Dear Friends in Christ,

Are you looking for a feeling of weight being lifted, of forgiveness, healing, or joy? Those are just some of the words shared by our second- through fifth-grade students after they received their First Reconciliation. The feelings they described are feelings most of us, of all ages, are yearning for. And how can we experience those feelings? Just as our students did, by attending confession. We tell God we are sorry for our sins, that we will try not to sin again, and ask and accept God's forgiveness.

We are all on a journey in this life. We all do good, but we all sin. Thus, we are called to the sacrament of Reconciliation. What a great sacrament! We become filled with forgiveness, mercy, and grace from God to continue our path in life to be the best version of ourselves. We embrace the healing power from God and grow in virtue to live a holy life and share our joyful heart with all those around us.



Not only do we receive forgiveness in this sacrament, but we are reminded that we must forgive others as well. When we pray the Our Father, we say, "Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us." That can be extremely difficult at times, but if we receive and accept forgiveness from God, then we too need to be willing to forgive others, no matter how difficult. For our students who received their First Reconciliation, this forgiving concept was not something they had given much thought to. Perhaps we, too, can give the concept of forgiving as we are forgiven more thought.

I believe we can learn from everyone, even our little ones! Here are some of their final comments after receiving the sacrament. "When can I do that again?" "How often can I do this?" "I was scared, but not anymore." "I love the feeling I got." I hope everyone who reads this decides to go to confession and is blessed with the gift of forgiveness and renewal of a great relationship with God.

Confessions are offered at the Co-Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist every Thursday before Mass, from 11:30am to 12:00 noon, and on Saturdays from 3:30pm to 4:00pm. This Lent, you can also find extra times to take part in the sacrament. Confessions will be available during 24 Hours for the Lord on March 18th starting at 4:00pm until Saturday March 19th at 4:00pm and during the communal Reconciliation on Sunday April 10th from 3:30pm to 4:30pm.

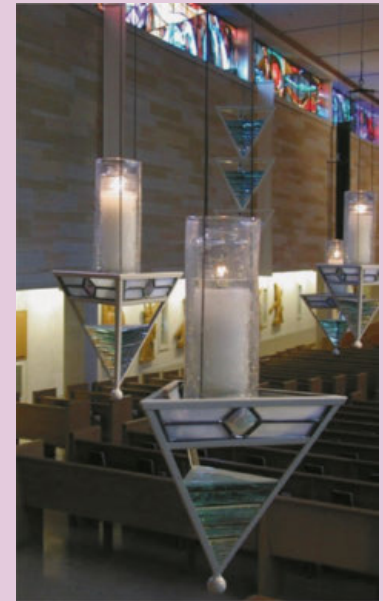

CLIMATE CRISIS DEEPENING-HOPE IN ACTION

Care for our Common Home, is an essential part of our Lenten journey. Pope Francis has given us the framework to “see, judge, and act” on Care for Our Common Home in the 2015 encyclical “Laudato Si: On Care for our Common Home”. The interconnectedness of creation, integral ecology, interprets for us the necessity to attend to environmental, social, cultural, and spiritual aspects of life. Science, most recently the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), sets the stage for the effects of climate change on the world, particularly and first, the poorest. “The cry of the earth” and “The cry of the poor” are intimately connected in their suffering. We are tempted to remove ourselves from participation in this suffering because we contribute more to it than we are affected by it. Our Lenten journey calls us to prayer, fasting and almsgiving as ways to repent and seek reconciliation with God and each other for the ways we have plundered our common home. St Francis calls our common home “Sister/ Mother Earth” and so we care with a sense of deep connection. We see the effects of the climate crisis on our common home. We judge that inaction is denial of our responsibility to “seek life”. We pray and act, in our personal and communal lives, as participants in “ecological conversion”.
