welcome visitors receive here at the parish. By being present and available in this downtown neighborhood, the people of the parish continue to allow Mayo Clinic patients and families to experience a home in this church while they are in Rochester. Countless times I have witnessed personal interactions of bringing Jesus to those who are vulnerable and in need, and then seeing the peace that results.

The parish staff are an amazing and talented group of people. They have been very patient with me as I learn new systems and ways of doing things,

and without exception each staff member has been so helpful. This has allowed me to focus on my diaconal ministries, knowing that they will gently pull me back before I get into too much trouble!



The volunteers who serve the many ministries and liturgies are exceptional in their giving of time and talent, and their willingness to help wherever needed. Behind the scenes so many people are involved with setting up for Mass or cleaning the church afterwards, and I have learned from each person. If you are not already, please consider becoming a volunteer. We need new volunteers as the church continues to open up, and you will discover a very rewarding way to serve the parish community!

I experienced seven years of classes and formation before being ordained a deacon, but all that learning pales in comparison to the wonderful guidance and mentoring Fr. Mahon has provided me. He is a true shepherd of the Co-Cathedral parish, and his wisdom and insight have allowed me to grow in my diaconal abilities and ministries. Trusting in God's will has given me a wonderful pastor to learn from, and to serve with, and I feel richly blessed.

What's next? I hope to be more available to get to know each of you, as I work with the staff and volunteers, and encounter more parishioners through the daily life at the Co-Cathedral of Saint John the Evangelist. Terese and I thank you from our hearts for the many ways, large and small, that you have welcomed us, allowed us to learn where we can grow and serve, and made us feel we are truly home.

The servant and the little boy in our readings today are excellent examples for us as Christian stewards. The servant gave the very best of what he had, and the boy gave all that he had, then God did the rest.

A key component of living as a good steward is constantly evaluating our lives, particularly our relationship with God to ensure we are not just scraping by but rather giving God our entire lives.

We should ask ourselves — "how am I giving God my time, using my talents, and sharing my treasures?"

We are called to give God adequate time each day. If we don't plan for this time, likely, He won't get any. We need to find what works best for us so that God can become a more significant part of our daily lives. We are also called to put our gifts and talents to good use too. The servant and the boy teach us that it is not up to us to decide how our gifts will affect others. God will do that. All we need to do is to give it well.

Lastly, the servant reminds us that we are called to give the first fruits of our treasures. It is easy to give something; it is difficult to give the finest gift. Giving our best requires us to reevaluate our priorities in life.

When we strive to live out our call as Christian stewards by entrusting all that we have been given to the One who graciously gave us these gifts, we will be blessed beyond measure. As we begin a new week, let us spend some time evaluating our relationship with God by asking, 'what is my very best, and am I giving it to God?'

Center for Watershed Protection

A watershed is the land area that drains to a common body of water, such as a stream, lake, bay, or even the ocean. They provide drinking water, habitats for wildlife, soil to grow our food, and locations for fishing, boating and swimming. **We all live in a watershed.**

Rain that does not soak into the ground becomes runoff and carries soil, pollutants, and other materials from the land into our rivers, lakes and bays. Our everyday activities can affect downstream waters.

GO NATIVE: Reduce your lawn by adding native trees, shrubs and herbaceous plants to your landscape. They require less water and fertilizer and are more resistant to pests and disease since they are already adapted to local conditions.

PLANT A STREAM BUFFER: If you have a stream on your property, provide a natural buffer of native trees and shrubs along its banks to help filter polluted runoff, control erosion, and provide essential fish and wildlife habitat.

USE COMMERCIAL CAR WASHES: The best place to wash your car is at a commercial car wash, many of which filter their water before directing it to treatment plants. If you wash your vehicle at home, park it on the grass first, so your lawn absorbs some of the detergent runoff and contaminants.

BE WATER WISE: Conserve water by using low-flow faucets, showers, and toilets, repairing leaks, taking shorter showers, and turning off the tap when brushing your teeth. Run dishwashers and clothes washers only when full, and wash your car and water your lawn only when necessary. You will not only be conserving water but also saving money!

GET INVOLVED: We all live in a watershed and every drop counts. Do your part by joining your local watershed organization, participating in community clean-ups, and supporting environmental legislation.




HOLY LAND PILGRIMAGE WITH ST. JAMES COFFEE
