

Living the Joy of the Gospel

My name is Deb McManimon, and I am a Catholic Evangelist. If you would have asked me 10 years ago if I would be standing out in the street talking to people about my faith, I would have said "that would never happen!" And yet here I am. I grew up thinking I was a pretty good Catholic- I went to Mass (most of the time) and I volunteered for many things. One day, one of my adult children came at me with all kinds of questions she had heard from a Protestant that was trying to convert her, and I didn't have a single answer. I started to try to figure out why I was Catholic and the more I learned, the more in love with the Church I fell. Wow! It was like the scales had fallen from my eyes and I was so humbled to be part of the truth and beauty of the Church founded by Jesus.

About the same time this happened, I was listening to Catholic Answers and Steve Dawson, the founder of St. Paul Street Evangelization, was on talking about Catholic evangelization and I thought to myself, "that's not true- Catholics don't evangelize." My curiosity got me to sign up for their newsletter and before I knew it, I was in Detroit, MI, getting trained to be a Catholic evangelist and learning to train others. It is pretty amazing what can happen in your life if you just surrender to Jesus's plan.

In the great Commission, Jesus tells us to Go therefore and make disciples of all nations teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. Go! Make! Teach! We can all do that. At the end of each Mass, we are told to Go! We are to bring our love for the Lord and the Good News to others. By listening to other people's stories, befriending them, and inviting them into a relationship with the Lord and his Church, we can help make disciples of all nations.

I was totally freaked out when I was out on the street the first time, but once I started talking to the people who stopped by, my world was forever changed. Since that first outing in Detroit, I have been out evangelizing hundreds of times and each time I know I am following where the Lord is leading me. I have been blessed to be Jesus's hands and heart to others when praying with others at our prayer station. I have been blessed to be on the street with many of our Minnesota Bishops and even our Archbishop. We have also had many priests and deacons join us to minister with prayer, sacramentals, and blessings to those who are wounded. But most of our evangelists are ordinary, everyday Catholics, like me. Each time I go out, I am filled with joy. I tell people it is like living the joy of the Gospel.



We live in such a wounded world where people are searching everywhere for happiness, except the one place where it can be found - in Jesus Christ

and his Church. What would the Catholic Church look like if we all were in the public square ministering to those in need of a friend and of hope? What would we look like as parishioners if on donut Sunday, we could share with each other the encounters that we had that week sharing the Good News and praying with others? One of my favorite verses is Isaiah 6:8 “And I hear the voice of the Lord saying, ‘Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?’ Then I said ‘Here I am! Send me.’” I pray that you, too, will answer the call.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Often, we live our lives striving for temporary happiness. But today, Jesus reminds us to “not work for food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life.”

As you go about your day-to-day lives this week, try to recognize the times you are “working for food that perishes” by seeking things of the world to satisfy your heart. In those moments, recall that everything we have is a gift from God. Instead of misusing that gift, offer a prayer of thanksgiving for all He has given to you.




